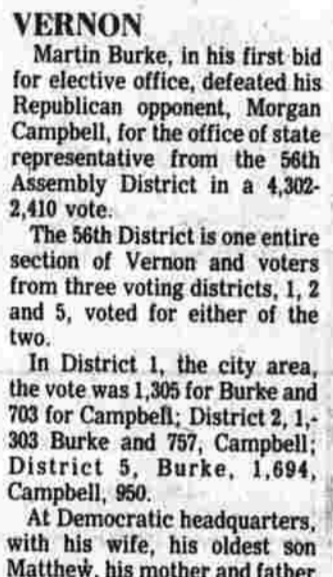
## Bertinuson Wins In 57th District

The 56th District is one entire section of Vernon and voters from three voting districts, 1, 2 and 5, voted for either of the two.

## Jaycees Sponsor Light Bulb Sale

The Manchester Jaycees will conduct a door-to-door sale of light bulbs Saturday. William H. Hyde Jr. of 140 Sunnybrook Dr. is chairman of the event.

Hyde has been a Jaycee since October 1970, and is currently serving as treasurer. He is employed in the engineering department of Pratt & Whitney Aircraft Division of United Aircraft Corp. in East Hartford. The proceeds of the sale will be used to defray expenses on future Jaycee projects that will benefit the community. Among the projects to be benefited are a Poison Awareness Program, a Santa Visitation to the local mentally retarded children, and sponsoring of a health clinic during Jaycee Week in January.

Westbrook, seeking his second term in the 14th District, lost to one-time major and former Assembly candidate Glassman, 3,817 to 2,596.

The highest vote-getters on the ballot were Democratic Secretary of State Gloria Schaffer, 4,400, who defeated Republican Sally Boister, who tallied 1,957; Wallace Party candidate Doris Sherrow, 87 votes; and American Party candidate Gene C. Dinmore, 19 votes.

Next highest vote-getter was incumbent Judge of Probate Edward R. Kuehn, a Democrat, who scored 4,234 votes to his Republican counterpart George G. Batenkoff's 2,090. Democratic U.S. Sen. Abraham Ribicoff defeated his Republican opponent James H. Brennan III by a nearly 2-1 margin in South Windsor with a vote of 4,137 to 2,220. Also in that race were Arthur F. Capezzi Jr., (D), of the Wallace Party and Norman L. Rochoy, (D), American Party.

Mrs. Grasso defeated Robert Steele 3,749 to 2,898 here. She actually scored less than many of the other major Democratic candidates on the South Windsor ticket.

