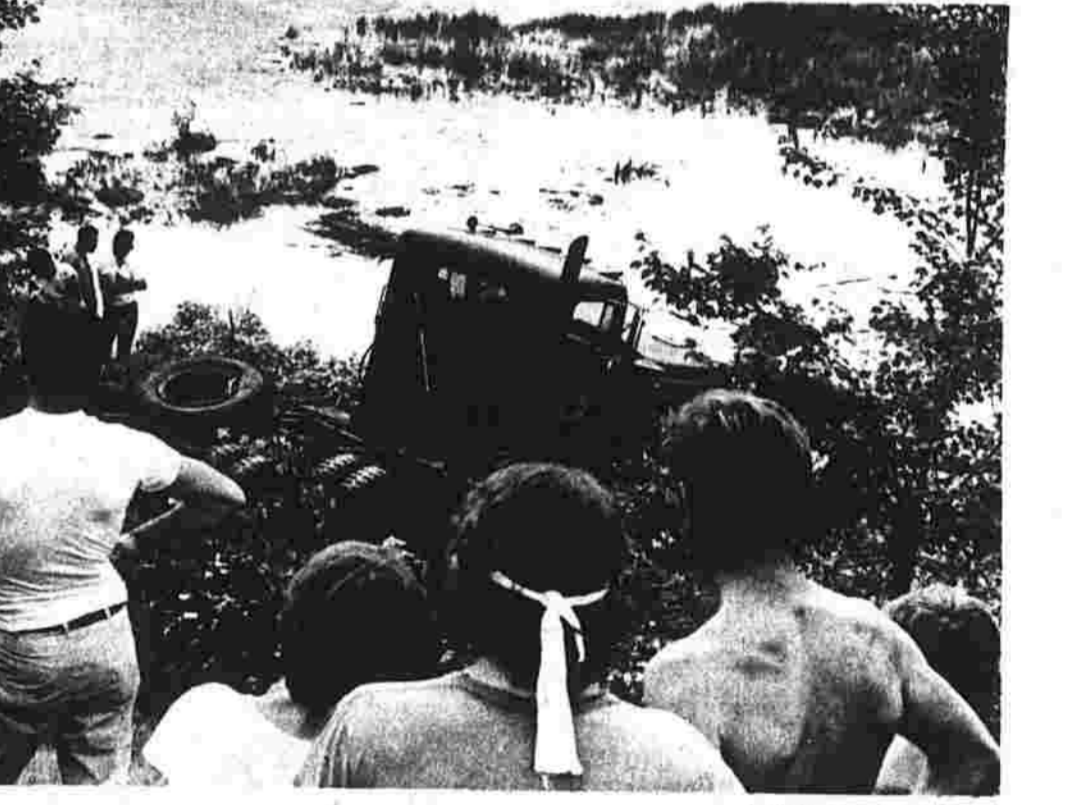

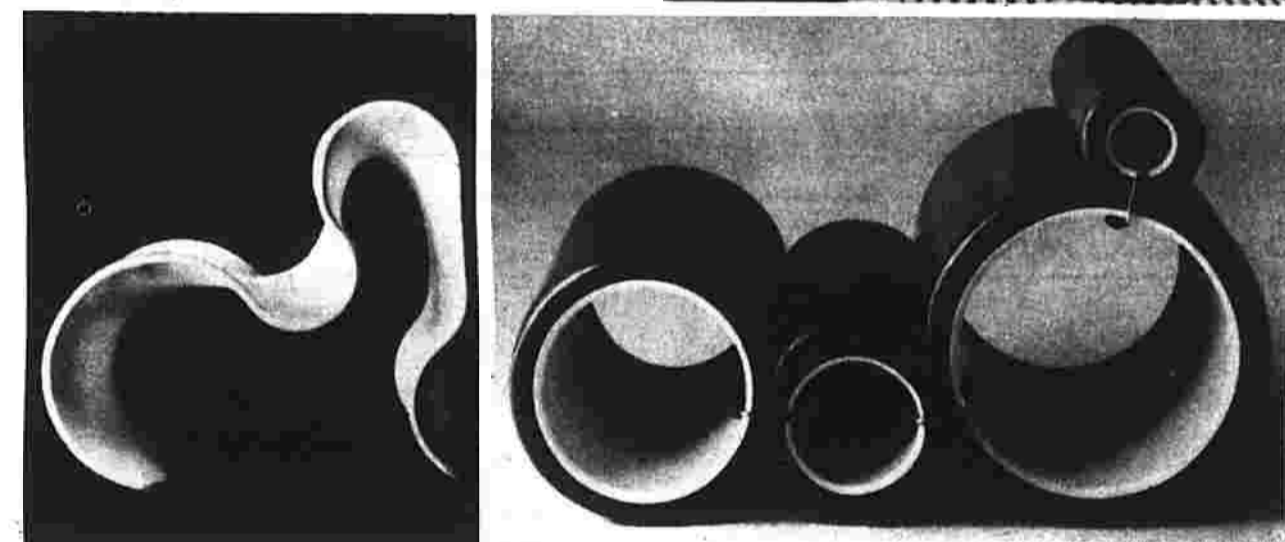
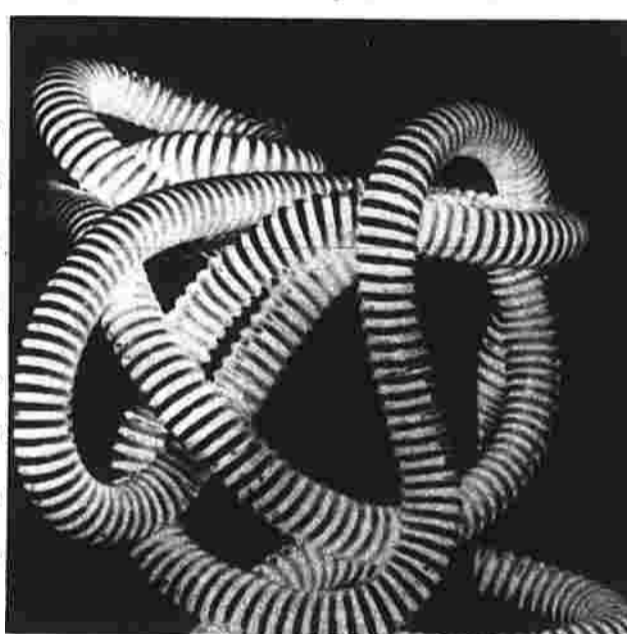

America's Tax Bill Grows to \$4,500

NEW YORK (AP) — America's tax bill averages about \$4,500 per household, or \$2,000 more than 10 years ago, causing ruminations and mutterings about a tax revolt by those under the hit. But that's only half, or less than half of the story. As many, or more, are demanding a larger government — expenditures, for health and welfare especially, and Congress seems willing to go along with them.

The situation is developing into a mass confrontation of opposing philosophical and practical views on what course the country is to take. One group calls it a tax problem, the other a spending problem. Both demand reform.

Few politicians care to discuss it before November, but regardless of which course is taken over the long term, the outcome of the immediate battle seems likely to be — a general increase in taxes. The reason for this conclusion, now shared by a large number of economists and researchers, including Brookings Institution, is that government spending commitments already exceed revenues.

With the fiscal 1973 budget deficit likely to be near \$30 billion, the three-year total 1971-1973 may exceed \$80 billion, a stupendous figure when measured against any other "post-war" period.

Whether or not spending can be better controlled after it depends to some extent on the outcome of this year's election, but it is worth noting that recent deficits were run up by a President who considers himself a spending conservative.

The past also offers a suggestion: Figures supplied by the Tax Foundation demonstrate that in recent years the country has been demanding more services from its government but has been more reluctant to pay the bills.

In 1962, the Foundation reports, expenditures per household in 1962 were about \$2,000, rising to more than \$3,600 in 1968 and to more than \$4,500 in 1972, a percentage rise of only 113.8 percent.

Fun Vehicles Put on Roads

SANTA FE, N.M. (AP) — Motorcycles, dune buggies and other land recreational vehicles have been banned from New Mexico roads in Santa Fe. The State Park and Recreation Commission adopted the regulation Tuesday. It also requires the vehicles to be "properly maintained" and prohibits their use at night.

State Parks Director Richard Metz said there have been several serious accidents involving such recreational vehicles, in addition to incidents of annoyed park visitors.

The Ugly Prospectors

If there have been, in this summer's increasing amount of gypsy moth damage in this section of Connecticut, those fortunate enough to escape this year's hunger of the caterpillars, even the most immune of us have now had warning.

