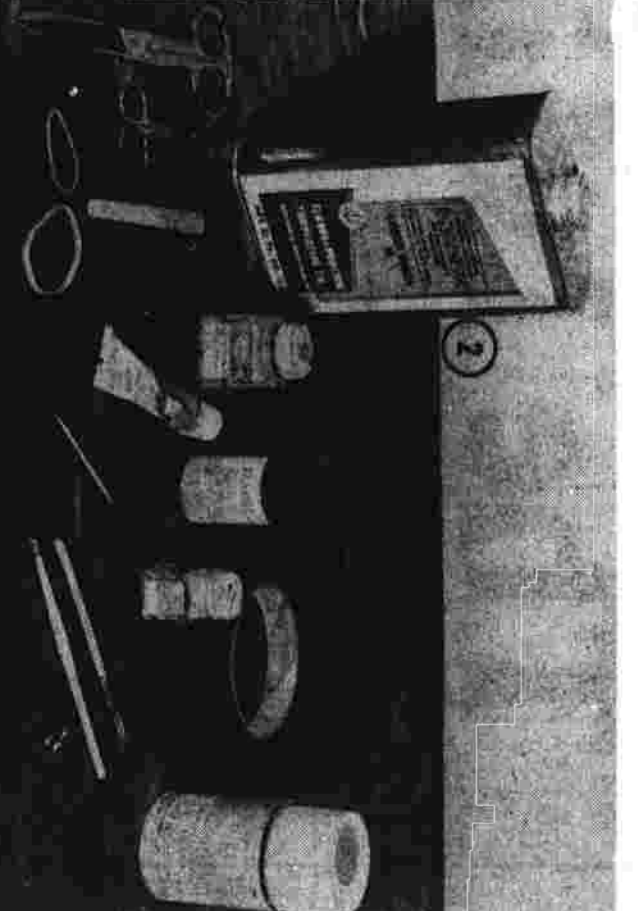
Cards Sales Help Children

7. A liquid to make your decals stick. (Not necessary, but nice.)

9. Masking tape to use when covering parts you don't want painted.
10. Bottled or spray paint.
11. A stick for stirring the paint.
12. A brush for painting.

Christmas Tree Decoration

1. Fold the paper in half. Draw a U shape on the fold. Cut it out. Draw a little U shape in the middle of the fold. Cut it out.
2. Cut the smaller U shape apart and fold and bend the two pieces down to make wings.
