Coventry Police To Enforce Winter Parking Ban

Police Chief Robert Kjelquist has reminded Coventry residents that a town story removal ordinance which prohibits overnight parking on streets is now in effect.

The law forbids parking from 2 a.m. to 6 a.m. from Nov. 1 to March 31.

A penalty of \$5 is provided for violators and provisions are included in the ordinance for towing away vehicles if they impede snow removal.

The police department has begun issuing warnings to violators. As the winter season moves on, the ordinance will be strictly enforced.

If citizens must leave their cars on the street for emergency reasons, they should phone the police department at 743-7331 and advise the police of their phone number, the location of the vehicle and its registration number.

Information Leak Warning Issued

GROTON (AP) — The General Dynamics Corp.'s Electric Boat (EB) Division has warned its employees about leaking information to Russians during a five-year scientific agreement with the Soviets.

Employees at the Groton plant have been warned to avoid contact with the Russians directly or through a U.S. citizen representing the Russians.

The agreement, which was signed Sept. 25 by General Dynamics and the Soviet Union, provides for exchange of information on commercial shipbuilding, commercial aviation, telecommunications and navigational weather buoys.

EB itself is not participating in the agreement.

Sinatra Back In Fine Style

 NEW YORK (AP) — The last song Frank Sinatra sang in public before he "retired" in mid-1971 was "Angel Eyes." The last words of the tune are, "excuse me, while I... disappear."

He sang them softly, sadly, and then disappeared from show business. But Sunday night he came roaring out of retirement in a one-hour NBC special that bears repeating and soon for the unfortunates who missed it.

The chairman of the board is indeed back, and so is the superlative, the taste, the sensibility that have made him a favorite of not only the public but most musicians today.

Before canonization proceedings begin, it must be said there were a few spots — on ballads — where Sinatra's voice seemed slightly rough. And, after noting that his retirement "seemed like a good idea at the time," he promptly retreated, kicking off with a collection of his old hits, tunes like "I've Got You Under My Skin," "Street of Dreams" and "I Got a Kick Out of You."

His voice was sharp, crackling with excitement on the uptempo material and surprisingly strong for a guy who allegedly hadn't been singing much since the night he called it a day.