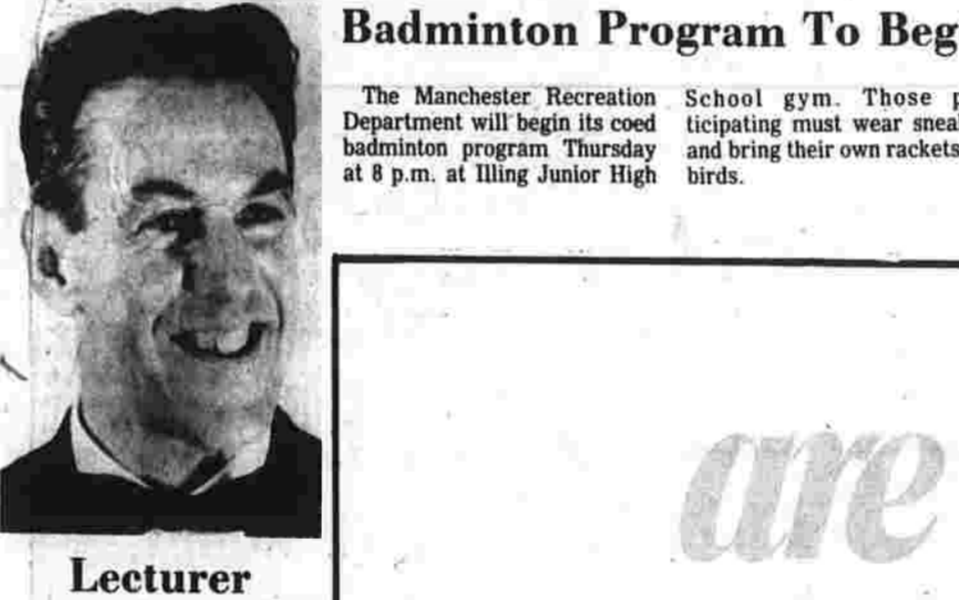

### Death as a College Course

ENID, Okla. (UPI) — A field trip to a mortuary is hardly a normal activity for a college class, but then little about the "Sociology of Death and Dying" course at Phillips University fits the academic stereotypes.

Brian Hinson, co-owner of the Hensinger-Allen Funeral Home, hosted Prof. Lloyd Taylor's 26 students during a three-hour session that involved a tour of the facilities, a brief presentation by Hinson and a question and answer session.

The tour included the chapel, state rooms, family and waiting rooms, preparation room and casket display rooms.

"The purpose of the course is to deal with this very common human problem and see it in a sociological and anthropological perspective," Taylor said. "It is an area most Americans are shielded from."

Hinson said, "Most college students have had no contact with death whatsoever. Many have a misunderstanding of what death is and what funeral homes do."

"People tend to feel it's an unpalatable job that needs to be done, and they don't realize a lot of good living value can come out of it."

Taylor said he felt the first-hand experience of visiting the mortuary would give his course an added dimension.

"Questions are triggered by seeing things at the funeral home that would never arise in a person's mind otherwise," he said. "It can open new areas of thinking for the individual."

The students' responses have been favorable.

"It's interesting to see it from a professional perspective," said Carolyn Blake, a sophomore from Pawhuska, Okla.

"If for instance someone in my family was critically ill or dying in the hospital, I think I'd be able to handle it a lot better now that I've had a lot of the feelings that person is experiencing explained to me."

In evaluating the course, Taylor mentioned a student who was confronted with two deaths in his immediate family soon after he took the course.

"This person," the professor said, "proved to be the steadying influence in the family."

BOOK REVIEW

No Final Victories, by Larry O'Brien, Doubleday, \$12.50

Larry O'Brien came on the national political scene with John F. Kennedy and played the political game with great zest. As political adviser to two presidents and two presidential candidates, he was engaged in the intricate business of winning votes and of translating policies into legislative action.

If his reputation is stiff and too straightforward, he obviously feels that the facts need little embellishment. For half a dozen years he was center stage of Democratic party politics and he records without flinching the intriguing cross current of political forces and the incredibly dramatic events of those years, along with some backstage anecdotes.

Working with John Kennedy in the 1960s, he became the complete political professional and his reputation kept him in demand among Demo-

cratic hopefuls. Unfappable, the ultimate realist, he was the man who always could get things done. He was both pragmatic and principled and he possessed the ability to turn his beliefs into accomplishments.

Ironically, O'Brien is more revealing in his comments on Lyndon Johnson than he is about his friend and mentor, Jack Kennedy. Johnson, O'Brien says, wanted to be loved, but he also wanted to dominate everyone around him. He even advised his top staff on the upbringing of their children. O'Brien concluded that Johnson "was much more successful in dominating than in being loved."

O'Brien finds the explanation for the Watergate break in his Democratic headquarters quite simple. The object was "to secure all possible information that would help the Democratic party and its chairman." That chairman, of course, was O'Brien.

