Millstone Power Cut

WATERFORD (AP) — Northeast Utilities Co. says new mechanical problems have forced the company to reduce the Millstone Nuclear Power Plant Station Unit No. 1 to 80 per cent of full capacity. Authorities discovered Sept. 1, 1972 that seawater was seeping into the reactor of the plant and the facility has been shut down much of the time since then.

Leaking pipes were replaced, Northeast officials said, but now the new pipes vibrate when the plant is operating at full capacity. The load has been reduced 20 per cent while General Electric Co. engineers work on the problem, they said.

While operating on the reduced scale, the plant is producing 528,000 kilowatt, they said.

An Inside View Into The Art Of Rock Climbing

All climbing equipment is designed with safety in mind. The strength greatly exceeds forces developed in any fall, and the chief concern is not in this area, but more in the experience and common sense of the climber. This is perhaps the biggest danger in the sport. Indeed sitting hip belay is safer than crossing a busy intersection.

The following pieces of equipment are the most commonly used and will be referred to throughout the article.

The rope used in climbing must be of premium quality nylon material. Nylon is used because it will stretch under a load, transmitting less force to the climber in the event of a fall. Forces are generally small in a top roped fall, but reach peak loads of up to 2,300 pounds in a severe leader fall. For this reason leaders must be very cautious in their ascents.

There are different constructions of climbing ropes, but all are made of nylon. The most popular type used in rock climbing is a braided nylon rope (often referred to as "Perlon") that is a fibrous nylon core encased in a braided nylon sheath. The strength of the rope (around 6,000 pounds) is primarily due to the core, while the outer sheath serves as protection from abrasive damage.

Nylon webbing similar to seat belt material is the basis of a good climbing harness. The webbing comes in different widths and types of construction, but all harnesses must have strengths exceeding 4,000 pounds. The harness is tied around the body and clipped to the rope with a carabiner.

Rock climbing equipment must be strong, but light in weight, necessitating the use of high tensile strength aluminum alloys in most of the metal containing equipment.

Carabiners, or snap links are sometimes called, are perhaps the most needed of all the rock climber's equipment. They consist of all metal frames (usually aluminum) bent in an oval "D" shape, with one of the legs being a hinged spring gate. This allows the carabiner to be clipped to other pieces of equipment (the rope, other carabiners, etc.).

Another form of carabiner has a lock which keeps the gate closed to prevent its opening at an inopportune moment. The locking carabiner is used primarily for clipping the climber into the rope via a waist harness. The strength of the most commonly used carabiners is 4,000 and 6,000 pounds.

Pitons are basically metal spikes made of high strength steel alloy and can be driven into the rock, which incidentally damages the rock. They have an eye through which the climber can clip a carabiner. Through this carabiner he clips the rope. He may form a chain of two or more carabiners to keep the rope away from cracks or other areas where it could get stuck or damaged.

Artificial chockstones (called chocks or nuts) are cast blocks of aluminum with a hexagonal or wedge shaped cross section with an attached sling. They are placed into cracks in such a way that they cannot pull out, yet can easily be lifted out of the crack via a carabiner to the sling runner allowing the rope to freely pass through the carabiner. Chocks are the basis of "clean climbing" - climbing which causes no damage to the rock. Beginning leaders should be taught to use pitons only as a last resort. Most clean climbers carry no pitons whatsoever.

All equipment should be well cared for and inspected before each climbing session. In the event of a fall the rope in the climber's lifeline and it should be treated with due respect. Proper care of a climbing rope demands not stepping on the rope as this grinds dirt into the core, thereby weakening the rope. Contact or storage with petroleum solvents must strictly be avoided - petroleum products damage nylon. For this reason a rope should not be stored in a car trunk because gas fumes can accumulate in the confined space above the gas tank. Contact with many climbing items, however, excessive use of pitons is prohibited to prevent cutting and fraying of the rope.