This year's crop of moths, in blind, mindless search for a spot to lay the egg masses for next year's worms, has invaded areas where, this year, no foliage was eaten. Fluttering obscenities on the landscape, they mark out new areas for next year, hibernate their way inside cars from one section of town to another, fly into your face as you emerge from doorways.

Watching them, one gets the same sensation one gets from watching larger and more important events of our time—the sensation of dreading a future and an ending without being able to do anything about it.

We are, as we see them prospecting and staking out claims for next year's onslaught, quite helpless, and full of Job's questionings without much of his feeling of submission.

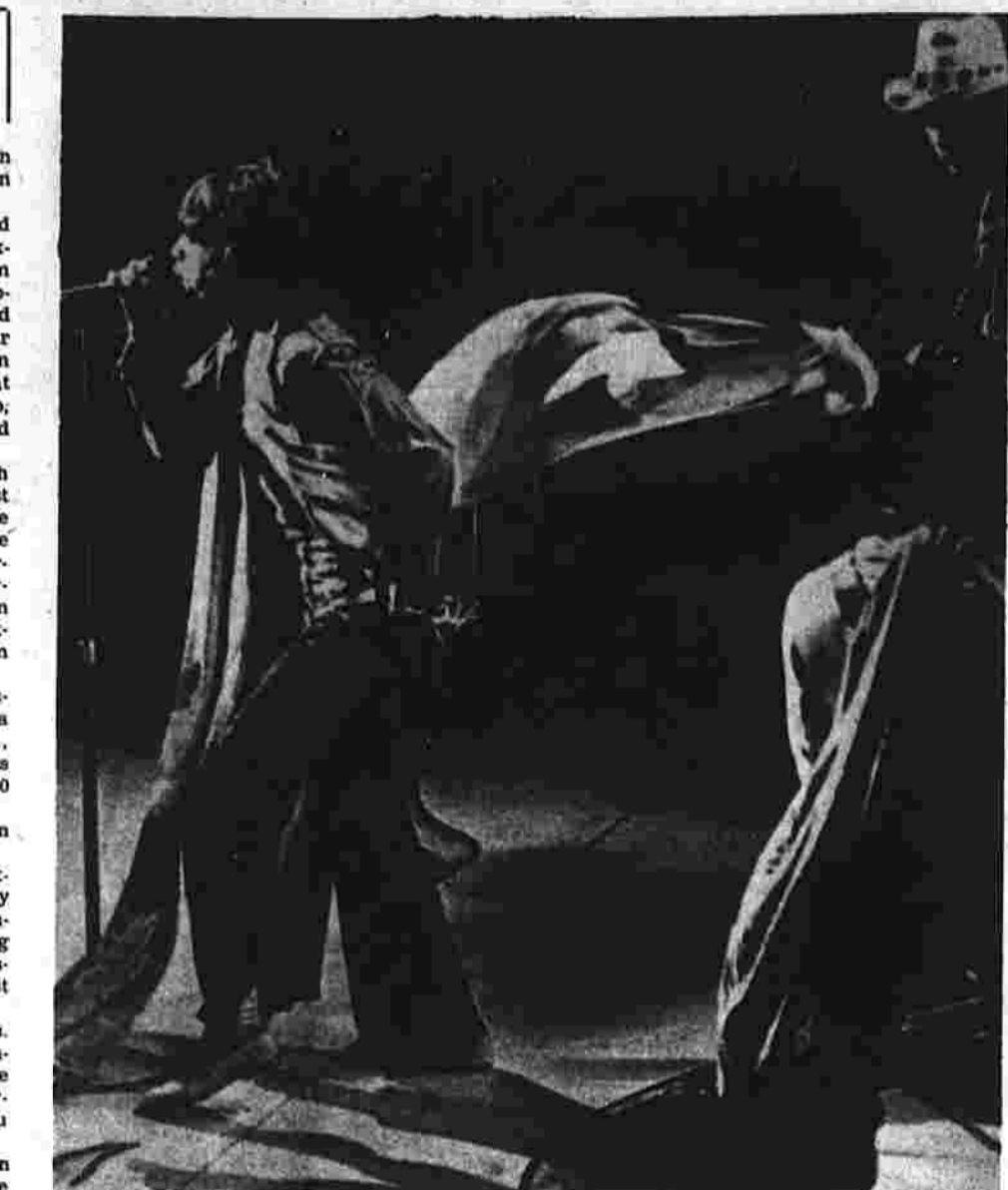

Israelis Wonder Over Egyptian Ouster of Soviets

By THE ASSOCIATED PRESS
Egypt's decision to oust Soviet military advisers and to take over military installations in the Sinai Peninsula has been met with guarded optimism among Israelis today that it might lessen pressure on the rest in the near future. Others thought it might remove a restraining influence on the Egyptian move announced Tuesday also raised questions about the Soviet relations with the Kremlin.

