WASHINGTON - Don't trust the latest predictions on what's next with prices, jobs or the economy generally. There's no evidence today's forecasts are better than the predictions which

preceded the 1974-75 recession. Government and academic economists have not yet done the research necessary to achieve better measuring sticks. Methods are being changed, but there is little assurance the shifts will make forecasts much more reliable. All that is certain is that some of the new formulas, in full swing, would have predicted the sad shape of the economy more quickly and

But it is relatively easy to build a model which predicts the past precisely. Any economist worth his salt can keep jiggering with his equations and the data elects until they match last year's curve.