Proper footwear is as important in rock climbing as it is in any sport. Generally light fitting solid boots are used, allowing the climber to use his toes to hook and "lean" his foot into cracks in the rock, essentially "making" his own footholds.

Confidence

Beginning rock climbers have little confidence in the strength of the equipment. One of the necessary confidence is to begin going down instead of up the rock, rappelling down the rock faces. There are several methods used for rappelling, of which the two most common are the body rap and the use of a mechanical braking system. The rope is wrapped around the body in a special manner in the body rap, and the friction of the rope around the body enables the climber to make a controlled descent. The mechanical braking method consists of a bar which fits on a carabiner. The rope runs through the carabiner, over the bar and out again. This is clipped into a seat harness and the bar's friction allows a controlled rap.

The method of climbing which should be taught first to a beginner is termed "top roping." In this system one person - the belayer - is at the bottom preparing to climb. The climber finds a comfortable seat where his feet can be securely braced against solid rock and ties himself into a solid object at the top - usually the base of a tree.

This prevents him from being pulled over the edge if he loses his footing should the climber fall. He then takes the free part of the rope over the edge to the climber below, clearly shouting "roped!" A moment before he does the climber flips the rope into his harness and waits for the belayer to pull up the slack in the rope. Once this is done and the belayer is firmly braced in a sitting position, the belayer gives the climber a sitting hip belay. The rope passes behind the belayer's back, above the sling that the belayer is tied in with, and at a belt level. The rope must above the belayer's protection to prevent the rope from slipping out from under the belayer.

The rope coming from the climber should be running across the left hip, behind the back, under the right hip and run through the right hand. In such a manner the left hand guides the rope and the right one applies a brake to the rope in the event of a fall. The right hand must never leave the rope in case of an unexpected fall.

Signale Important

The climber is now ready to begin. A series of verbal signals between the belayer and climber are used to assure of each other's readiness, and the climber begins the ascent. As the climber moves up the rock, the belayer uses his guiding hand to pull up the slack and slides, but never releases his braking hand, back on the rope. With practice this becomes a smooth, effortless motion.

The belayer keeps little slack in the rope but he is careful not to pull the climber off his feet by putting tension on the rope. The climber wants to climb the rock, not be hauled up by it.

