

Lake Residents Protest Excavation of Island

The commission will make an on-site inspection Wednesday morning at 9:30. Letters were read from the Soil Conservation Service and the Conservation Commission which stated that the island shouldn't have been built in the first place and there would be no problems with it. The commission granted approval to Connecticut Light and Power Co. to replace poles in their existing right-of-way. John Ryan, a resident of Coventry and an engineer for the power company, told the commission that the line was built in 1927 and the life expectancy of the poles was only 35 years so it was time to replace the whole line. The right-of-way runs up Flinders Rd and across land to the junction of Snake Hill and Rt. 31 where it branches to two lines, one going to the Mansfield subdivision and the other up to Stonehouse Rd. and School Rd. to Root Rd. No roads would be built into the area and existing roadways would be used for the project, which is expected to take until late spring.

The commission instructed Wheeler to conduct a survey of seasonal dwellings in the lake area and to record how many of these homes were being used as year-round dwellings in violation of the zoning regulations. Wheeler is to report back to the commission next month. The commission voted to send a letter to Jim Moore, commission representative to the Windham Regional Planning agency, and to invite him to attend the next meeting of the commission to discuss his appointment. The commission had received a letter from the town council asking that they reconsider their appointment in light of the attendance record at the regional meetings.

Ruth Smith, a resident, spoke in Moore's favor, saying that she had contacted several agencies and that she had been told by the State that the project was not to be completed until the late spring. The commission could insist that the island should be rebuilt or halt and further work on the site permanently or permit the project to be finished.

State Commission Probes Nursing Home Finances

By JUAN TAMAYO HARTFORD (UPI) — A West Haven nursing home involved in a complicated series of mortgages arranged for the firm since 1960, has come under examination by state officials concerned over whether operators are reaping illegal profits from the elderly.

James Whitten, chairman of the Connecticut Hospitals and Health Care Commission, led the questioning Monday as the state regulatory agency traced family trees and financial transactions.

Questioned at length was Julius Czermack, secretary of the Breakers Nursing Home Inc., who said one of its owners was Ben Zion Frankel of New York.

Frankel was recently identified by the New York Times as the brother-in-law of Bernard Bergman, whose vast nursing home empire in New York is under investigation for possible welfare fraud.

Connecticut officials want to find out if financial manipulations were used to inflate the homes' costs on paper, used by the commission to establish rates allowing for 10-15 per cent profits above costs.

"If the facility is used as a subterfuge to increase costs then it is deleterious to the patients and their pocket-books," Whitten said, and a violation of the commission's regulations.

He said he had no proof that was the case with Breakers. "We did not inflate anything," Czermack told the commission.

Czermack's attorney, Stephen E. Ronai, of Milford, labeled Whitten's questioning

"a red herring," and added, "You are trying to inject the character of the New York investigation into these investigations."

The costs taken into consideration by the commission include interests on mortgages and salaries. Whitten said about \$3 of the \$23 Breakers charged per day per patient was going to "corporate salaries." This does not include staff wages.

Czermack testified that he, Frankel and Frankel's wife, Clara, are also officials of Mil-Nor Properties, which owns the Pond Point Skilled Nursing Facility in Milford.

He also said he recently bought the Westview Convalescent Center in Dayville.

Whitten said Breakers had gotten a number of mortgages since 1960, when it was bought for \$129,000 by the Frankel interests from Ralph L. Carbone, of New Haven, and Frank L. Amarante, of Hamden.

On the day of the sale Frankel also took out a \$60,000 loan from Carbone and Amarante, at 6 per cent interest a year, Whitten said.

On Sept. 29, 1963, Breakers paid off that loan and took out a \$94,000 mortgage from the National Savings Bank of New Haven, he said. It was to pay it back in 10 years at 6 per cent annual interest.

The mortgage was paid on July 21, 1965, and again on the same day Breakers got another mortgage from the bank, this time \$108,000 at 6 per cent a year for 10 years, Whitten said.

Only two months later the interest rate doubled to 12 per cent when the Small Business Investment Co. of Bridgeport — which reportedly has made

loans to some of the seven other Bergman-linked nursing homes in Connecticut — loaned Breakers \$29,000 for five years, Whitten said.

He said on April 8, 1971, on the same day Breakers paid off the \$29,000, the Bridgeport firm loaned Breakers another \$45,000 at 12 per cent for five years.

On Sept. 11, 1972, Breakers obtained another mortgage for \$100,000, this time for three years at 14 per cent interest. The money was provided by the Machsikal Torah Institute and Congregation Beth Pincus, of Brookline, Mass.

The institute is an Orthodox rabbinical school and temple. Bergman and Frankel are both rabbis.

On the same day Breakers paid off \$40,408 on the \$108,000 mortgage obtained in July, 1965, from the National Savings Bank and part of the \$29,000 loan from the Bridgeport firm.

Czermack drew a ripple of laughter at the hearing when Whitten asked him what all those loans had gone for and he answered, "For a number of things."

The only loan he was asked about in detail was the one from Machsikal, which he said went to pay expenses at the Pond Point home.

