A Remarkable Career

A remarkable career in public service, spanning more than half a century, has ended with the death of former Supreme Court Justice Earl Warren, and a three time governor of California.

Warren was also a presidential hopeful in 1948 and 1952. In 1948 he finally accepted the second spot with Thomas E. Dewey, former New York Governor, and ran for Vice President.

In 1952 Warren helped to throw the convention to Dwight Eisenhower, when it became apparent that his own candidacy was not strong enough.

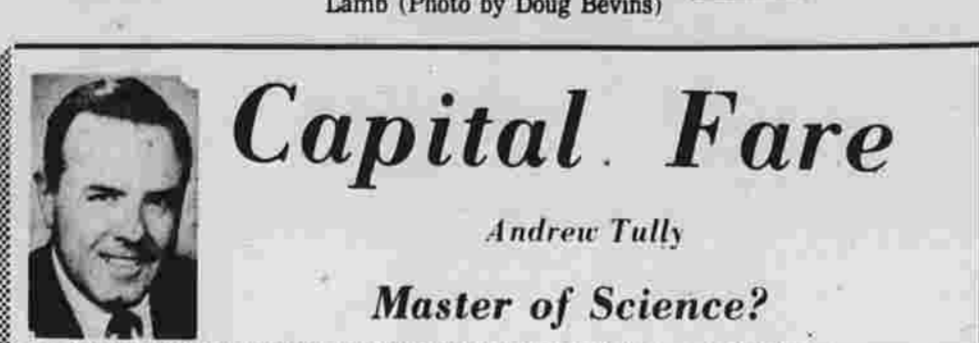

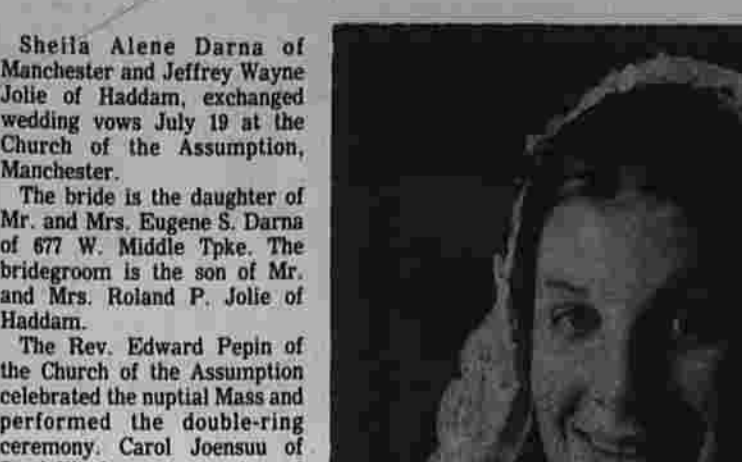

The Bolton Summer Gymnastics program, under the direction of Richard Nietupski, has 23 participants ranging in age from 6 to 14.