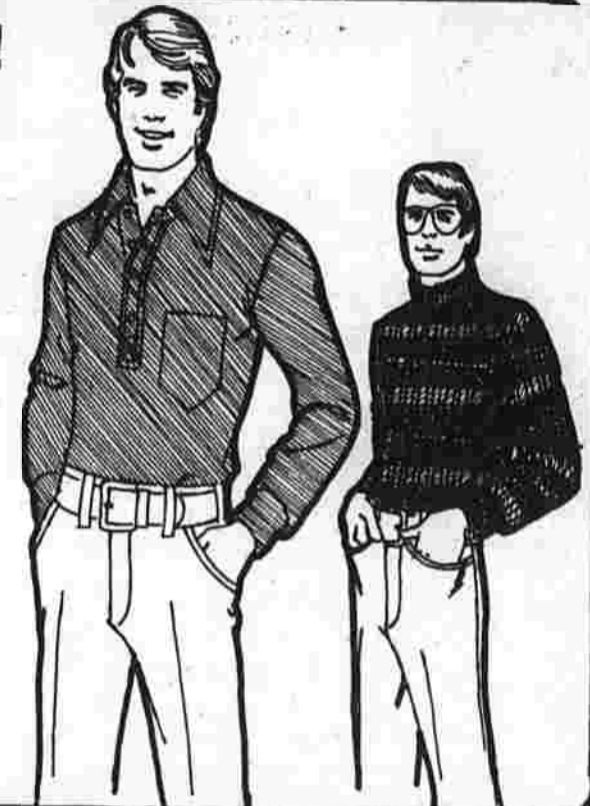

# Owner Heeds Dump Dutchman Plea And Fires Falcons' Van Brocklin

ATLANTA (UPI) — Rankin Smith finally heeded the "Dump the Dutchman" pleas of Atlanta Falcons fans. The Falcons owner fired Norm Van Brocklin as head coach and general manager Tuesday evening and named defensive chief Marion Campbell to coach the team for the remainder of the season.

The move was not unexpected.

Van Brocklin, former Minnesota Vikings coach who took over the Falcons during the 1968 season, had incurred the wrath of Atlanta fans for the Falcons' poor offensive showing and of the local news media for his cur, often sarcastic interviews.

Smith, a multimillionaire insurance executive, had considered sacking Van Brocklin last year when the Falcons got off to a 1-3 start, but swung to his coach's side when Atlanta reeled off seven straight victories to move into contention for an NFL playoff berth.

The Falcons lost that berth because of late-season upsets by Buffalo and St. Louis. But their 9-5 record was their best in eight NFL seasons and they came into 1974 rated a playoff contender.

Instead, the Falcons lost their first three regular season games, rebounded briefly to beat the New York Giants and Chicago Bears, then lost their next three games.

The final blow was Sunday's game at Miami when the Dolphins, despite numerous injuries, humiliated the Falcons, 42-7.

Smith said Sunday that he might change coaches if he

had a replacement but insisted he didn't know where he would find a new coach at midseason.

Just Monday, Van Brocklin brushed aside the "Dump the Dutchman" campaign, saying, "the only man who can dump the Dutchman is Rankin Smith. He is the man who hired me."

But there was a feeling that Van Brocklin knew his days as coach of the Falcons were numbered. He lost his cool during his weekly news conference Monday and challenged the sports writers and sportscasters present to fight him.

The brawny coach got no takers.

There were reports of mutiny among the Falcons. Smith met with the players to discuss the problem and it was reported that running back Art Malone and wide receiver Al Dodd quit last week but were talked into returning by Van Brocklin President Frank Wall.

Van Brocklin blamed this year's 2-6 showing on the preseason strike and the attitude he said strike and other player demands had fostered. He accused his players of lacking in desire, of not having the "heart" he felt was needed to win.

Van Brocklin was a stern taskmaster. Players, fearful of fines or other reprisals, were reluctant to talk about him until after they left the team. But some of his former players complained Van Brocklin was quick with criticism and slow with praise.

Van Brocklin, a former All-Pro who went straight from quarterbacking the Philadelphia Eagles to head coach of

the Vikings in their first season, also had his troubles at Minnesota.

He was responsible for Fran Tarkenton, now again the Viking quarterback, being traded to the New York Giants, and, after earlier threatening to quit, was fired by the Vikings after the 1966 season.

Van Brocklin spent the 1967 season in the unlikely role of television color man, then returned to coaching in October, 1968, when he was hired by Smith who sacked Norb Hecker when the Falcons got off to an 0-4 start.

Atlanta wound up 2-12 that year and then went 6-9, 4-8, 7-6, 1-7 and 9-5 for a 33-34-2 total in five full seasons under Van Brocklin.

