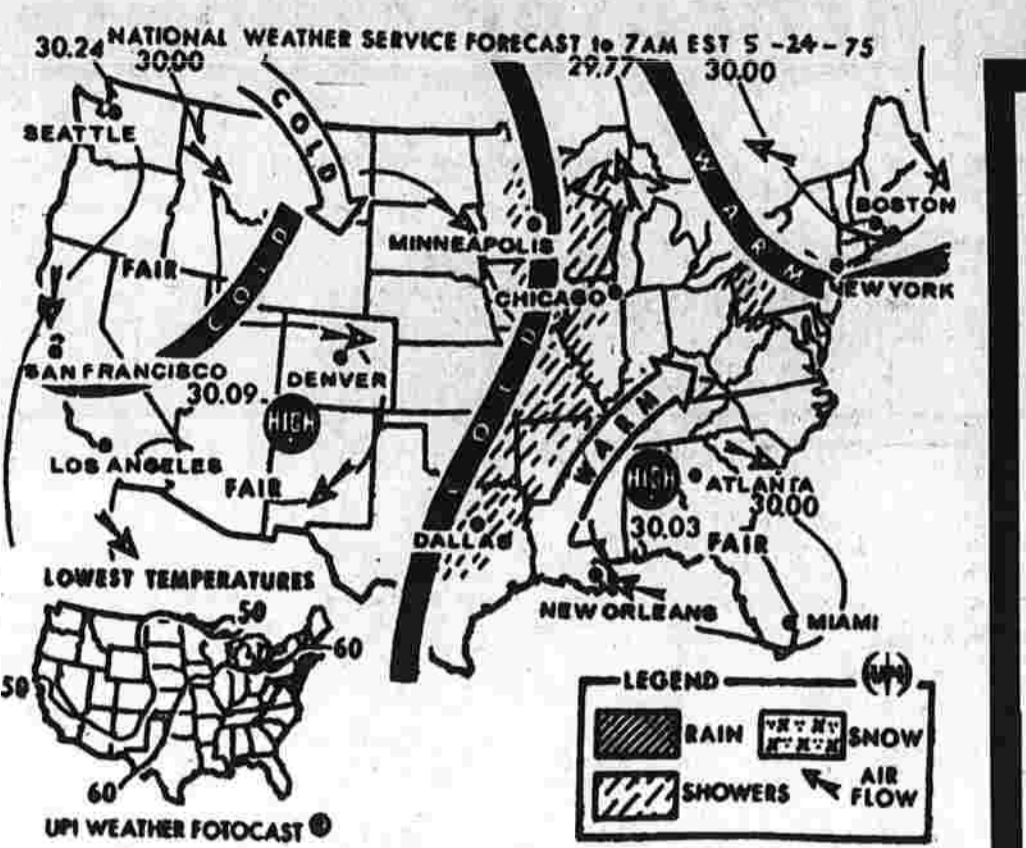

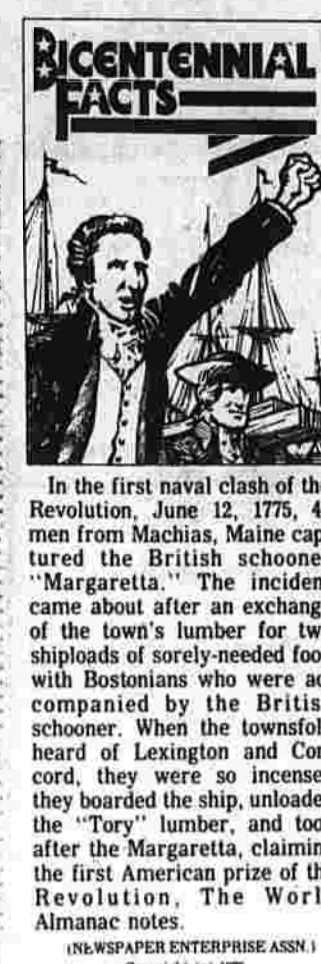

Golden Anniversary as Golfer

Earl Ballsieper's Feats:

President's Cup...Club Championship...Governor's Cup...Seniors' Championship.