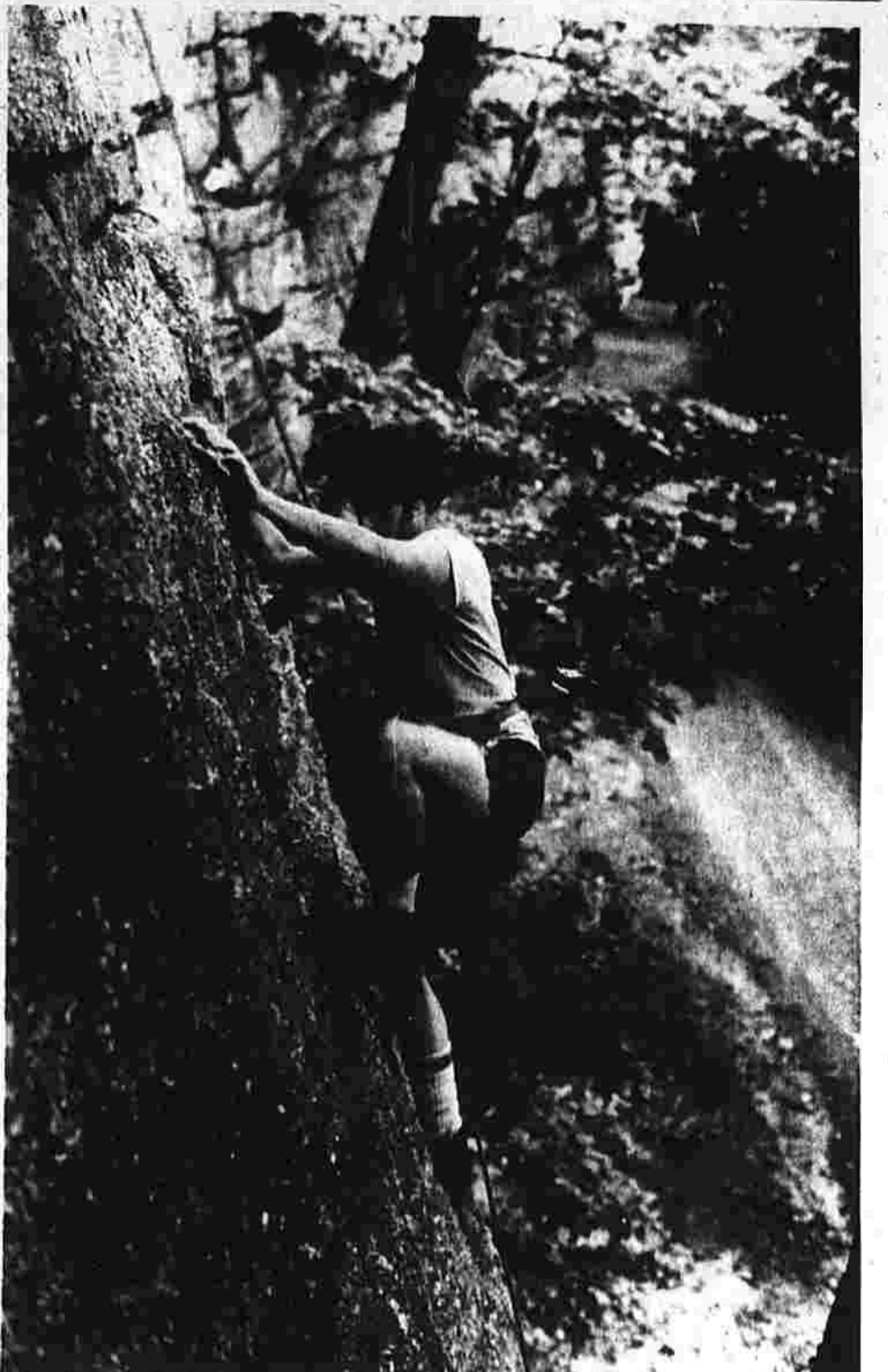
The purpose of the belay is to catch at which point the climber must detour the route by traversing left or right, then ascending and finally returning on route.

Smooth Motion

Climbing should be a smoothly coordinated motion - the climber should never lurch or jump for holds or he will inevitably fall. Rock climbing requires a thorough knowledge of several knots. Knots are used for tying the rope to the climber's body, tying the rope off to trees, and for many other uses. These knots must be correctly to prevent slipping of the knot and to allow ease of untying. Beginning climbers should use only the standard knots never using any of their own creations which are generally difficult to untie and cumbersome to use.

Most climbers in the Hartford area frequent Ragged Mountain in Southington. The main cliffs are approximately 100 feet high and 600 feet long. The smaller cliffs are about 60 feet high and 100 feet in length. The Ragged cliffs are nearly vertical and offer climbs adequate for beginners and challenging enough for the most experienced climbers.

Many feel the most diversified climbing within 200 miles of Hartford is found at the Shawangunks located outside of New Falls, N.Y. The cliffs vary in height reaching a maximum of about 200 feet. Almost all climbs can easily be protected with climbing nuts, however, excessive use of pitons is prohibited.