The 45-year-old Campbell, a tackle at the University of Georgia and for the 49ers and Eagles, was a teammate of Van Brocklin's at Philadelphia, was Van Brocklin's defensive chief three years at Minnesota, and rejoined him in Atlanta in 1969.

Campbell, who also coached defense at Boston and Los Angeles, built the Falcons' defensive unit into one of the best in the NFL.

It is anticipated that Smith will hire a "name" head coach to take over the team in 1975. In the meantime, Campbell has the task of pulling together a discouraged team that still has two games with the division-leading Rams (the first next Sunday at Los Angeles), and games with the Vikings, 49ers, Baltimore and Green Bay.

## Regional Center Approved Town Votes to Fill 'Missing Link'

Manchester voters decided overwhelmingly, 11,417 to 4,366 Tuesday to fill the town's "missing link" — a Regional Occupational Training Center for mentally retarded and multiply handicapped persons aged 14 to 21.  
Townpeople's approval of a \$1.4 million bond issue for the training center clears the way for construction of a 23,250-square-foot facility on a 2.2-acre site near Manchester Community College.  
Construction is expected to start next spring and the center is slated for opening in mid-1978.  
Norman Fendell, Manchester's special education supervisor who spearheaded the drive for the training center, said today Manchester is a leader in the field and the new training center will set an example for the entire state.  
"Tuesday's vote proves this town is extremely sensitive to these needs," Fendell said. "Manchester is a community with a heart."  
The few negative votes on the referendum question probably reflected a concern for inflation, Fendell said.  
Although the training center will cost \$1.4 million, the construction and equipment costs are fully reimbursable by the state. The only construction-related cost to Manchester will be a one-time expense of about \$60,000 which represents interest payments on short-term loans needed to finance construction until the state reimburses the money.  
Fendell said the next step, now that townspeople have approved the center, is to firm up arrangements with the state Department of Education. That is a lot of red tape to be taken care of, he said.  
The training center program, which will bring a \$25,000 addition to the Manchester school district annually, will include a food service laboratory, industrial laboratory, automotive training, maintenance training, occupational therapy, public health, recreation, and regular classroom instruction.  
Projected enrollment of the training center in its first year is 70 persons, half from Manchester and half from 15 surrounding towns which will pay tuition.

## Funds OKayed to Fix Storm Drain Problems

The \$2-million storm drainage appropriation approved Tuesday by Manchester voters will provide funds for correcting existing and potential flooding problems at 28 townwide locations.  
The referendum question won handily, 9,320 to 5,280, and carried in all 10 voting districts.  
The \$2-million appropriation will eliminate about 80 percent of Manchester's major storm drainage problems, Director of Public Works Jay Giles explained. He said the 28 separate projects will take about three years to complete and will be placed out for bid on

an area basis. The projects, he said, may require several contractors.  
Giles said each project will be coordinated with the previous one, as well as the next one. He said top priority may be given the White Brook-Lyall St. and Thompson Rd. areas.  
Part of the appropriation, he said, will pay for a townwide study of future storm-drainage needs.  
"Such a study," he explained, "will provide guidance to our public works department in the review of subdivision plans. We will attempt to provide for the adequate growth of the drainage system — to keep pace with the town's growth."

