

Would Women End War?

"Few little girls settle children's quarrels with a fist fight," said Sherry Chenoweth of Minneapolis.

So she said women should have the chance to become world leaders and put an end to war.

"Women haven't had the opportunity to run the world. The jury is still out," said the woman who is Minnesota state director of consumer services. "There's no question historically that men have made a mess of governing and women should be given a chance to gain access to power centers."

"Give us a chance."

The wives of the leaders of Israel and Egypt believe there would be no more wars if women ran the world.

"Can you imagine battalions of women fighting among themselves?" said Mrs. Lea Rabin, wife of the Israeli prime minister. Mrs. Ghan Sadat, wife of the Egyptian president, said wars would end only "when women occupy the key posts."

Mrs. Rabin and Mrs. Sadat made their comments at the World Conference of International Women's Year, which opened today in Mexico City.

American women contacted at random in a national survey by United Press International said they weren't sure they could bring about world peace. But they would like the chance to try.

"Women are more attuned to keeping harmony," said New York City Police Lt. Mary Keefe, 45. "They've been doing it for years in family life. It probably would be a better world."

"Women certainly have no corner on the market where doing right is concerned," said Cynthia Vande, 37, director of the University of Pittsburgh women's center. "But if women have and take the opportunity to really develop their own abilities, rather than copying men's way of running the world, I think that a more peaceful world would be possible."

Cynthia Powers, 29, a Baltimore librarian, said "women are not as violent as men. Jacquelin Wexler, 48, president of Hunter College in New York City, disagrees.

"I think if women look at some of the violent revolutionary movements in the very recent years, we certainly have seen as much violence from young women as men," she said.

Esther Saperstein, 72, Chicago alderwoman and former state senator, said Israel did go to war under Prime Minister Golda Meir. But she said "women are less apt to resort to wars to settle problems. I don't think women think in terms of war."

Joyce Ferguson of West Memphis, Ark., the state's only woman mayor, believes cooperation is the answer. "Men and women have to work together for peace. We must love one another."

"I'm really not in favor of women running the world, and I'm not in favor of men running the world," said Erma Greenwood, 58, a Knoxville, Tenn., attorney. "I'm in favor of a partnership between men and women. And that goes for everything—business, politics, the home."

Dzen Low Bidder On Four Projects

The A. Dzen Construction Co. of Manchester is the apparent low bidder for each of four storm drainage projects planned by the Town of Manchester.

A total of 15 bidders submitted prices for the work, with some bidding on only one project, some on two, some on three, and several on all four. Dzen's bids are \$21,366 for storm sewers at the intersection of Woodland, Hilliard and Duval Sts.; \$14,646 for one on Hill St.; including a right-of-way at the Manchester-East Hartford town line; \$7,047 for a sewer on Adelaide Rd.; and \$88,084 for storm drainage on Keeney St., from Polly Brook to north of Santa Dr.

Other Manchester bidders, but not low, were the Jarvis Construction Co., T.J. O'Brien and Glen Construction, each for only one or another of the four projects.

DCA Promises to Act On New Housing Soon

The state Department of Community Affairs (DCA) has promised action on preliminary plans for elderly housing in Manchester by the end of the month, Pascal Mastrangelo, chairman of the Manchester Housing Authority, said today.

The plans for 40 units of housing on Spencer St. were resubmitted to the DCA earlier this month, with slight changes after the first set of plans were rejected.

"If everything goes well," Mastrangelo said, "the project should be ready for people to move in next spring." There are about 185 eligible persons on the housing authority's waiting list, authority members were told Wednesday night.

The DCA acts favorably on the preliminary plans, architect Dominic Cimino will proceed with basic plans, seek state approval, then final plans, seek state approval and the project will be ready to go out to bid.

"We're trying to push the DCA to act quickly," Mastrangelo said, noting that the DCA, like other state agencies, has suffered staff cutbacks. The DCA is the administrator of a \$640,000 state grant which will pay for the Manchester housing project.

In his new post, Higgins is responsible for the authority's multi-million-dollar programs of aiding business and industry.

