

Intellectual Suppression

Dictatorships live in great fear of intellectual dissent. They thrive only in an atmosphere of slavish unanimity of thought and conformity with the ideas laid down from above. Russia is giving the world new and overpowering indications that it is the same Communist dictatorship which it has always been.

We cannot be disarmed by the jovial attitude of a Leonid Brezhnev, who almost acts the buffoon on his visits to the United States. Russia is still the same as it was under Lenin, and Stalin. While there are no great purges, nor repetition of the infamous starvation of the Ukraine, Russia is making war, in cold blooded fashion, on those who dissent or criticize the

In three separate related affairs recently it has shown an intolerance of freedom of thought and ideas which leaves no doubt that exteriors may have changed, but Communist basics are unchanging.

Professor Andrei Sakharov, Russian physicist has charged that "mind-bending drugs are used in the Soviet to influence the minds of Russian dissenters who, in lieu of prison are sent to Red hospitals on the pretext that they are insane."

Evidently if they are of sound mind at the time of their committment they soon become demented through the methodical use of drugs. The aim seems to be to destroy a mind which does not agree with them and is of sufficient repute to sway the people.

In spite of a state inspired campaign to discredit him, Sakharov has charged that Russian psychiatrists methodically use drugs to induce mental imbalance. He dares the authorities to send the "sick" patients to western hospitals for treatment so that their illness may be verified or