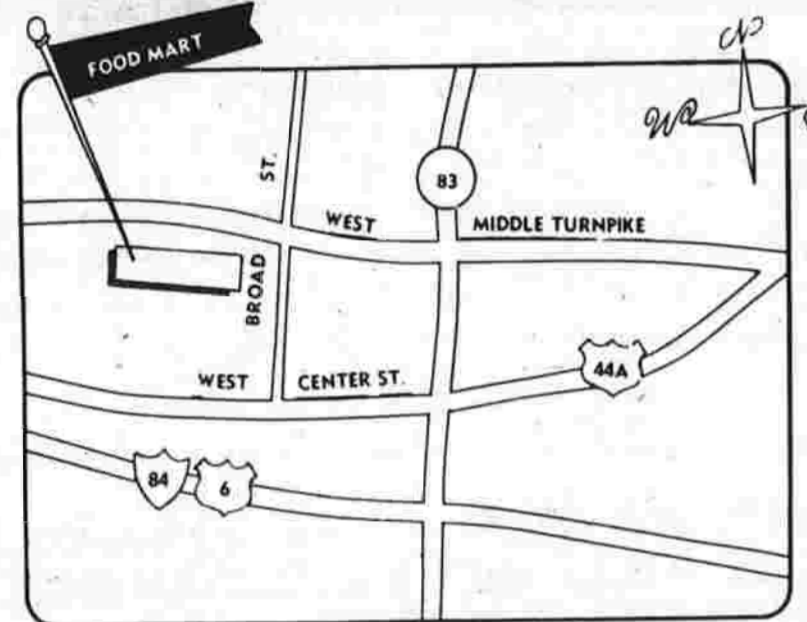

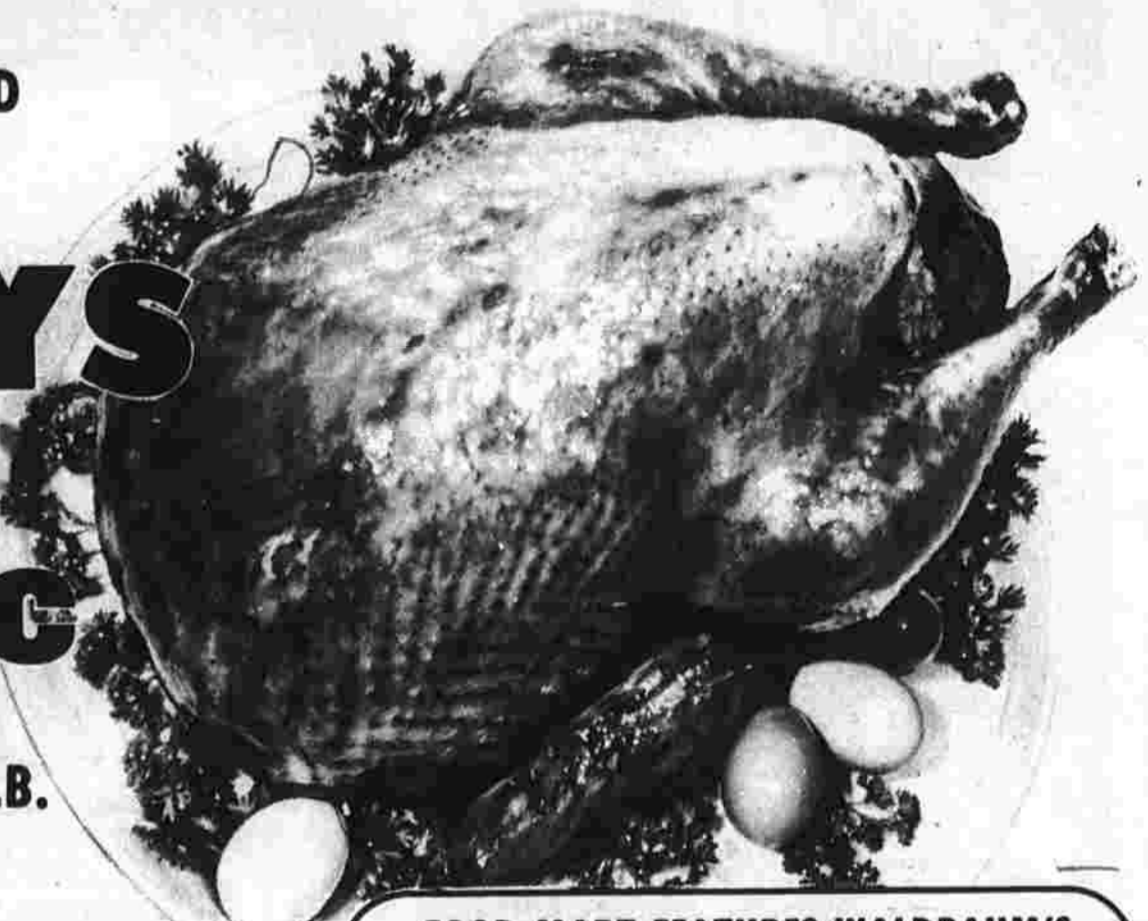

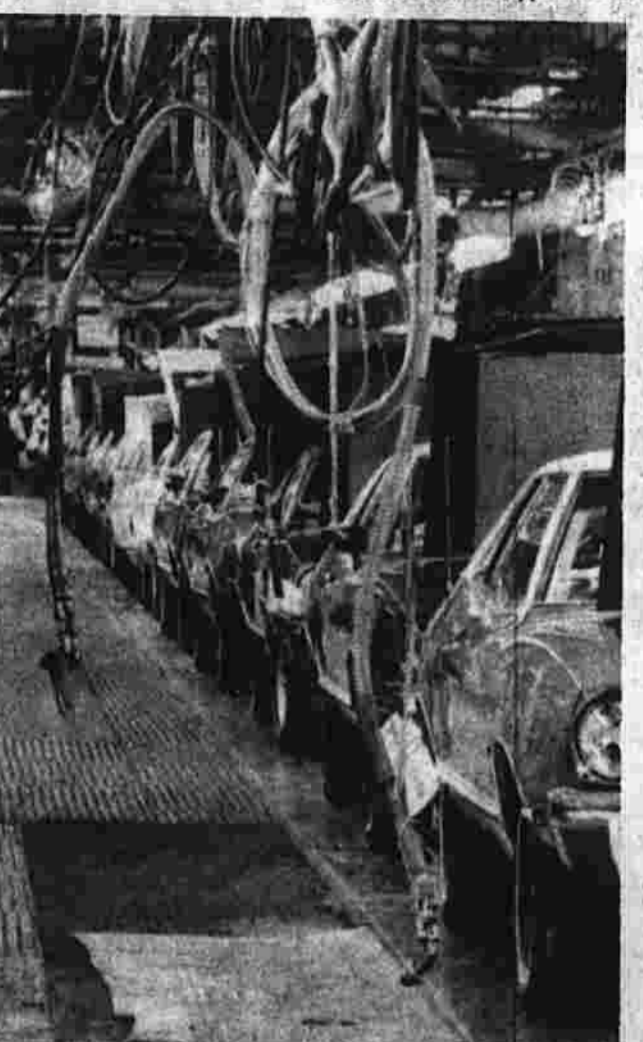

Many Injuries Stem From Home Blenders

By State Department Of Consumer Protection The electric blender, one of the more common appliances in the American kitchen, is estimated to be associated with more than 2,500 injuries treated in hospital emergency rooms each year.

Four out of five blender injuries involves the fingers while the remaining injuries in 98 reports received by the U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission were to the hand, head, lower arm, foot and toe. Eighty-one per cent of the blender-related injuries were lacerations. Other frequent injuries were bruises and fractures. Nearly three-quarters of the injuries reported were suffered by females. In the 98 reports analyzed, 24 cases involved contact with blades in which no product malfunction was reported. Forcing food down in the blender brought 14 victims' fingers in contact with blades, usually resulting in lacerations of one or more fingers. Five of these victims had fingertips or fingers amputated. Children playing with blenders produced their share of accidents. In one report, an 11-year-old boy was testing the strength of the motor by placing his fingers against the blade and turning the motor on. Several victims were injured when they used their fingers to try to free clogged blades. When the blades resumed operation they struck the victims' fingers.

Trade Act Violation Is Charged

An order has been secured by Consumer Protection Commissioner Barbara Dunn against an East Granby home improvements contractor charging the man with violation of the Connecticut Unfair Trade Practices Act.

Albert Zaccaro was the subject of a recent department complaint charging him with misrepresentations with respect to his business advertising and his guarantees.

As a result of a Consumer Protection Department hearing, Mrs. Dunn found Zaccaro in violation of the state law and issued an order that Zaccaro should cease and desist from representing that any work he may perform is guaranteed unless such is the fact and the exact terms of the guarantee are furnished to the customer.