"There was no official Israeli comment. One source said the government was waiting to see if the Russians really withdrew, Israeli newspapers dependent on the Egyptian's action both as "damning" and "dangerous." The Jerusalem Post said the Soviet withdrawal could clear the way for Egypt to undertake "some kind of military adventure."

The Independent Hazret said Egyptian President Anwar Sadat "has given into pressure from his army officers hostile to the Russians."

Silence was the initial reaction of the Soviet government to the action by a government in which it has invested billions of dollars. But some diplomats in Cairo speculated that the Kremlin and not Sadat was responsible for the withdrawal.

Announcing that his own soldiers will replace Soviet advisers and experts, Sadat said the Russians had let him down by not delivering arms promised in 1971 for confrontation with Israel.

The president also indicated friction over Soviet attempts to restrict the use of arms supplied Egypt. He said he had rejected such attempts and made clear on a visit to Moscow in April that Egypt would not tolerate dictation of its military policies.

Sadat said the Russian ouster "does not touch in any way the essence of Soviet-Egyptian friendship," but it is necessary, he declared, to set "a new style for the coming stage of our friendship."

Even before Sadat's speech, an exodus of Russian officers from Egypt was visible, causing diplomatic and official in Cairo to buzz with speculation. The president said the withdrawal order became effective Monday but he did not make

Because of Red Tint, He's Banned at Home

JOHANNESBURG, South Africa (AP) — Basil Moore has been accused of no crime, brought before a court and convicted on no charge, but he is in effect serving a sentence. He must be his own jailer.

The order, in effect from that moment, is for five years but it can be extended without explanation or opportunity to appeal.

Banning orders are issued by the Justice Ministry in terms of the 1952 Suppression of Communism Act.

Moore, 36, is the father of five and a former pastor. Everyday things are now out of his reach. He can't go out to dinner with friends or entertain them. He cannot go to church or take his children to Sunday School. He can't be visited in his home by anyone except his doctor and he won't be able to leave Johannesburg to vacation.

It's up to Moore to police his activities to comply with the modified form of house arrest he shares in common with some 200 other white, black and brown South Africans.

He can't work or even entertain premises where printing, publishing or duplicating is done that means virtually all offices. He cannot work where government policy is discussed; this includes almost all industrial and commercial firms which have to deal with official regulations.

He can't be quoted by newspapers who would like to know how it all came about and how he copes with the restrictions.

The government offers no explanations in such cases. The ban is imposed and that's all there is to it until it is lifted or extended, again without explanation.

Moore is a qualified science teacher with a doctorate in the subject. He was directing a theological correspondence course for the African Independent Churches Association when the time he was banned.

The Rev. Alex L. Boraine, president of the Methodist Conference, termed the banning unwarranted and inhuman. He said: "Basil Moore is no longer a Methodist minister. He left the ministry in October last year, but speaking as a friend his banning came as a great shock to me."

The only apparent cause as to why the government cracked down on Moore was active in the causes they espoused—among others the National Union of South African Students and the University Christian Movement. These groups have opposed openly the ban.

He's Not Buying

"I tell them I'm buying nothing," says Clarence Smalley of Manchester, when commenting on the many, many phone calls he has received since last Thursday when he won \$73,000 in the State Lottery.

"Mostly," he says, "they're real estate and insurance men, trying to sell me something. I tell them all the same thing — that I'm buying nothing — and the calls have been cut down a lot."

A call to Smalley by a Herald reporter showed how cautious he is. Whoever answers wants to know who's calling, before Smalley gets on the line.

Smalley said the excitement of winning, plus a cold he caught in last Thursday's driving rain, has him down a little, but that he's bouncing back and is beginning to feel better.

He was born in England, became a South African citizen four years ago and wrote a book which described bleak conditions in resettlement areas. Father Desmond's ban makes it illegal to quote him or distribute material he has written.