Name a major tournament at the Manchester Country Club and on the plaque noting the individual winners by year you will find the name Earl Ballsieper.

Ballsieper, who will note his 83rd birthday July 12, is the only man in the membership who can lay claim to having won every major championship at least once.

The retired Cheney Brothers' employe, a cracker-jack athlete in his younger days, still plays golf, five days a week — Monday thru Friday, and weekends can be found at Acky Torza's driving range in Ellington hitting a few balls.

Hole-in-ones are also the dream of every golfer and Ballsieper, who has played

the sport for 50 years, can also look back on scoring one ace, the eighth at the local course. Ballsieper has been a local club member since 1926, thus this is his golden anniversary.

Ellington Aids Diabetic Fund

Ballsieper's conquests on the golf course includes two coveted Club championships, two President's Cups, a pair of Governor's Cups, two Two Ball Club titles, one Seniors' crown and one Calcutta title.

The hole-in-one came in 1963, 37 years after he took up the sport after starring in football and basketball with local schoolboy and amateur teams. He helped the 1910-11 South Manchester High School basketball team win the State championship.

The man who has notched an unprecedented "grand slam" in golf accomplishments at MCC has often called the club his second home.

Jeff Koelsch Course Ranger

Now in his fourth season as course ranger at the Manchester Country Club is Albert "Jeff" Koelsch.

Retired from Hamilton Standard in Windsor Locks, Koelsch has been closely connected with sports in the Manchester-Rockville area for 30 years. Since his arrival at MCC, golf play has speeded up considerably. He may be seen daily in his special ranger golf cart patrolling the area wearing a plastic protective helmet.

Ellington Ridge Country Club will host the annual Assistant Pro Championship Sept. 26. Assistant pros from Connecticut and western Massachusetts holding PGA membership will be eligible.

Tremendous Play At Country Club

"Tremendous, just tremendous, has been the volume of golf play this spring at the Manchester Country Club," Alex Hackney, head pro said, as he watched a half dozen foursomes waiting to tee off. "There has been more play than ever this season," he added.

There are no slow days. Play during the week is nearly as heavy as on weekends.

One wonders who is working these days after looking over the traffic on the course in age ranging from schoolboys to retired swingers, also known as the Geritol Set.

The Country Club is now in its 58th year, and Hackney has been head pro for the past 27 years. First assistant is Ralph DeNicolò, a familiar figure for the past decade, and Tom Voets handles the pro shop.

"The course is in excellent shape," Hackney said and

the man who rates a salute is greenskeeper Ken Keliher. The latter has performed like a magician overseeing a competent crew.

Numerous major physical improvements have been made to the course, es-

pecially in the past three years, and today it is an attractive, well-groomed 18-hole championship course.

The all-time course record low score is 63 credited to Ron "Red" Smith, a local man, now a head pro in Maine and a veteran of play on the rugged PGA circuit. Smith turned in 63 cards on two occasions.

Seventeen years ago, golfing under the stars was introduced to Manchester and area players when Connecticut Golf Land opened on July 4, 1958.

More popular than ever is the par three, 18-hole layout in Talcottville. The course was the state's first 18-hole floodlight short hole facility.

In addition to the par three layout, a miniature 18-hole course is available, and this too, has proven to be most popular, especially with the younger set and families.

While aces are the exception rather than the rule at regulation 18-hole courses, these feats are quite common at Golf Land. Greens are three-quarters regulation size and local rules limit a player to not more than six strokes. Caddies and carts are not necessary as each

player uses an iron and a putter.

The course can be completed in one hour and many golfers take a long lunch break and enjoy a noon round.

Public Course Promise Kept by Owner Clark

Just over a quarter century ago, 26 years to be exact, the currently popular Minnechaug public golf course was a dairy farm just over the Manchester town line in Glastonbury.

Today the 130-acre tract is one of the most heavily played courses in Connecticut. Clark's early ambition was someday to own a golf course. He vowed if this ever happened, it would remain public. The promise has been kept.

