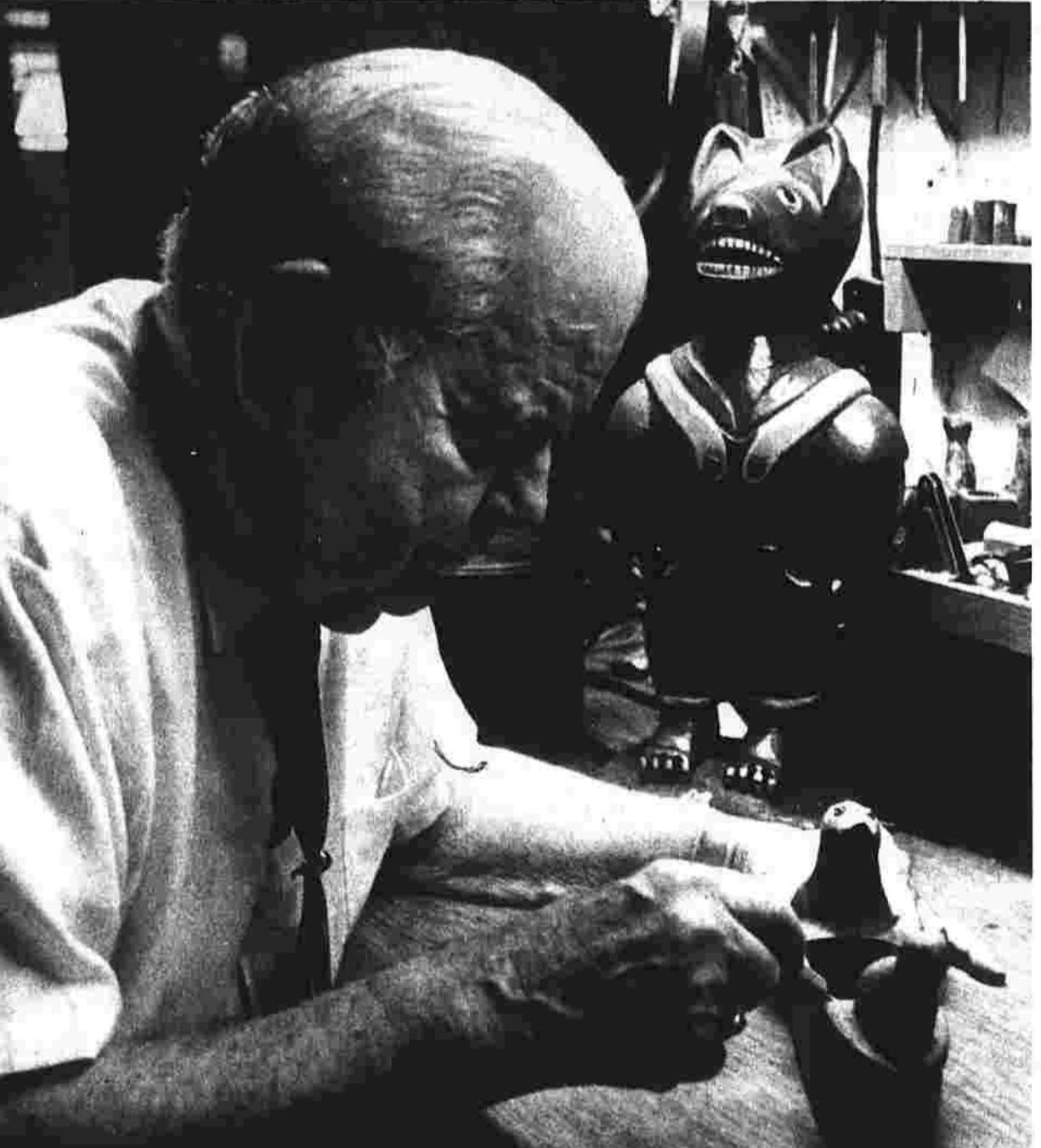

Who Is Rich? Who Is Poor? One need not go far as to contend that America has already become the best of all possible worlds for everybody

It consists, as we all have been witnessing, of spreading two or three inches of fresh asphalt on top of the old paving. It comes out smooth as silk, with all the old wrinkles and pot-holes gone, and the only advance preparation required to have the old road bed ready for the new surface is the elevation of manhole covers to whatever the next new level of paving is going to be.

It seems speedy and efficient, as a paving process, with good result. Now for the small question. Every time a street is paved by this method, the level of the street is raised by two or three inches. In some stretches of street, this brings the street up nearly to the same level as the curb. On every street, it decreases the depth and the run-off capacity of the gutters. On some streets, one more repaving by this method would eliminate the gutters altogether.