The Rev. Stephen Hayes of the Church of England recently was ordered out of South-West Africa. A five-year banning order restricts him to Durban.

Sabelo S. Ntwasa, director of a black theology project, is banned at Mafeking. He must remain indoors from dusk to dawn and all day weekends and holidays.

Assorted others including nonwhite political figures have been banned for reasons other than those connected with churches.

An Indian lawyer, M.D. Naidoo, was convicted under the Suppression of Communism Act and served five years in a prison colony. He was released May 23 but immediately served with a banning order. This prevents him from pursuing his profession; he cannot enter the office of any attorney.

The most publicized banning was that of Helen Joseph, a longtime vice president of the new liberal Congress of Democrats.

She was banned in October 1962. Prime Minister John Vorster, then justice minister, said he was satisfied she was "engaged in activities which were furthering or were calculated to further the achievement of communism."

Mrs. Joseph was restricted to the police each week day and visitors except her doctor and lawyer, and had to report to the police each week day. The original five-year ban was extended before it expired in 1967, but she won the right to attend church on Sundays.

Mrs. Joseph was finally released last June 1971 after undergoing surgery for cancer. The ban has been lifted but she is still considered a "named" person under the Suppression of Communism Act and cannot be quoted. She is 67.

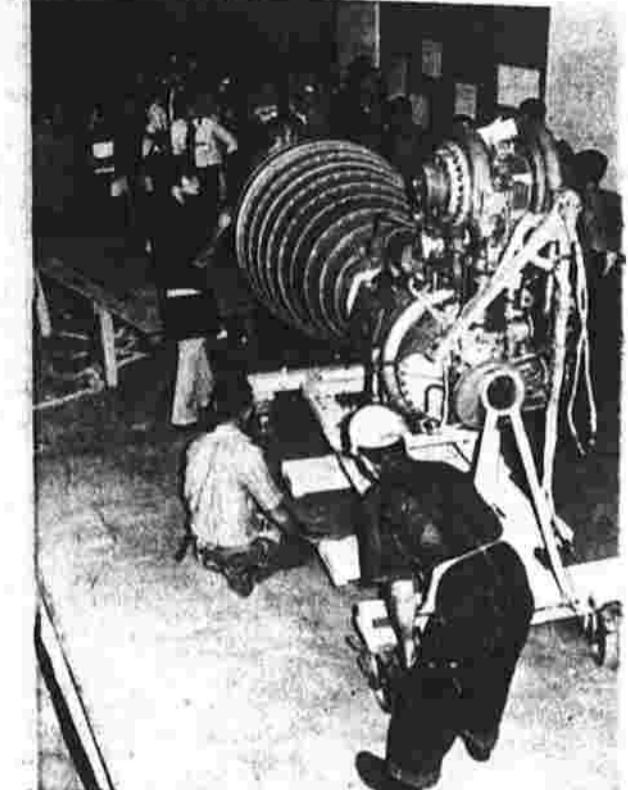

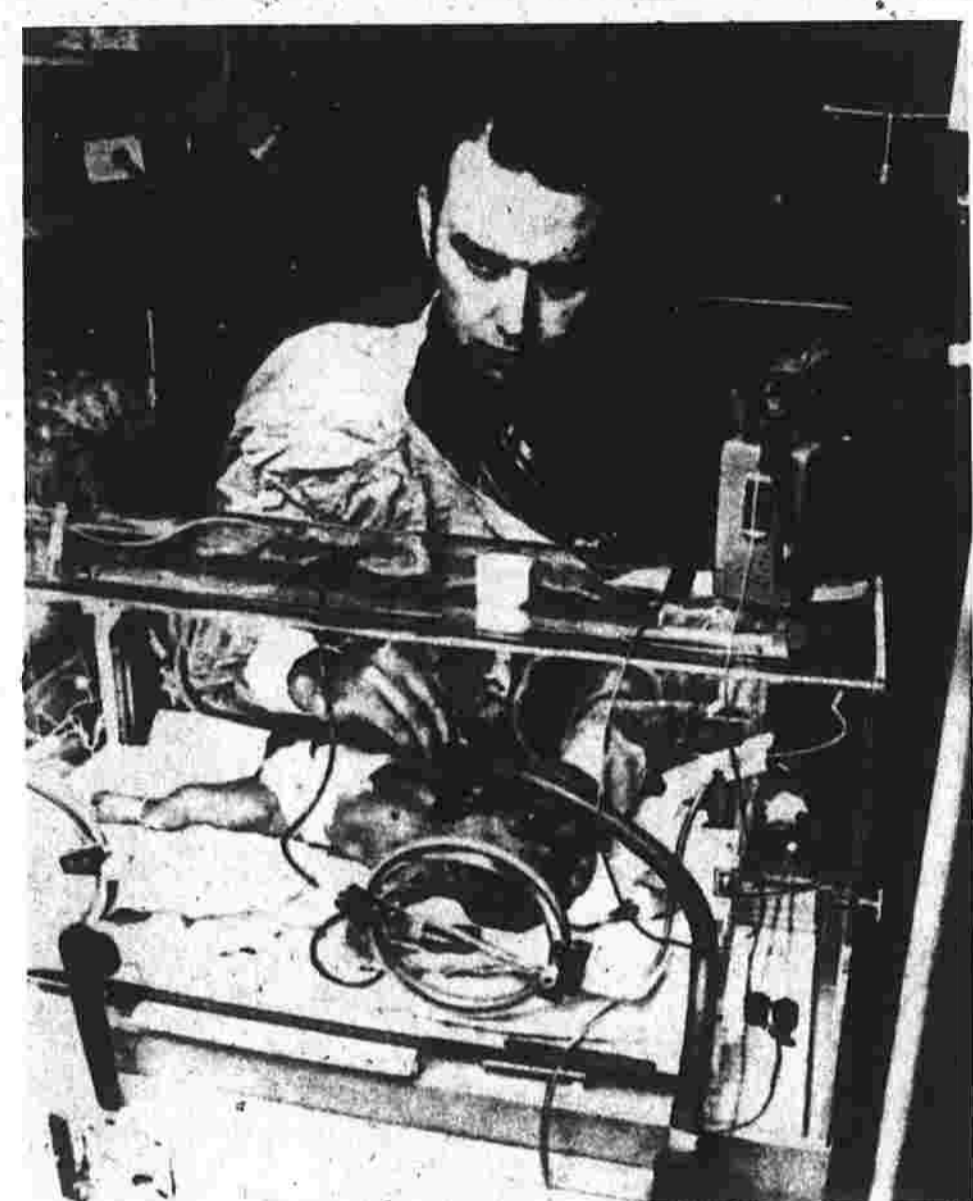

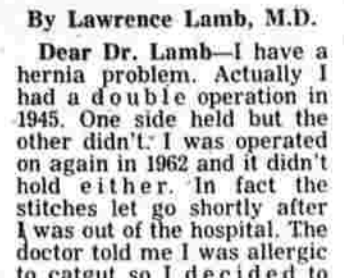

DR. LAWRENCE E. LAMB Surgery Is Recommended Hernia Needs Repairing Again



By Lawrence Lamb, M.D.
