Lavitt Files Plan For 94 Lots

Mark Lavitt, a Vernon developer, presented the final site for a 94-lot third section of the Coventry Hills development on Goose Lane and Merrow Rd. to the Planning and Zoning Commission last night.

These will be the last lots to qualify for the R1-30 zoning which requires only 30,000 square feet for a house lot. In a letter read at the meeting, the Conservation Commission called the subdivision "suburbia at its worst" and said the developer was complying with the letter of the law in regard to open space but was violating the spirit of it.

The town zoning regulations are called as open space. The town zoning regulations call for 10 per cent of the acre to be left as open space.

Rifle Range Steve Loyz, chairman of the Planning and Zoning Commission, said that when he checked the records of the Manchester Sportsman's Association he found that the Zoning Board of Appeal granted permission for a skeet shoot but could find no record of permission being granted for a rifle range. This will be checked into further.

To Discuss Budget The Conservation Commission will meet tonight at the Town Hall Board Room at 7:30 to discuss the budget for the upcoming year. There will be a report from Richard Haynes of the Department of Environmental Protection, Fish and Wildlife Division. Other items on the agenda will be a review of the recreational facilities and the Planning and Zoning seminars. Meetings are open to the public.

Zullo Hits Meskill On Job Problem

COVENTRY (UPI) — He also said the Connecticut Former Newark Mayor Frank N. Zullo has charged Gov. Thomas J. A group of Connecticut residents toured Columbia last weekend with Hartford Process-Devo which is planning to develop a new town in Coventry.

The board censured Weiss because the town paid for the property about 10 days before the warranty deed was signed.

In setting on the date for the review (Thursday night), the board didn't indicate whether it will be in executive session or in public. The review will be made the night of the review. The March 14 review is not to be confused with the one mandated in the town charter. That review is required in November of even-numbered years.