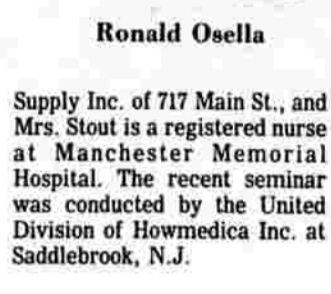

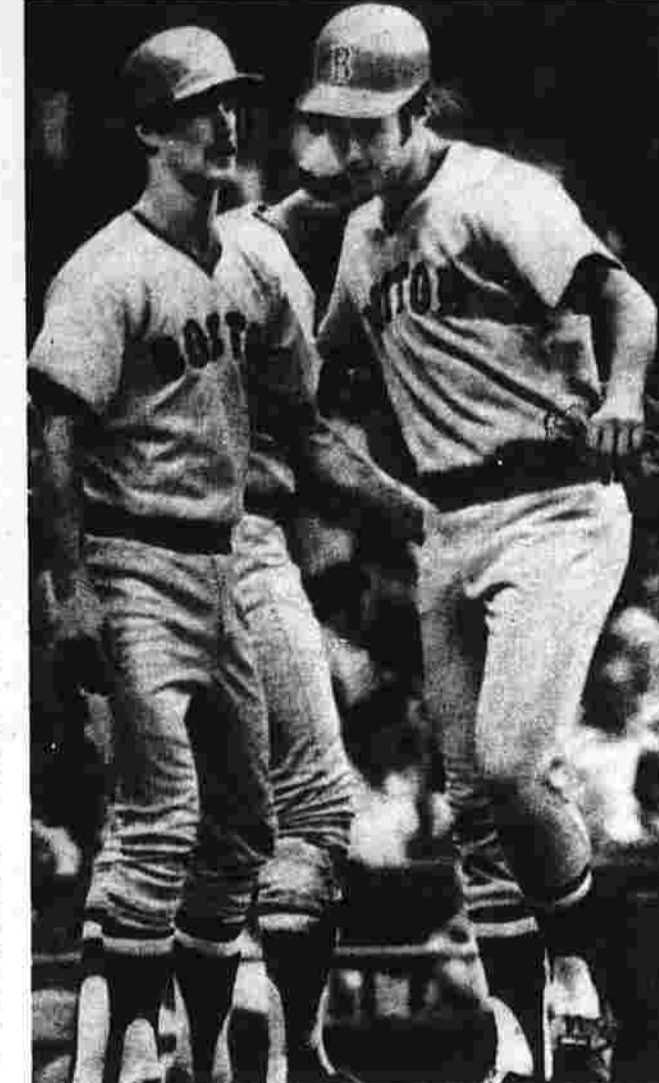

\$200 Fee Voted For Tax Board

After three months of almost seven-day-a-week work on the controversial 1975 assessments, the South Windsor Board of Tax Review (BTR) has been given some money by the Town Council for its efforts—\$200 for each of the three men.

At a recent meeting, the council debated whether or not to grant some sort of financial token of thanks to the three-man board after two of the rooms members actually left their jobs in April in order to handle many of the almost 500 appeals submitted by disgruntled residents protesting assessments.

Initially, a resolution called for the expenditure of \$400 for each man. However, Town Councilman Ed Havens opposed to "setting a precedent" convinced the council that the expense was unwarranted, despite Havens' "deep gratitude" for the work the men did.

As a compromise, the council decided to split the difference and agreed "revaluation comes only once every ten years."

Normally the Board of Tax Review meets in the month of March to discuss what are generally mundane complaints pertaining to home and property assessments.

This year however, following revaluation by United Appraisal of East Hartford, assessments soared as much as 200 per cent in some cases.

So too, did the number of complaints filed with the BTR soar.

For the first time ever, the BTR had to receive special approval from the General Assembly granting it an extension of time into May. When their work was done, the new Grand List had increased by 75 million.