Czermack said the interest on the Machsikal loan was not being borne by Breakers and so it was not artificially pushing up Breakers' operating costs and its rates for patients.

The hearing, originally meant to discuss Breakers' proposal for a \$1.1 million, 50-bed addition to the nursing home, was recessed until Breakers' fiscal officer appears before the commission.

Worker Caused Own Death
A 36-year-old South Windsor man killed in an industrial accident Tuesday at Manchester Structural Steel Inc. has been blamed for his own death, Manchester Police said today.

Police said their investigation showed that the man, Aubrey E. Noyes of 44 Farnham Rd., caused his own death by a reckless act.

Noyes was working with a mechanical hoist at the Mitchell Dr. firm Tuesday morning when the accident occurred, police said. He was lifting a huge, steel I-beam with the hoist when he ducked under it and the improperly fastened beam fell.

The I-beam — 31 feet long and weighing about 1,200 pounds — fell on Noyes, police said, causing massive head injuries.

Noyes was pronounced dead on arrival at Manchester Memorial Hospital at about 11 a.m. by Dr. Robert Keeney, medical examiner. No autopsy was necessary, Dr. Keeney told police. The state Labor Department was notified of the fatal accident.

Mr. Noyes was born in Hartford and had lived in East Hartford before moving to South Windsor three years ago. He had been employed as a welder at Manchester Structural Steel, Inc. for about two weeks.

She said a meeting is planned within the next few weeks between Robert Taylor, head of state DEP, and town officials to resolve the sewage disposal problems.

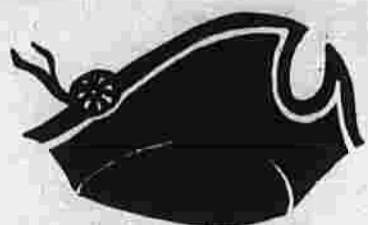

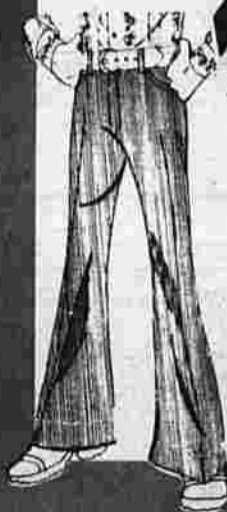

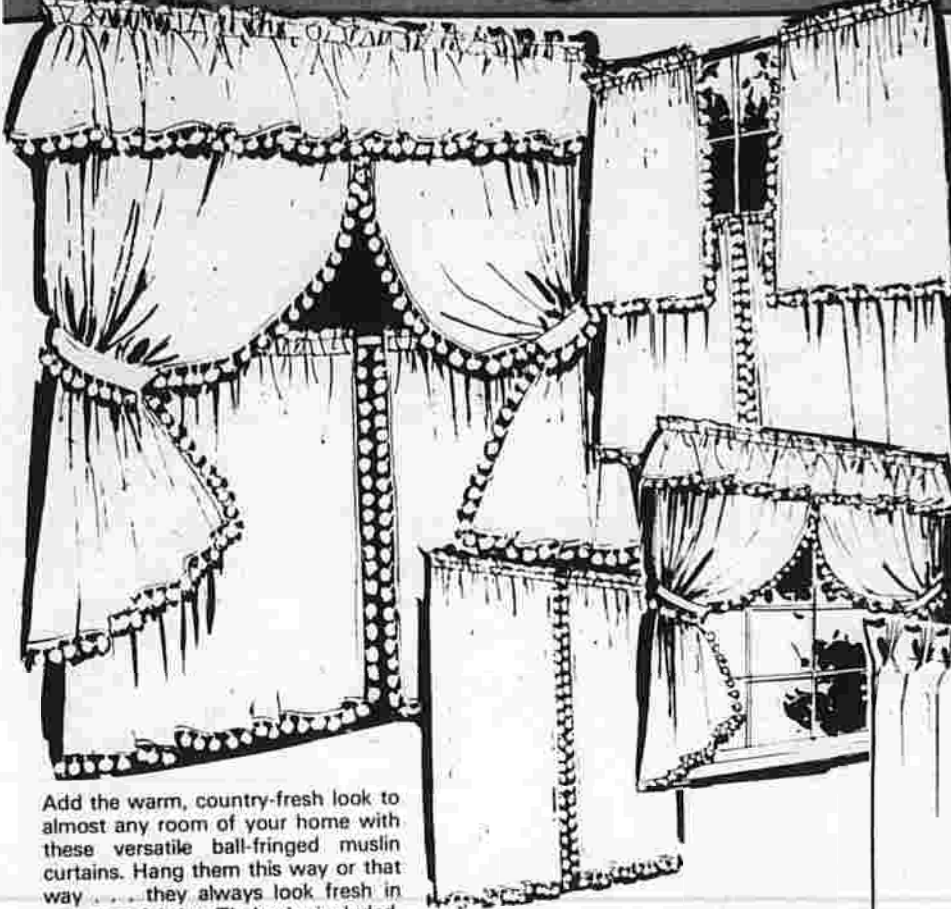
