

Hebron Town To Act On Ordinances

The Hebron Town Board will act on two ordinances proposed by the Planning Commission and two members to be elected at the town meeting.

The second ordinance provides for the appointment of a planning commission to study the town's long-range planning needs. The commission will be composed of five members, including the town engineer and two members to be elected at the town meeting.

The town meeting will be held on Monday, Dec. 10, at 7:30 p.m. at the Hebron Town Hall. The meeting will be held in the town hall, which is located at the intersection of Main Street and Hebron Avenue.

MEA Opposes Winter School Closing

The Manchester Education Association (MEA), representing 437 public school teachers, is opposing State Education Commissioner Maurice Ross' proposal to close schools from Dec. 14 to Jan. 13.

The MEA executive board states that the Ross plan doesn't represent "adequate thought or planning." MEA president Arthur Glaeser said Friday. Glaeser said there haven't been any "concrete" facts presented to show that an extended Christmas school vacation would relieve the energy crisis, which the Ross plan supposedly aims to do.

The MEA's executive board doesn't feel that Ross "has properly consulted with those who will be affected" by the school closing, Glaeser said. He continued, "Teachers feel strongly that the education of children should be a priority in our society and not one of the first sacrifices that should be made to the present energy crisis. Closing schools should only be a last resort after careful consideration and consultation with those whose lives are to be significantly altered," he said.

Students, teachers, parents, and school administrators would all be hurt by the Ross plan, Glaeser said. Glaeser said the extended Christmas vacation is a "pretty extreme" measure, and closing of schools in February — if the energy crisis persists — would be a better idea.

"If it's a desperate emergency," Glaeser said, "we'll have to do it." But educators should have a role in the decision-making, he said.