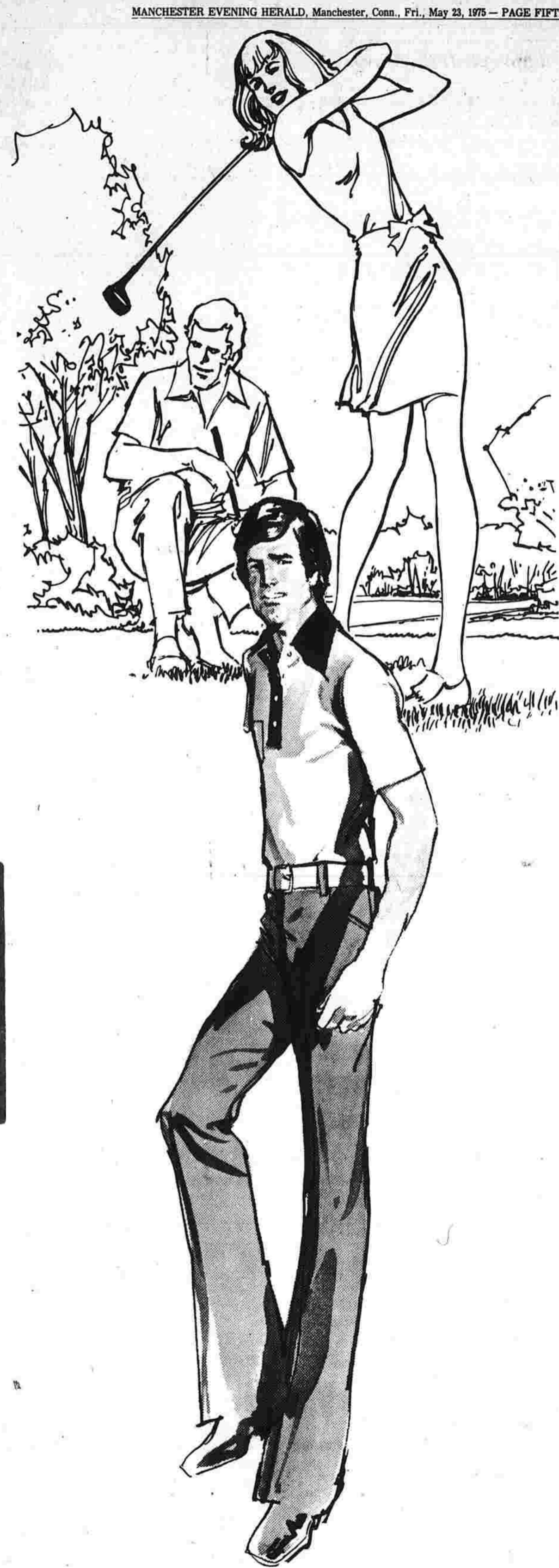

Reservations Weekend Must

Try to get on a golf course on the weekend without a reservation. It's virtually impossible. Golf has grown with leaps and bounds for the past decade and there is no telling when the peak will be reached for both players and courses.

More than 11,000,000 golfers played 15 or more rounds in 1974. About \$4 billion is invested in golf facilities. Sale of equipment by U.S. manufacturers last year exceeded \$350,000,000.

Aces Tough At Ellington

Holes-in-one are the goals of all golfers and one of the toughest courses in the state - perhaps even the toughest - is at Ellington Ridge. Last year there wasn't a single ace recorded. To date, no golfer has been able to have his or her ball drop in the cup on the first shot.

Explanations

BEST BALL - One plays his ball against the better score (by holes) or the best score of three players.

FOUR BALL - Two partners each play their own ball, but only the better score on each hole counts.

BLIND BOGEY - When signing up the player chooses a handicap which he feels will assure a net score between 70 and 80. After play is completed, the committee puts the numbers 70 to 90 in a hat and draws the winning number. The player whose net score is closest to that number wins.