What happens then? Does letting run-off go up over the sidewalks become the accepted thing? Or do we, at that point, suddenly go back and tear up all the old paving on the street, and start all over again, down at the old original level?

We just don't want our grandchildren to be assuming they won't have anything to worry about.

Mr. Nixon's Case in August

The statement was made on this page recently that conditions are better in the United States today than they were four years ago. It has been challenged by a reader who asks for evidence. We would submit the following on this subject which is of first interest to all voters beginning to think about how they will cast their ballots come November.

Four years ago the United States was at a peak of military commitment in Vietnam. The war was taking between 400 and 500 American lives a week. It had cost the country more than \$50,000,000,000. True, some of these have been transferred to other uses, but the cost in lives and money is staggering.

Today the American commitment to the war is far down. From more than a half million Americans in Vietnam we have now only a few thousand. True, some of these have been transferred to other uses, but the cost in lives and money is staggering.

The war is not over, but the degree of American involvement is so low that it has ceased to be a major factor either in the American economy or in American politics. Mr. Nixon, we think, will get a larger vote if he actually increases the rate of the war by one percent, but the war has been largely defused. We think that it will make a difference in the election.

The state of the economy today still leaves much to be desired. Unemployment is at 8.5 percent. The rate of inflation is at 11.6 percent. The rate of interest is at 12 percent. The rate of growth is at 2.8 percent.

How far, practically speaking, can Messrs. McGovern and Shriver expect to get with their appeal to the economically deprived when a great overwhelming majority of the American people are probably quite ready to confess that they have never had it as good?

Perhaps most important of all is the quieting down of cities and universities. There was almost no serious student unrest last winter. There have been no major disturbances in the big cities this summer. The latest movement among students is back to religion, or what passes for religion. The Negro community, whose plight is being widely publicized, is back to religion, or what passes for religion.

It is not a broad and butter hunger. It may perhaps be for some of those intangibles to which the modern "populist" candidates also give their oratorical attention—like increased trust and faith in one another, a renewed enlightenment of the highest quality of our own social and political compact, a simple regard for truth and for decency. But their credibility in their talk about such fine abstractions is impaired and sabotaged, it seems to us, when they ask us to vote as if we were either rich or poor. More and more of us, these days, have trouble making up our minds which we really are.

Is Light Speed the Speediest?

PASADENA, Calif. (AP) — For most of the 20th century nothing in science has been who daily sees the skies with quite as inviolate as the speed of light. Albert Einstein's revolutionary theory that nothing can travel faster than 186,000 miles per second has become a cornerstone of modern physical science.

But now astronomers have discovered another object far out in the universe that seems to be blowing apart at several times the speed of light — in direct conflict with the idea first advanced in 1908.

The latest finding is by a team of astronomers from the California Institute of Technology here, Cornell University and the National Radio Astronomy Observatory at Greenbank, W. Va. It brings to three the number of the objects detected since the first discovery 18 months ago.

Radio astronomers say this new finding is further evidence that the original observations weren't just quirks of nature. But the experts are not yet closer to understanding what strange processes might be at work in the distant heavens. And the discoveries have been reported, John Langui, now with the Norwich Bulletin.

Judge Delays New Trial Bid On Fire-Bombing

HARTFORD (AP) — A federal judge reserved decision Wednesday on a motion for a new trial for two Puerto Rican men convicted of fire-bombing a police car in New Haven. The four new witnesses were produced in support of a new trial for Jose Torres Cruz and Ruben A. Vega. All four witnesses—two neighbors of the defendants, a greaser and a butcher—said they did not see a fire bomb thrown on the night of July 30, 1970.

The night was one of five nights of civil disorders in Hartford's North End. The four new witnesses were unceremoniously after the June 1971 trial of Cruz and Vega by a former Hartford Courant reporter, John Langui, now with the Norwich Bulletin.

Langui testified at the hearing that after he found the four witnesses he returned with an interpreter and a lawyer and took sworn statements. However, under cross-examination, Langui said the Courant never printed the story because his supervisors felt it was insubstantial.

Defense lawyer William Kusler told Judge John O. Newman that the testimony of the new witnesses was strong enough to warrant a new trial.