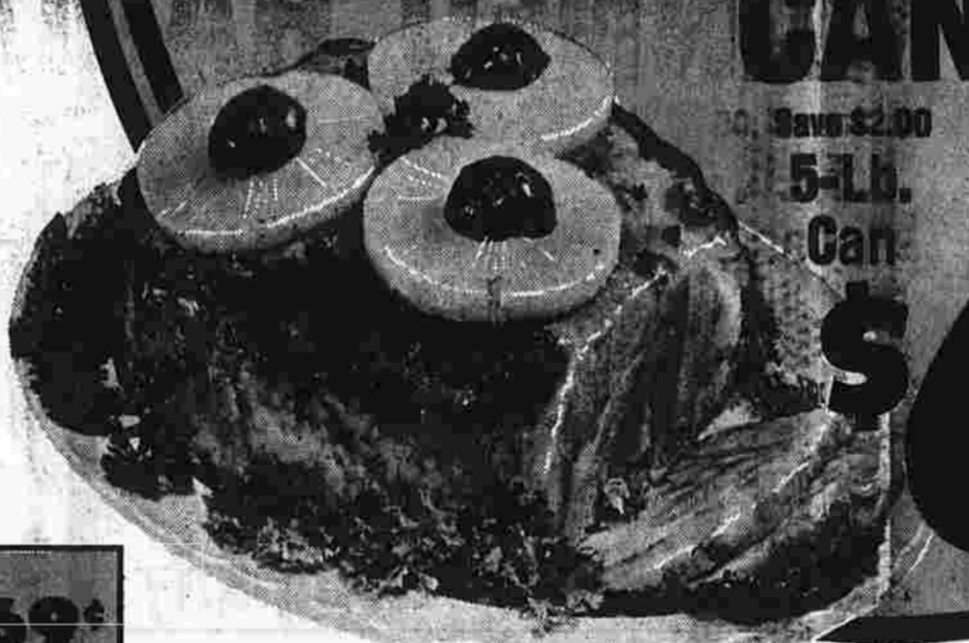
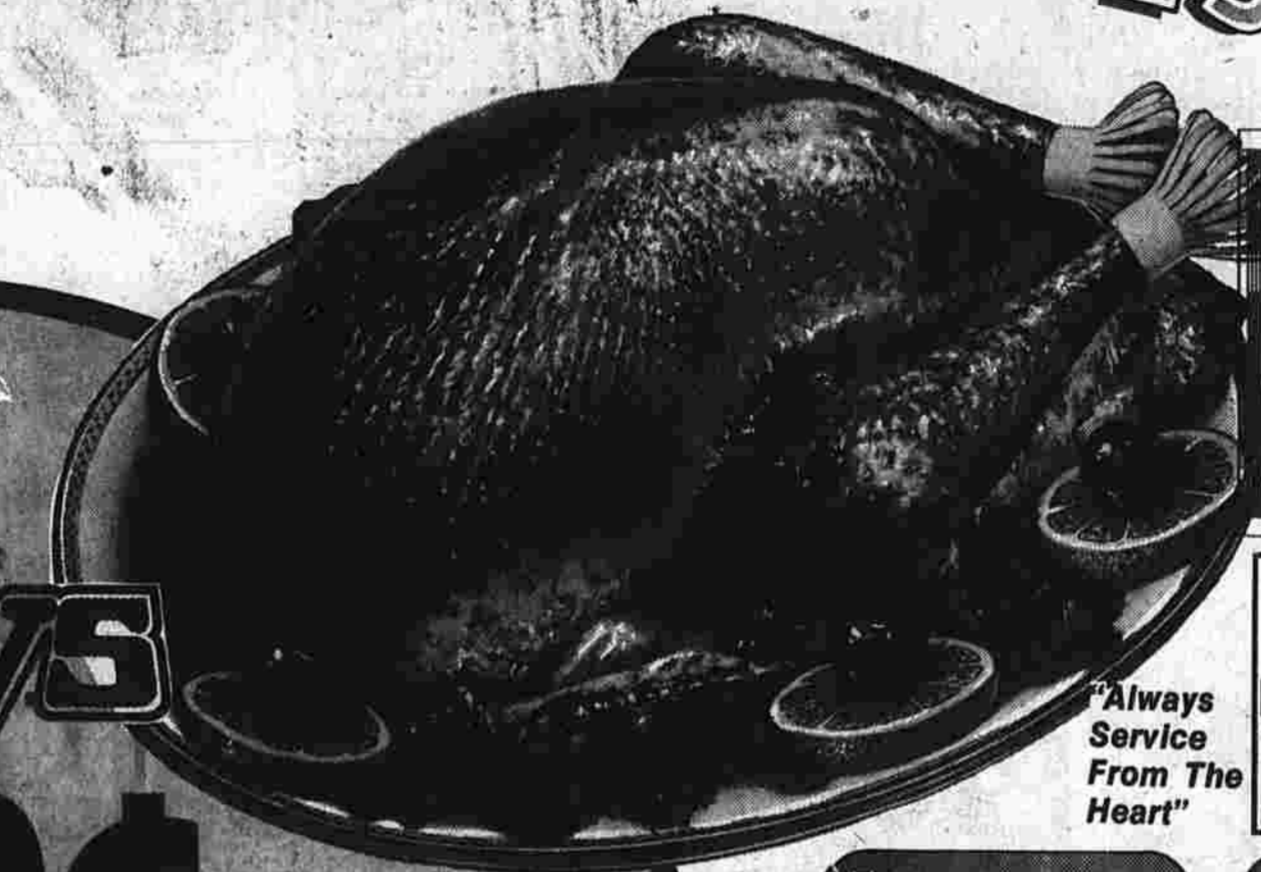

Custodial Clinic Conducted At MHS

For the past ten weeks, Ted L. Fairbanks, supervisor of buildings and grounds for the Manchester Board of Education, conducted a "custodial clinic" at the Manchester High School. The clinic, held weekly, dealt with all custodial shifts. At each session, Fairbanks reviewed board policies and rules pertaining to the buildings and grounds department. New ideas of operation, methods, new equipment, and new materials were discussed with the staff. Sales representatives appeared before the various clinic sessions and lectured on equipment and products using slides with their demonstrations. A lecture on the various types of door locks, door closers, etc., was helpful to the custodians in the care and operation of hardware.

Spy Files Opened To Historian

NORTHAMPTON, Mass. (AP) — An expert on the cold war is about to open the FBI's files on the Hiss and Rosenberg espionage cases. Allen Weinstein, 38, associate professor of history and director of the Smith College American studies program, has been granted permission to study the material by FBI Director Clarence Kelley. Kelley's action came under a new departmental policy ordered earlier this year by then Atty. Gen. Elliot L. Richardson, who said historians should have access to the files on cases that were at least 15 years old. The decision settled out of court a suit Weinstein had filed last year in an attempt to force the FBI to release the 53,000-page Hiss file. The 25,000-page Rosenberg file is being made available through a separate decision. Weinstein said the FBI can retain the right to classify some of the information if it feels individual rights of privacy or national security would be violated. Although he praised the bureau's cooperation, Weinstein said he would go to court if the FBI withheld information he felt he needed. He said he shared the bureau's concerns over the potential for abuse of raw data on individuals and said he was consulting lawyers and other scholars on how to approach it. The two cases were emotional landmarks of the cold war. Alger Hiss was convicted of stealing highly classified State Department documents on the allegations of admitted Communist Whittaker Chambers, Julius and Ethel Rosenberg were executed after they were convicted of stealing atomic bomb secrets and giving them to Russia. Weinstein views the files as an opportunity to compare the conclusions he's reached from material available with possible new conclusions from the previously secret data.

