



## Lewiston Firm Battles Leaking Natural Gas

LEWISTON, Maine (AP) — On a damp February morning in 1970, an explosion ripped through the home of Dr. and Mrs. Robert J. Wiseman Jr., silencing the quiet residential neighborhood.

Thirteen months later, Mrs. Armande Castonguay, 81, and her daughter, Rita, 46, were killed when their home was torn apart by a similar blast. Wiseman said the gas was found at high levels throughout the system.

The situation began in 1967-68 when Lewiston was converted from the "wet" manufactured gas to the "dry" natural gas. Manufactured gas kept the pipe joints moist and swollen tight.

He also had admitted during testimony before the Senate Watergate committee that he had lied in an effort to cover up involvement of presidential campaign aides in the June 17, 1972, Watergate break-in.