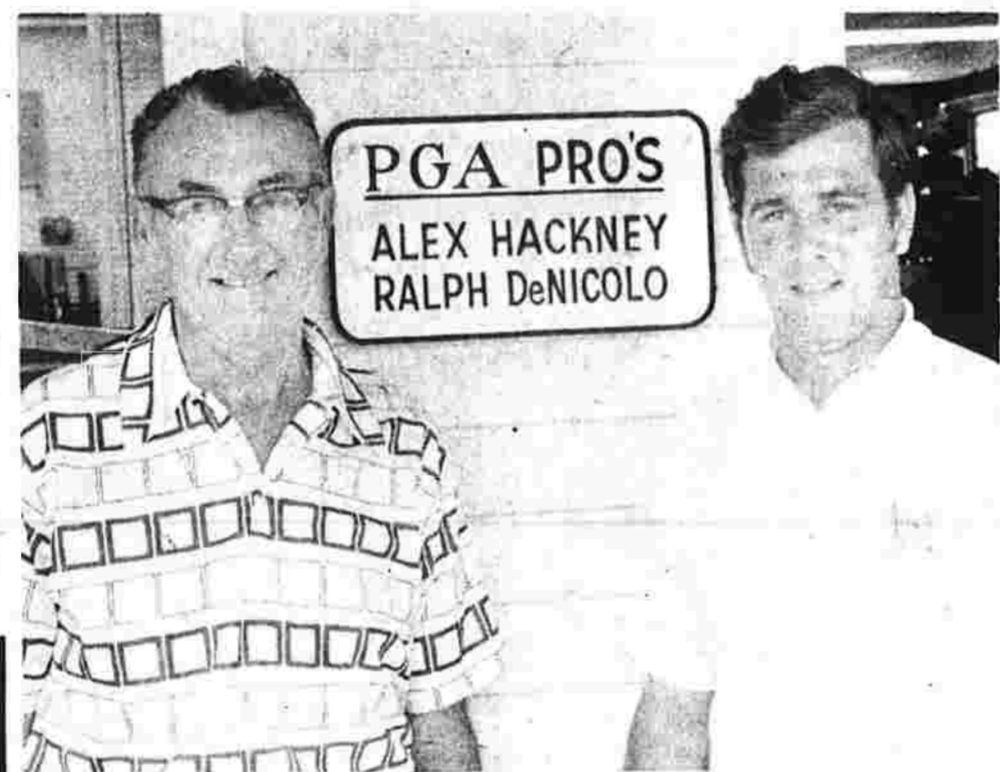
Carts Play Big Part

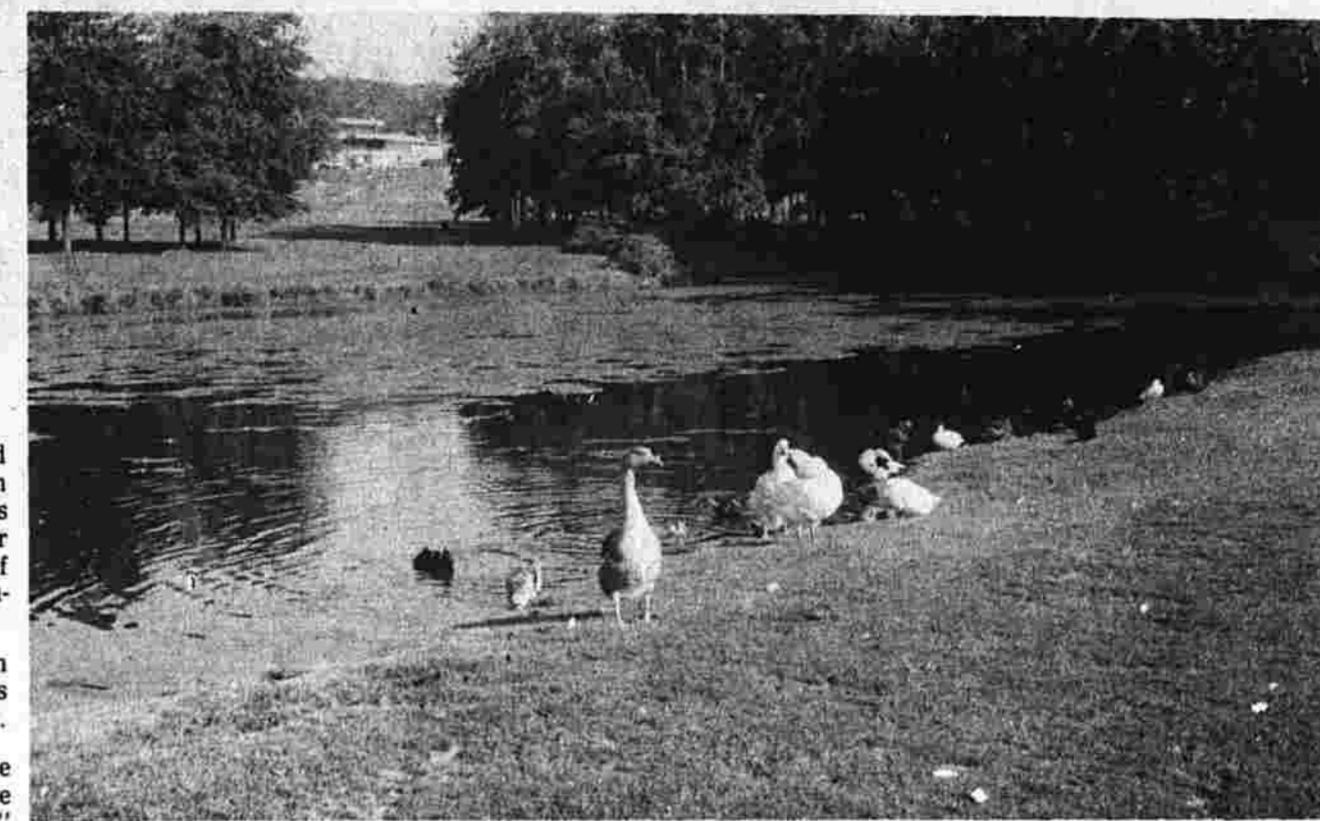

"We want people to come back, and they do. Either Mike or I are around every day. If a golfer has a problem, he can come to us and we'll have the answer. 'We feel that the owner working closely with the player makes for a better situation all around.' Karney said of his immaculately groomed course. 