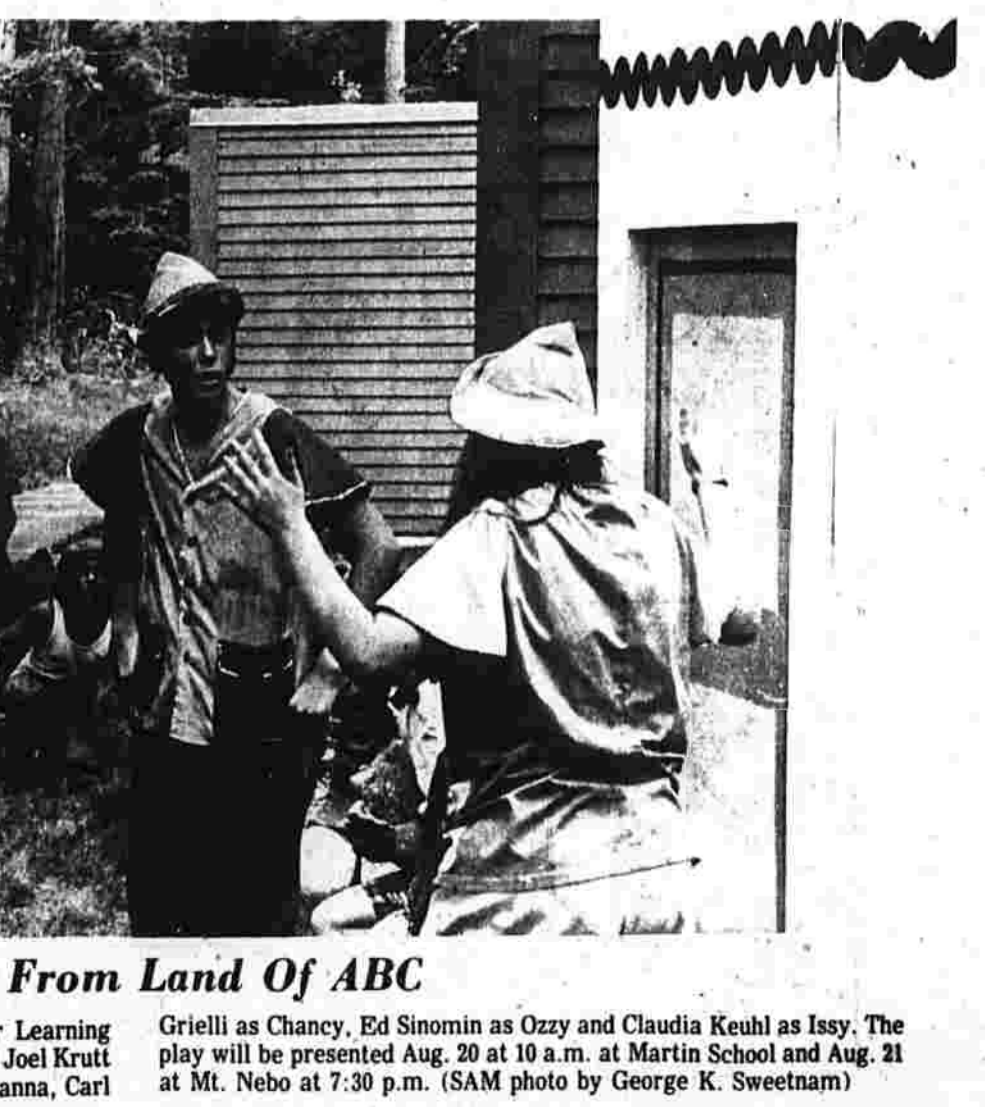

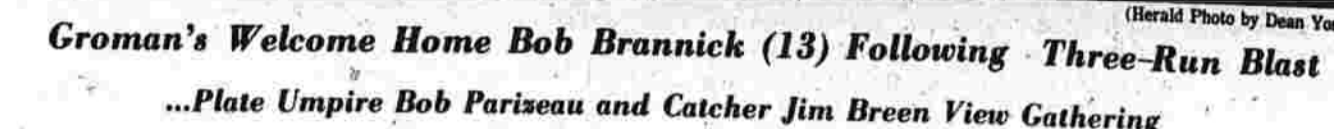

Some Retailers May Have To Roll Back Gasoline Prices

WASHINGTON (AP)—Many gasoline retailers who hiked prices during the gasoline shortage may have to roll them back from one to three cents a gallon on Sept. 1, the Cost of Living Council says.

