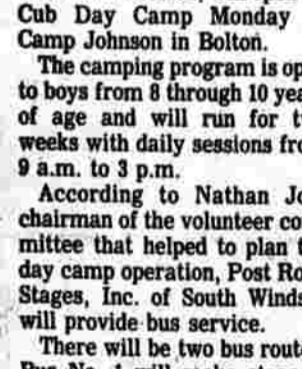

MMH Volunteers

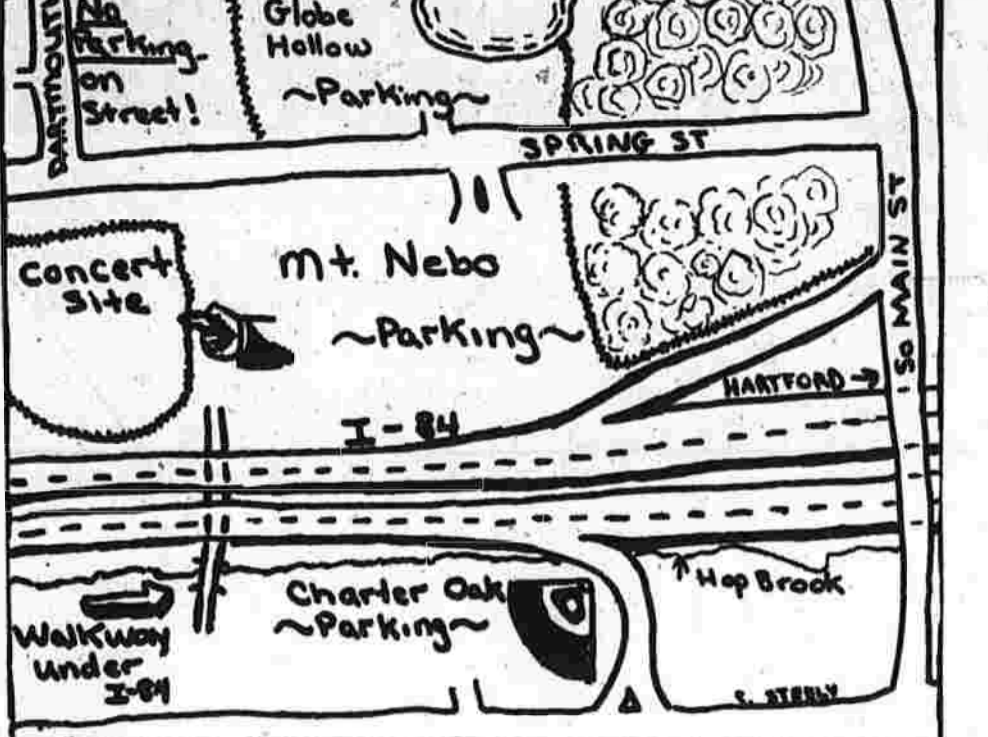

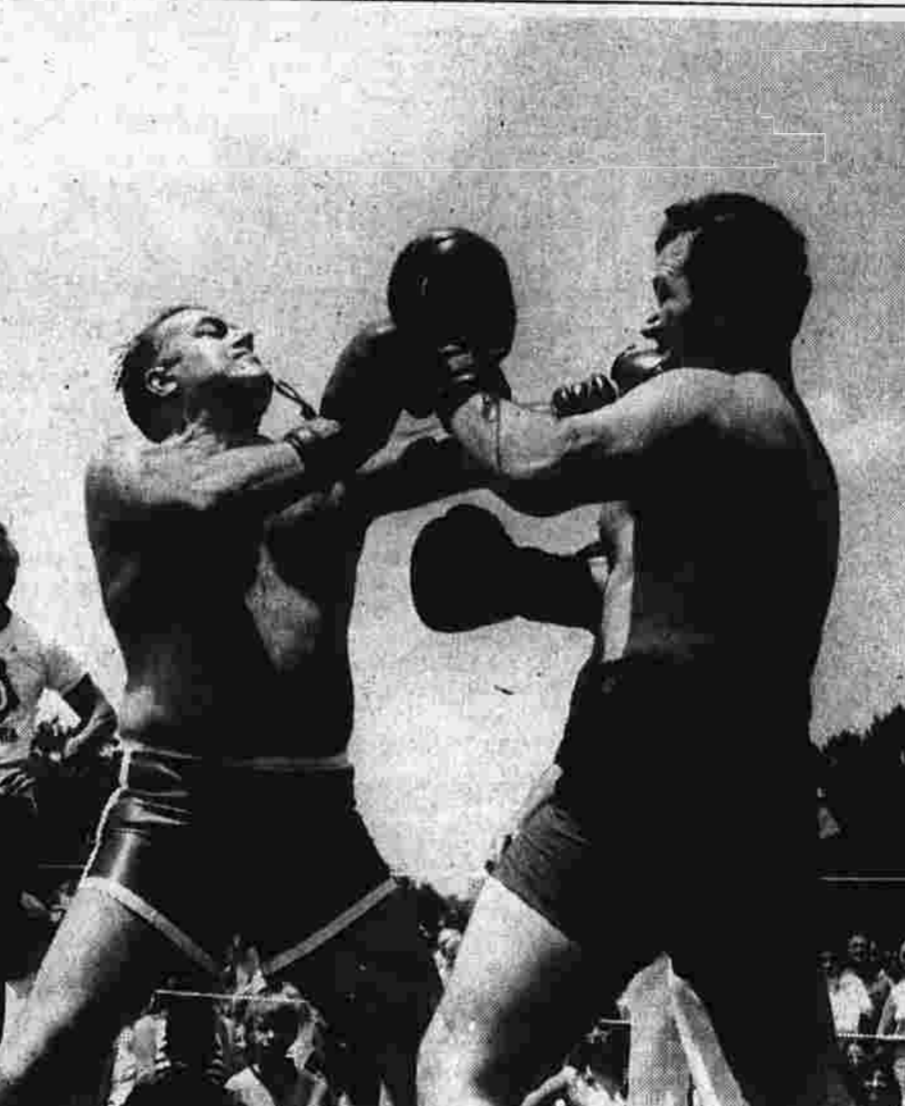