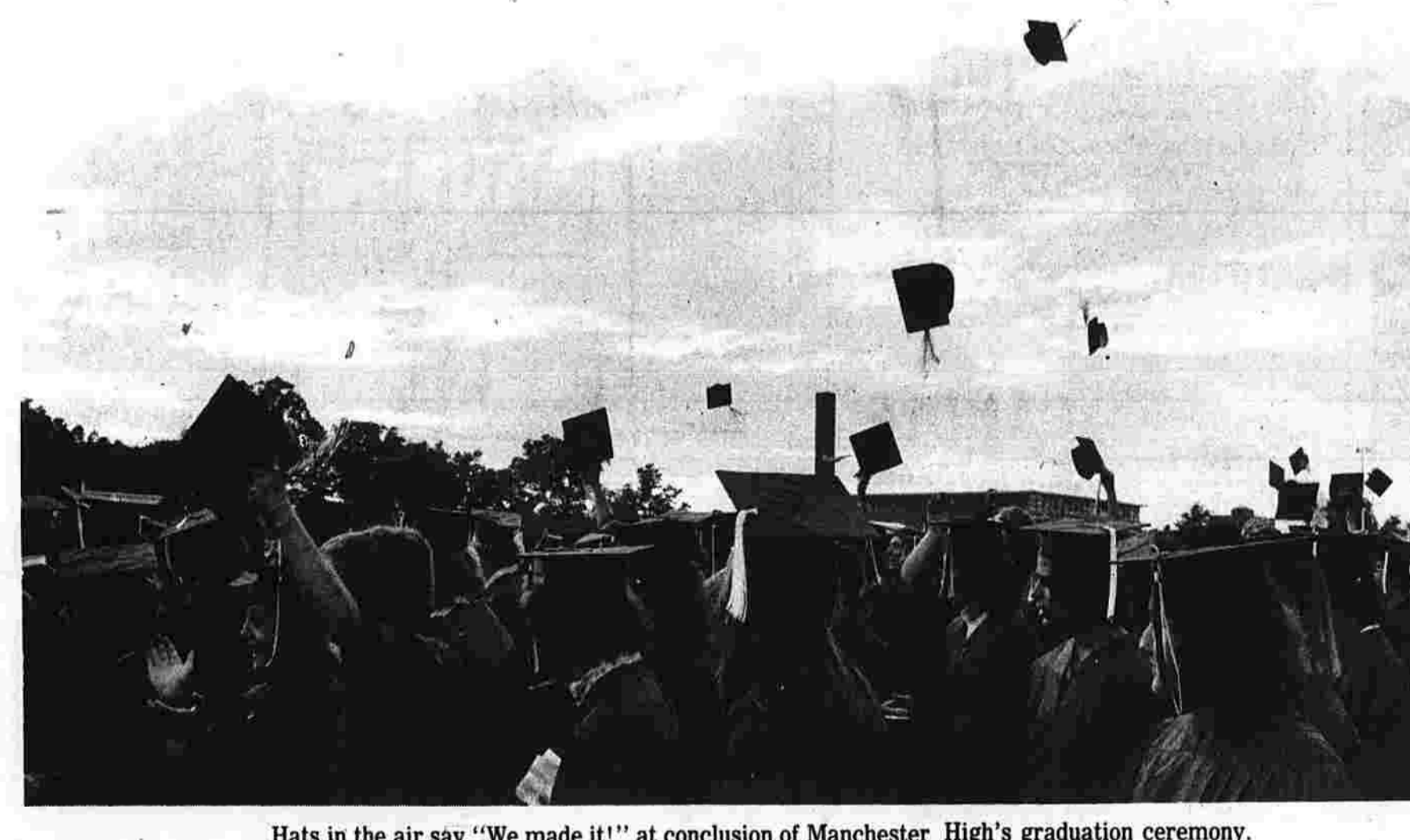

Energy Bill Said Useless

WASHINGTON (UPI) — The House has ended two weeks of floor debate by passing a bill aimed at reducing oil consumption by setting import quotas, penalizing wasteful users and giving tax breaks to those who save fuel.

The bill was passed and sent to the Senate Thursday on a nearly party line vote of 281 to 120. The measure would: Set oil import quotas at about the present level.