However, council spokesmen also said the Phase 4 gasoline price ceilings may result in higher prices at other gasoline pumps. The ceilings will vary from dealer to dealer.

The new guidelines, released by the council Friday, provide that the ceiling price on gasoline to take effect Sept. 1 will be the retailer's average cost of purchasing gasoline on Aug. 1 increased by the same markup he charged last Jan. 10.

The markup is the amount above cost that the retailer charges for his product.

William N. Walker, attorney for the council, said restricting dealers to their Jan. 10 markups will eliminate many of the price increases intended to take advantage of the spring and summer gasoline shortage.

The current price freeze will be lifted from oil and most other petroleum products on Monday, but is being extended until Sept. 1 on gasoline to give retailers time to compute the price ceilings.

In other economic developments:
—The government announced Friday that inflation during the April-June quarter reflected an annual rate of 7.3 per cent—up from the 6.8 per cent of the first

quarter—while the nation's economic growth slowed to 2.4 per cent, compared with the 8.7 per cent growth rate for the first quarter.

—John A. Love, President Nixon's top energy adviser, urged a group of oilmen Friday to shift refinery output away from gasoline and to more heating oil, warning that the nation faces a potentially serious heating oil shortage this winter.

—Two major tire manufacturers, Goodyear and B.F. Goodrich, announced plans to increase tire prices in 30 days, by 5.9 per cent and 4.4 per cent, respectively.

Ship Unsafe

Divers Abandon Doria Salvage

FAIRHAVEN, Mass. (AP)—A reputed \$4 million worth of sunken treasure remains in the hull of the luxury liner Andrea Doria today despite a \$250,000 effort to retrieve it.

The 26-day diving adventure to bring back the loot culminated when two Navy aquanauts hacked through the hull of the wreck, only to find its interior a tangle of treacherous rubble after 17 years on the ocean bottom.

The diving team returned to Fairhaven on Friday with four silver trays, a spoon and a bottle of perfume, estimated to be worth about \$2,000.

Meanwhile, 40 miles off Nantucket, the wealth of silver, jewels and cash lies in the hull of the Italian liner, guarded by sharks and a morass of twisted wire and wood that threatens the lives of future salvagers.

"We reached the point in the ship where the purser's office, the jewelry store and the bank were supposed to be, but they just weren't there," said Robert Coffey, one of the support divers on the mission.

Instead, the treasure-filled offices were in a 20-foot-deep pile at the bottom of the ship. In it were thought to be four portable safes that contained an estimated \$1 million in cash.

The wreck was "just a mess," Coffey said. "There were girders and false ceilings coming down. All kinds of junk was hanging there by wires."

"We didn't try to sift through any of that junk, because we could have gotten killed," he said. "It wasn't worth it."

The two divers who planned the expedition, Chris Delucchi, 22, and Donald Rodocker, 27, both of San Diego, Calif., said they were satisfied with their work even though they didn't get the treasure.

One purpose of the trip was to experiment with an underwater technique called saturation diving, said Rodocker. "The mission was 90 per cent successful, because the system is checked out, and it tested fantastically."

Delucchi and Rodocker, using the technique, stayed on the ocean bottom day and night for eight days while they worked on the wreck. They ate and slept in a white, cigar-shaped chamber called "Mother" that they had anchored near the hull.

The two said they had patents on the chamber, which they designed, and plan to build

others to sell while using the original on easier treasure hunts.

The Italian liner Andrea Doria sank in 245 feet of water when it collided with the Swedish liner Stockholm July 25, 1956.

Previous salvage divers using dynamite might have created some of the havoc inside of the ship, the divers said.

However, they said the construction of the vessel accounted for most of the difficulties.

"The whole interior is false bulkheads made out of wood, and it's all collapsed," said Rodocker. "We didn't expect that at all."

"We expected metal bulkheads covered with wood. That's how they are described in manuals."

The divers said they feared that local explorers would try to enter the ship through the hole that's been cut through its side.

"It's a cookie jar with the lid off," said one member of the mission.