Nixon Issues Thanksgiving Proclamation

WASHINGTON (AP) — The White House has issued the following annual Thanksgiving Day proclamation by President Nixon: "In the first Thanksgiving man affirmed his determination to live in God's grace and to act in God's will on the shores of a new land of promise. In this Thanksgiving season we reaffirm that determination. 'Time has not dimmed, nor circumstance diminished, the need for God's hand in all that America may justly endeavor. In times of trial and of triumph that single truth reasserts itself, and a people who have never bowed before men go gladly to their knees in submission to divine power, and in thanks for divine assistance. 'On this Thanksgiving Day we mark the 10th anniversary of the tragic death of President John F. Kennedy. As we give thanks for the bounty and goodness of our land, therefore, let us also pause to reflect on President Kennedy's contributions to the life of this nation we love so dearly. 'Those who celebrated the first Thanksgiving had endured hardship and loss, but they kept alive their hope and their faith. Throughout our history each generation has endured hardship and loss, but our faith and trust in God's providence has remained undiminished. At this first Thanksgiving in 12 years in which the United States will have been at peace, we see that God's grace also remains undiminished. For this we give thanks. 'Now, therefore, I, Richard Nixon, President of the United States of America, in accordance with the wish of the Congress as expressed in Section 6103 of Title 5 of the United States Code, do hereby proclaim Thanksgiving, Nov. 22, 1973, as a day of national Thanksgiving, and concurrently, a day of prayer for the memory of our John F. Kennedy. Let all Americans unite on this day, giving thanks for the manifold blessings vouchsafed our people, and inviting all of those less fortunate than ourselves to share in those blessings in God's name, for His sake, and for our own. In witness whereof, I have hereunto set my hand this Sixteenth Day of November, in the Year of our Lord, Nineteen Hundred Seventy-Three and of the Independence of the United States of America, the One Hundred Ninety-Eighth."

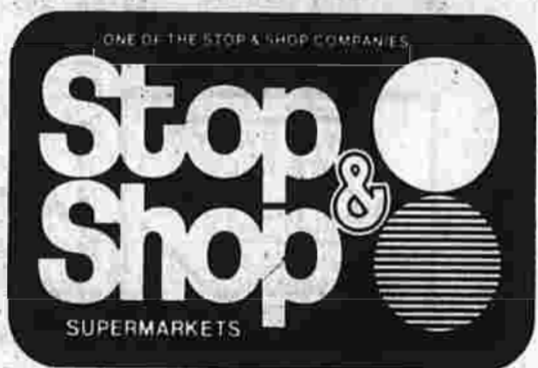

Economists View Energy Shortages

NEW YORK (AP) — A very serious situation but not a crisis. An inevitable economic slow-down, perhaps a recession, but not one of pronounced or prolonged impact. Instead, an effect more like that of a strike in a basic industry.

The personal consequences of the slowdown will be felt not only in some uncomfortably cool homes before the end of the year, but more seriously in the form of rising prices, factory shutdowns and layoffs.

While opinions vary, this appears to be close to a popular consensus among professional economists who spent the past week studying, in some cases frantically, the implications of the Arab oil boycott.

For some of them, the oil situation represented a brand-new dimension in economic forecasting in which they felt somewhat inadequate, forced to reach conclusions based on political assumptions.

Said Prof. Walter Heller, chief economic adviser in the Kennedy and Johnson administrations: "At the end of each day 50 per cent of what I know I learned last day."

Told of the remark, Alan Greenspan, economist with the consulting firm of Townsend Greenspan & Co., and a frequent adviser to President Nixon, commented: "He's in advance of most of us."

The assumption all economists agree upon is that a reduction in energy almost certainly means a reduction in production. As one put it, "An industrial economy simply replaces human muscle power with fuel power."

Based on studies for utility and other clients over the years, Pierre Binfret, head of Binfret-Boston Associates and another sometime adviser to Nixon, reached this conclusion: "In order for the Gross National Product to grow 2.4 per cent we need a 2 per cent in-

Foreign Language Teachers Assess College Programs

A group of foreign language instructors at the state's community colleges has given unanimous endorsement to the idea of increasing the number of hours of instruction assigned to foreign language courses that will be transferred to four-year institutions for credit toward baccalaureate degrees.

