The "Cosmos" series of three new stamps saluting man's exploits into outer space — has been issued by the Republic of Indonesia. One of the addresses hails Indonesia's own efforts in space exploration.

The lowest value stamp shows an international weather satellite in space, the ESSA-8, which provides information on the world's weather in a matter of seconds and has enabled areas to be warned of impending storms as they develop.

Another depicts an American astronaut descending from his landing capsule on the moon's surface. The dates "1969-1972" mark the first three years of lunar exploration.

The highest value in the set features Indonesia's own "Kartika 1" rocket and the date "1964-1972" which signify that country's rocketry program.

Also issued by Indonesia, according to the World Wide Philatelic Agency, is a stamp to honor the 10th anniversary of the famed Hotel Indonesia as part of its Tourist series.

Collectors are now in the midst of seeing a deluge of stamps from various countries paying tribute to the Olympic Games. Since the end of World War II this outpouring of stamps has been a regular thing every four years.

Canada's latest two stamps feature artifacts and the way of life of that country's Plains Indians. These are the first in a series of 20 stamps which will be issued over the next three years.

One design reproduces "Buffalo Chase" by George Catlin, 19th century artist noted for his life-long study and portrayal of Indian life. The second stamp design was based on a photograph by Ray Webber, illustrating several Indian artifacts.

Norway has commemorated the 100th anniversary of the birth of King Haakon VII with two new stamps of identical design. The 80-ore red and 120-ore blue show a portrait of the King from a photograph taken during military operations in 1940. King Haakon VII was named King of Norway in 1905 and reigned until his death in 1957.

The 4 cent shows the bonefish, a shoreline inhabitant, while the 15 cent and 18 cent denominations feature the wahoo and yellowfin tuna which range offshore. The 24 cent displays the great amberjack, a typical reef fish.

If you think a local Bermuda fisherman designed the stamps, you are wrong. The designer was Maynard Reece of Des Moines, Iowa.

Israel's four latest stamps highlight four of the 42 tanks brought to that country from Italy. The designs depict an ark from a long-closed synagogue in Ancona, from a synagogue of the Soragna community near Parma, a 17th century ark from the Sephardic Synagogue of Padua (1729) and the 1786 Ark from Reggio Emilia.

Justice Dissents on a Claim of Court Hardship

WASHINGTON (AP) — Ever since Warren Burger became chief justice he has sounded one persistent theme: the Supreme Court is overloaded with work and something must be done about it.

From Justice William O. Douglas Wednesday night came a dissent—calm, soft with a smile, but a characteristically independent disagreement with the predominant view.

Burger's plea, sounded before bar and judicial groups and the public at large, has won for the court a handful of additional law clerks and administrators, an extra few dollars from a sometimes skeptical Congress.

But is the court overworked? Douglas, in a rare CBS-TV interview, suggested it is not. He agreed with Burger that the actual number of cases reaching the high court is on the rise—from 1,800 a year three decades ago to about 4,200 currently.

NEW YORK (AP)—Up to 752 new air-conditioned subway cars will be built for the city's transit system under a \$210.5 million contract announced today.

The contract with Pullman-Standard was described as the largest single passenger car order in the history of American railroads and will facilitate the phaseout of all pre-World War II cars now in use.

Mayor John V. Lindsay said in remarks prepared for the contract signing that approximately 20 per cent of the entire subway fleet of 7,000 cars will be air conditioned when delivery is complete.