"The Andrea Doria is there to stay," said Rodocker. "There is a great risk of life going in there to get the stuff. If local divers go in there, there is a great chance they won't come out."

Delucchi added, "Several tons of wooden bulkheads are hanging from wires. Just the bubbles from the scuba divers' exhaust could shake them loose in a microsecond."

One of the project's investors, Foster R. Herman, a New Bedford lawyer, said "a quarter million dollars in time, research, development and money" were spent. "As far as we are concerned, the salvage operation was only part of the mission."

"The major part was to prove saturation diving is here to stay," he said. "We've certainly proven that."

Another investor, Peter F. Staiti of New Bedford, said the group expected to recover most of its money by selling movie and book rights to the expedition.

Delucchi said their next adventure would be an attempt to take movies of the wreck of the Lusitania, a British steamer that sank off the coast of Ireland in 1915 when it was torpedoed by a German submarine. An estimated 1,198 lives were lost in the catastrophe.

After the patching work was completed, town crews flushed the line and put the Buckingham reservoir pumps back into operation.

MIKE RAYDAR

State Man Hiked 2,035 Mile Trail

NEW BRITAIN, Conn. (AP)—The floods of Vermont did not stop Mike Raydar from doing what 124 others have done—hike the 2,035 mile Appalachian Trail.

Raydar, 22, of New Britain, began the trek March 7 in Georgia and arrived at Mt. Katahdin in Maine, Aug. 3. At the finish, he was 50 pounds lighter.

Raydar said he had to work especially hard during the last 600 miles from Connecticut to Maine, because he ran into the 10 straight days of rain in Vermont along with freezing weather in the White Mountains.

"The trail was solid mud and water, often like a stream," he said. "My boots weren't dry until I was half way through New Hampshire."

Only once did he leave the trail, when he spent a night in a Manchester, Vt. motel.

"I had to stop. I had had enough rain and had to dry out," he said.

"I think it was a smart move, because my morale was getting low. After the nice dry bed, dry clothes and hot meals, I was all set to keep going."

During the last part of the hike in New Hampshire and Maine, Mike was accompanied by Rich Shanahan of Bristol, a Central Connecticut State

College student who was hiking half the trail this year. They were averaging about 20 miles a day until they came to the White Mountains, which "cut me down," Mike said.

"I think they were the most beautiful part of the trail and also the most rugged."

"We hiked 6,288 feet to the top of Mt. Washington, where the temperature was minus two degrees, with the wind chill factor."

The average temperature on the mountains was 27 degrees."

"We also went through Mahoosic Notch in Maine, where there's ice all-year round," he said. "It's between two mountains and doesn't get any sun."

"It's full of caves and crevices and I often had to take off my pack and slip it between two rocks and then climb through," he said.

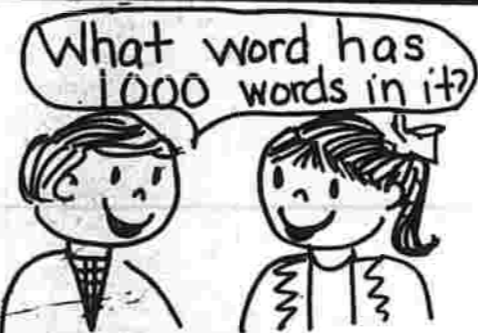


A stamp honoring Robinson Jeffers was issued on August 13 in Carmel, California.