The endorsement of more class hours came during the third annual meeting of foreign language faculty members in the two-year public institutions of higher education held earlier this month at Manchester Community College (MCC).

"An increase from three to four hours of classroom study each week would allow more opportunity for practice, instruction and thorough mastery of the subject," according to Harold L. Colvocoresses, assistant professor of romance languages at MCC and host of the meeting.

"The group felt this would help assure high quality education in courses that would be transferred to the University of Connecticut or the four state colleges where more work would be done in languages."

Jacqueline Skubly, assistant professor of foreign languages at Housatonic Community College in Bridgeport, explained why MCC already has changed its elementary foreign language courses to meet four hours each week instead of three.

She said that the three class hours per week had proved inadequate to give thorough, first-year grounding in foreign languages. Students who have not had a thorough grounding tend to fall or, at best, struggle through their language courses at the four-year state institutions. She named several four-year institutions which also had instituted four-hour elementary language courses, including UConn, Trinity College, and others in New York and California. She noted the fact that still other institutions require five hours of elementary foreign language each week.

Other subjects that were discussed at the meeting included: Ways in which to develop effective extension courses to meet community needs; those would include French, Italian and Spanish for travelers, travel agencies and other groups.

— Establishment of career-oriented courses for the Puerto Rican business community, and travel of student groups to Puerto Rico as a cultural and linguistic experience.

— Teaching English as a second language to foreign-born of many nationalities.

— Teaching conversational Spanish to law enforcement personnel and employees of correctional institutions.

— Offering Portuguese in response to the rapidly growing population of Portuguese residents in Connecticut, estimated at more than 30,000.

The group meets annually at a different community college to compare methods of teaching languages, to discuss experiences with new courses, to explain new institutional techniques, and generally to promote the effectiveness of foreign language instruction by making it relevant to the needs of the community.

Fuel Shortage Strands Trucks

FAIRFELDMAN, W. Va. (AP) — The pavement in front of Robert Yates' empty diesel fuel pumps is filling up with out-of-gas tractor-trailers.

"This is supposed to be one of the largest truck stops in West Virginia," says Yates, who operates the Stop 77 on Interstate 77. "Yesterday we had 50 or 60 trucks stranded here."

"I don't know what we are going to do if this diesel fuel shortage keeps up. And we aren't the only truck stop with a problem."

Yates said he got a 54,000-gallon monthly allocation when he opened up the stop last year, but his business picked up and he sold nearly 300,000 gallons of fuel.

"And then this month they cut me back to almost what I was originally getting," he said.

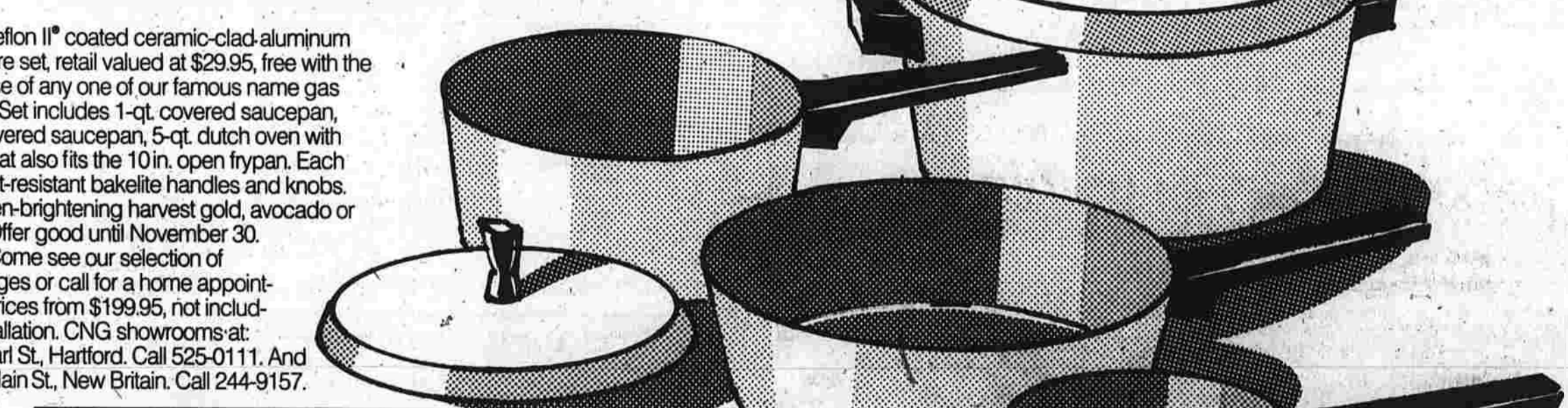