Dear Dr. Lamb—I have a hernia problem. Actually I had a double operation in 1945. One side held but the other didn't. I was operated on again in 1962 and it didn't hold either. In fact the stitches let go shortly after I was out of the hospital. The doctor told me I was allergic to catgut so I decided to have a prestite operation and just wear a belt. In 1967 I had a prestite operation and I was found to be a borderline diabetic. The doctor told me to watch my diet, but since I was a hard worker I didn't bother much with it as a result I had a heart attack in 1969. Now I have no choice but to watch my diet.

The hernia repaired, but to wait one year. I have let it go but I'm now at retirement age. I would like to have this hernia operated on since I'm tired of wearing a belt and just can't see myself walking around the rest of my life with this sac hanging down, plus the fact that it does hurt at times. On the other hand, I am afraid. If I do have the operation, is there any way to have it reinforced so it would hold? Is there any danger because of my heart condition? How do you feel about finding a specialist in this field? The medical bureau is not of much help.

Many people who have had heart attacks and have had a reasonable recovery have actually undergone a major surgery without any real difficulty. Of course, your surgeon would like to know about your attack because it may have some influence on what type of anesthetic he might choose. Your best way to find a competent surgeon who performs this type of operation is to ask your family doctor to refer you to the nearest university medical center. This would insure you that your operation would be at least supervised by top-notch specialists in the field. I would think that your family doctor could arrange this referral for you.

Book Review

REPORT TO THE COMMISSIONER. By James Mills. Farrer, Straus & Giroux. 286 Pages. \$6.95. Meet Bo Lockley—the young detective on the New York City police force and possibly the worst.