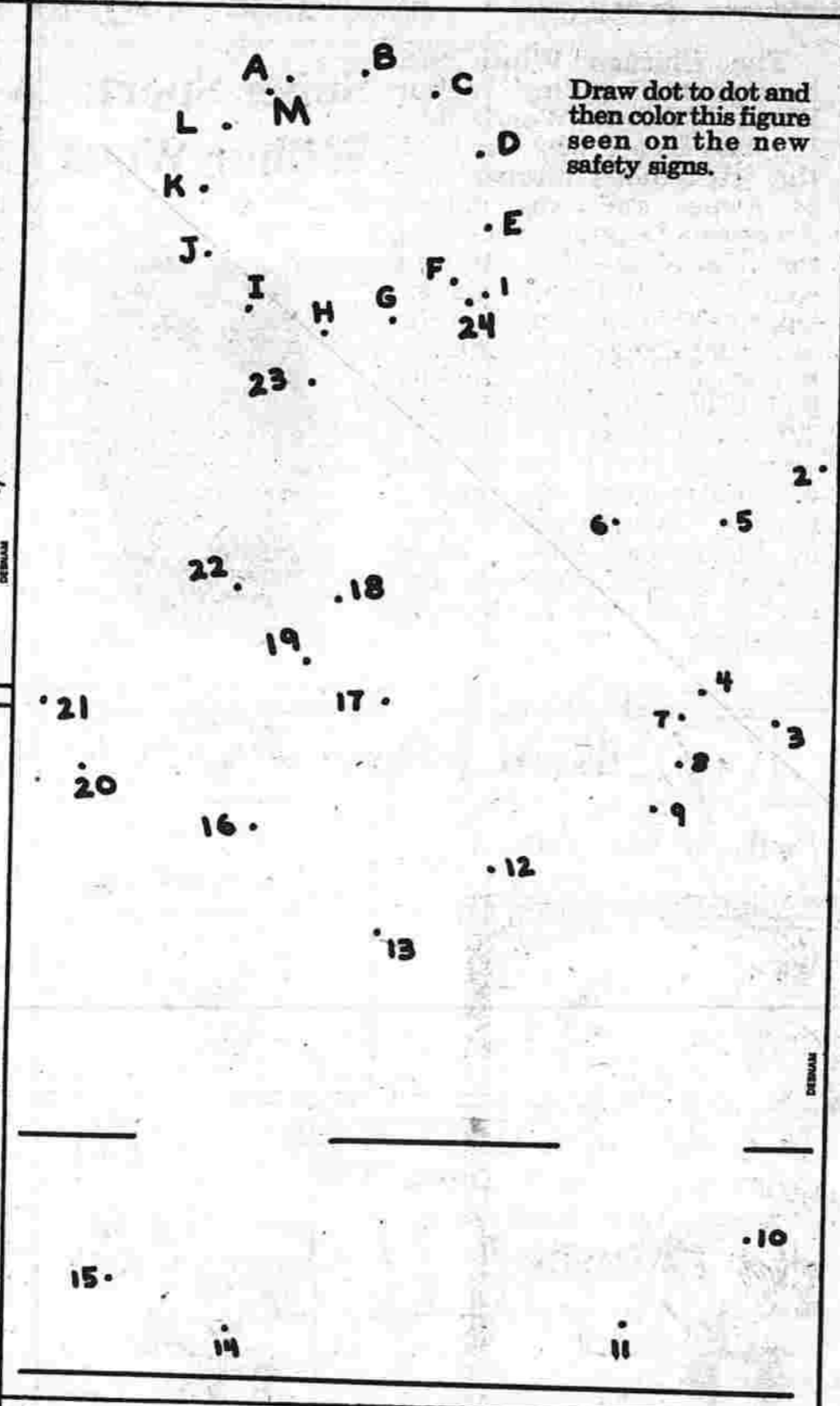

Color TVs Number Nearly 50 Million

The total number of color equipped TV households in the United States has increased to 42,400,000, according to a recent estimate by Alfred J. Ordover, vice president, Corporate Planning, NBC-TV. This total, which involves 63.1 per cent of the total number of television households, represents an increase of 6.6 million color TV households since July 1972. During the past year, industry sales of color sets were more than 18 per cent above the 1972 record level, Ordover observed. He predicts that sales will approach 10 million in 1973 and "color penetration will be approximately 70 per cent by the end of the year." The survey was based on a variety of industry source data, including reports of color set production, sales, imports and dealer inventories.