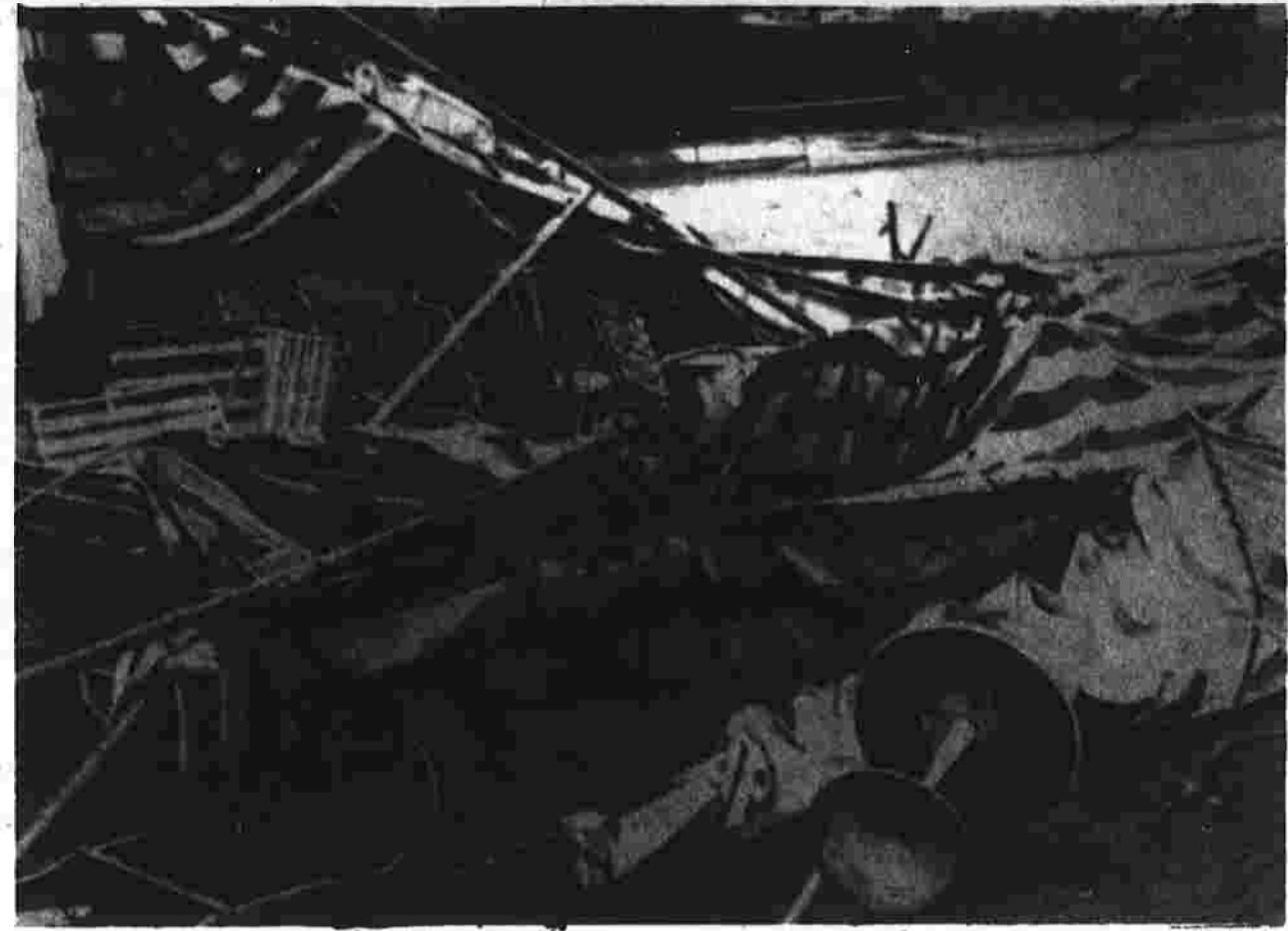

Citizens of Sabah Also Shareholders

By HARI SUBRAMANIAM KOTA KINABALU, Malaysia (AP) — The state government of Sabah has promised to give every citizen a share in a foundation which promises to grow into the biggest business enterprise in South Asia.

The Yayasan Sabah, or Sabah Foundation, gets about 30 square miles of rich timber land to exploit annually. Profits are paid as dividends to shareholders or reinvested into shipping, industrial and agricultural projects.

Oil explorations are being carried out by international companies off the coast. From more logging activities the foundation is to begin wood processing. An official says: "We intend to get into any big industrial or agricultural project that comes up in Sabah. We will not get into small business and industries. That will be left to the private sector."

Syrian Chief To Keep Advisers from Russia

BEIRUT (AP) — President Hafez Assad says he will not order Soviet military advisers to leave Syria because "they are here for our own good," the leftist Beirut newspaper Al-Anwar reported today.

Assad said that during a visit to Moscow last month he signed agreements including provisions for supplies of advanced weapons to Syria's 110,000-man army. He already is fully equipped with all but the latest Soviet arms.

Asked if Soviet experts could prevent him from going to war with Israel, Assad said: "No one can prevent me. The decision, as far as we in Syria are concerned, cannot be made in Moscow."