Not because he's stupid, by no means. But because he's young, idealistic and totally unacquainted with the malfunctions that infect that portion of society with which a police officer spends so much of his working life.

FLYING SCARED. By Elizabeth Rich. Stein and Day. 194 Pages. \$6.95. Miss Rich, who has been an airline stewardess for nine years, never has been on a sky-jacked plane herself, but she has had a long time interest in what has happened to some of her colleagues among the air crew. This book is the result of her preoccupation with the problem.

Her book has a viewpoint. She feels airlines and government officials are too timid about taking any real safety measures. And she has a very high opinion of sky marshals.

She discusses the various types of skyjacking—pathological characters, political extremists and extortionists. She also has a proposal for ending the problem—an international agreement for all nations to return the culprit immediately to the country where the flight originated, to be tried under the laws of that country.

There should be no sanctuary, she feels. But she has little hope for such agreements to be reached until—and she says this is only a question of time—a couple of hundred people are killed in a disastrous event.

The author may not be a very scientific researcher, nor speak from a very authoritative position. But she has produced enough information on this subject—written in readable form—to make a contribution to this topical subject.

Gains and Dividends Tax Shows Gain over the Year

CHART FORD (AP) — The court challenged state capital gains and dividends tax showed the second highest increase in revenue after the sales tax for the 1971-72 fiscal year, State Tax Commissioner F. George Brown said in his year-end report.

The entire package of increased taxes for the state produced \$160.4 million extra, Brown said in his year-end report.

The report doesn't include final-quarter returns, and this year's revenue will be increased substantially when the final quarter returns for the sales tax are counted.



The report showed that \$212.8 million was realized from taxes during the fiscal year, which ended June 30, compared with \$62.2 million during the previous fiscal year.

Gov. Thomas J. Meskill has already predicted a \$30 million surplus and indicated he would call a special session of the General Assembly to roll back the sales tax from 7 per cent to 6.5 per cent. He said the reasons for the surplus was the revenue from the capital gains and dividend taxes.

Both the Democratic and Republican parties have pursued the war, the paper said, but another Hanoi broadcast said "this time Mr. McGovern has introduced a more acceptable peace terms and the United States must take the initiative which recognizes that peace is the only way to end the military adventurism in Vietnam only pushes the United States more deeply into failures, errors and deadlock."

Coast Guard Seeks Recruits

The U.S. Coast Guard is facing a potentially serious problem in maintaining its enlisted manpower level, according to Admiral C. S. Bender, commandant of the Coast Guard.

Adm. Bender said that decreased draft pressure associated with transition to an all-volunteer armed force has resulted in recruiting shortfalls.

In New York City, a Coast Guard spokesman said many Coast Guard units are functioning below their normal manpower level. He said that the Coast Guard units are still meeting their responsibilities but that the manpower shortage could, in the future, affect its missions.

Duties of the Coast Guard include search and rescue, maintaining aids to navigation, enforcing merchant marine safety laws, polar icebreaking, water pollution abatement, port security, protecting fisheries, and law enforcement, especially within recreational boating.

Operating as an agency under the Department of Transportation, the Coast Guard is the nation's smallest military service with some 35,000 enlisted men and 4,800 officers. Because of its unique position as a humanitarian, yet military service, the Coast Guard has traditionally been an attractive way for men to fulfill their military obligation. Once there was a waiting list to join the Coast Guard; there is no waiting list now.

The Coast Guard unit is very worthwhile and rewarding, a service spokesman said. "We have thousands of lives each year," he said, "but we need men in order to function."

Mailmen Given More Protection

PHILADELPHIA (AP)—The U.S. attorney's office plans a major crackdown on an increasing number of assaults on postal letter carriers in Philadelphia.

U.S. Atty. Carl J. Melone said Tuesday his office "hoped to diminish the danger in which many postal letter carriers find themselves throughout the city."

Melone said the initial case in the crackdown was an indictment handed down Tuesday charging Robert McKie of Philadelphia with assaulting a mail carrier with a metal pipe.

Social Security Q's and A's

Q. I have trying to estimate how much I will receive from social security when I retire in a few more years. Is there a booklet that shows me how to figure out my benefit?

A. Yes. The booklet is entitled "Social Security Benefits—How to Estimate the Amount." You may obtain a copy free by mail, telephone, or visiting the East Hartford Social Security office, 87 Main Street, ask for leaflet number 47.