'Golfers are basically happier when they know that we are out here looking after our best interests, as well as theirs,' Mike said.

The brothers pointed out that the tree-lined fairways was a big plus as a safety factor. 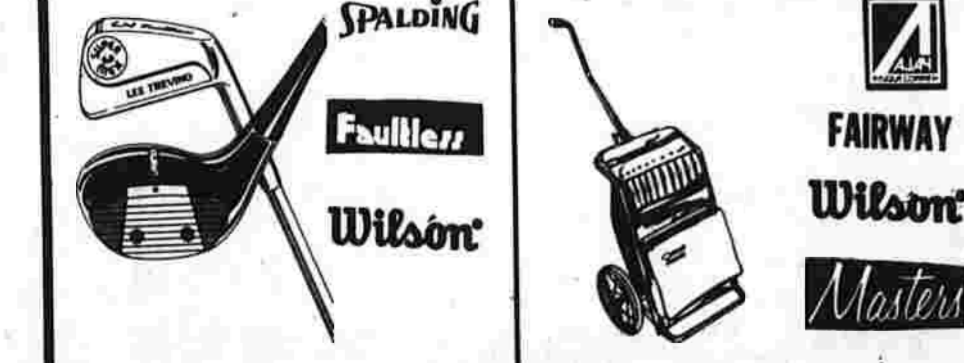

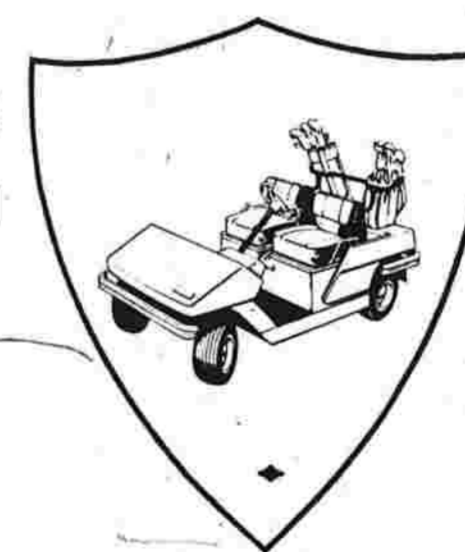