Further, Zaccaro is directed to honor any guarantee against which he has received notice of a claim and that guarantees are not to be conditioned unless fully stated.

Should the contractor violate the terms of the order, the department is authorized to petition the Court of Common Pleas for an injunction restraining him from continuing violations.

### Chris Dodd Wins First Hurrah

NORWICH (UPI) — An old family in Connecticut and national politics won a first hurrah Tuesday night, Chris Dodd, 30-year-old son of the late Sen. Thomas J. Dodd, D-Conn., was elected to the U.S. House. The suspense of waiting for election results was nothing young Dodd could not handle. He knew how his dad would have acted.

"He was always very calm," said the young lawyer from North Stonington. "You just have to wait it out," he said as the vote cascaded in on the Democratic tide.

Dodd beat the Republican rival, Sen. Sam Heller, R-Mystic, by 34,000 votes, 103,348 to 69,348. He will represent the 6th towns in eastern Connecticut's 2nd District.

With the votes of all but a handful of Connecticut's 169 communities repaired, Democrats won control of the Connecticut House delegation, 42-41.

### Salmon Re-Elected In Vermont

MONTPELIER, Vt. (UPI) — Democrats have turned the tables in Republican Vermont — electing their first U.S. senator and handing Gov. Thomas P. Salmon a cakewalk second term.

Republicans did retain Vermont's only U.S. House seat and control of the state legislature to avert Democratic sweep.

Of the five State House offices below governor on the ballot, Democrats captured three — attorney general, lieutenant governor and treasurer — while Republicans held on to the secretary of state and auditor of public accounts offices.

Dodd, who works in former Acting FBI Director L. Patrick Gray's New London law firm, bid hard at inflation and the need to protect jobs in the district's biggest employer is the shipyard at Groton. Radio commercials told listeners he would protect those jobs in Washington.

And when he rests up a bit, Dodd said Tuesday night, "I'm going to start right in."

**THE FAMILY LAWYER**  
Church Feud

Two factions of a church were locked in a bitter struggle over the powers of a controversial minister. Finally they took the issue to court for settlement.

But the judge refused to take sides. Calling attention to the constitutional separation of church and state, the judge said:

"Courts do not inquire into questions exclusively ecclesiastical. If the courts should deal with litigation of that nature, the whole subject of theology would have to be examined. Such a course would establish the courts as the final arbiter in every religious controversy."

This is the law's usual attitude toward religious disputes, declining to intrude into "things that are God's." However, the courts can and do take a hand in "things that are Caesar's."

For example, in one case a pastor had a disagreement with his church about the terms of his employment contract. A court had no hesitation in weighing the opposing arguments and in ruling (on strictly legal grounds) against the church.

Likewise, courts have dealt with such mundane matters as the ownership of church real estate or the administration of trust funds left to a church.

Furthermore, of course, churchmen are just as subject to the criminal law as any other citizen.

A minister, while denouncing sin in his sermon, described it in unusually vivid language. Outraged members of his congregation complained to the police, and the minister was duly haled into court on a charge of using obscene language in a public place.

Finding him guilty, the court commented:

"He has a right to propagate his religious views, but will not be permitted to commit a breach of the peace under the guise of preaching the gospel."

The increase raised the enrollment of minority students statewide from 24,241 to 28,416, while over-all pupil enrollment increased 3.3 per cent. The non-minority enrollment increased only 4 per cent over the five-year period, the department said.

The department said as of 1973, minority enrollment was 13.6 per cent of the statewide pupil population of 62,890.

During the five-year period, Spanish surnamed pupils increased 22.9 per cent from 15,977 to 24,423 and black pupils increased 17 per cent from 52,488 to 61,492.

The department said that nearly 90 per cent of the minority group pupils were enrolled in 24 of the state's 163 districts while nine school districts reported no minority group enrollments.

Soft sewn sculpture and ceramics will be on display Friday night when the Stairwell Gallery of Manchester Community College, 146 Hartford Rd., opens a one-woman exhibition by Adele Broitman of Bloomfield.