Q. Someone told me I need a certain amount of quarters to be able to receive social security benefits on my own record. How can I earn a quarter of coverage?

A. If you work for someone else you get a quarter of coverage for each calendar quarter of the year in which you are paid \$50 or more.

Q. I was told that I need more "quarters" in order to collect social security. Can I pick them up this year if I work all year?

A. No. The most quarters you can receive in a year is 4. The year contains four calendar quarters, Jan. Feb. March is one quarter; April, May, June is another and so on.

Q. I'm fifteen years old and work part time. My mother told me that I'm building up social security credits by working. However, I thought I had to be at least 18 for these earnings to count. Is there an age limit before your earnings count toward social security credit?

A. No. You get social security credit for work covered by the social security law no matter how young or how old you are.

Q. I work for the city water department. We are not covered by social security. Is it possible for me to pay into social security on my own to build up my social security quarters?

A. No. In order to receive credit under social security, you must be employed in a job that is covered by social security or be self-employed and have net earnings of \$400 or more in a year.

Q. Do I have a choice whether I want to pay the social security tax or not?

A. If you are working in a job covered by social security, the social security tax must be paid no matter how old or how young you are. It is true even if you are receiving social security benefits and work part-time.

Stamps In the News

Art aficionados are quick to pay tribute to the famous French Impressionist painters. Many of the works of Renoir, Cezanne, Manet and others of this popular school appear on postage stamps.

But few are aware of the one German Impressionist whose artistic endeavors are equal to his counterparts across the Rhine. The German Impressionist is Max Liebermann (1847-1935) and he is being singly honored by West Berlin with a new 40 pfennig stamp.

This new adhesive, according to the World Wide Philatelic Agency, honors the 125th anniversary of his birth and bears a self-portrait on wood. Liebermann's popularity in his home country is attested by his becoming president of the Art Academy in Berlin and having received the decoration "Pour le mérite" - famous in military parlance as "The Blue Max."

This new stamp, as well as three new ones in the continuing "Safety First" series by West Germany, are available at your local stamp dealer or department store.

The American First-Day Cover Society has prepared and is offering free to collectors a list of U. S. stamps (about 90) that bear a relationship to the 200th anniversary celebration of the American Revolution.

The listing has been prepared under the headings of patriotic places, symbols, historical flags, events and the 13 original colonies. Each is noted according to year of issue, denomination, subject and catalog number.

To get a copy of this list, just send a stamped, addressed large-size envelope to American First-Day Cover Society, c/o Koehler, 2827 Farnam St., La Crosse, Wis. 54601. As I said, there is no charge for this interesting little list.

Britain is proud of its latest set of stamps highlighting old village churches and depicting examples of architectural styles dating back over 1,100 years.

The lowest value shows St. Andrews Church in Essex built in 845. It is the only surviving example of a wooden Saxon stave church. Another stamp illustrates All Saints at Ears Barton, Northamptonshire. St. Andrews at Leithersgott in Norfolk, built shortly after the Norman conquest in 1066, is seen on the 7 1/2 pence in the series. The highest value bears a view of St. Mary the Virgin Episcopal Church and dates back to 1200.

Topical collectors, who specialize in churches, will be anxious to add this new set to their books.

The American Stamp Dealers Assn. will sponsor two new stamp shows in addition to its annual ASDA event in November. The first of these is the ASDA Philatelic Fair - Chicago '73 scheduled for March 30, 1973. The second is the ASDA Philatelic Fair - New York, to be held April 6, 1973.

Norway will issue four new stamps to commemorate the 1,100th anniversary of the unification of that country under Harald the Fairhaired in 872.

The 50-ore stamp shows a detail of a stone carving at Alstad. The 80-ore depicts a dragon's head stone post carrying found at Oechery. The 120-ore features a sword bill found at Steinkv. Lodding. The 60-ore bears a stone carving on a portal at Hemsedal Church.

Printing the 20-cent stamps in the National Parks Centennial series was increased to 16 million from 65 million, and you can still get them directly from the Philatelic Sales Unit, Washington, D.C. 20036. Guernsey is built on stamps, as noted on its latest issue for the Second World Conference of Guernsey Breeders. The design features a Guernsey bull. The world's smallest first-day cover measures only 1 3/4" x 2 7/8".
