Struvite not glass in some canned

Those little crystal-like particles sometimes found in canned seafood, especially shrimp, may be glass but examination usually reveals it is not.

From time to time both industry and the Food and Drug Administration receive reports from consumers who believe they've found glass in canned seafood.

According to the FDA, examination usually reveals it isn't glass at all but "struvite" — crystalline magnesium am-



monium phosphate to the chemist — which occasionally forms in canned seafood from normally present constituents. While struvite isn't actually desirable, it doesn't affect the safety of the food at all.

If after testing, you are convinced it is glass, contact the Food and Drug Administration and inform them of your findings.

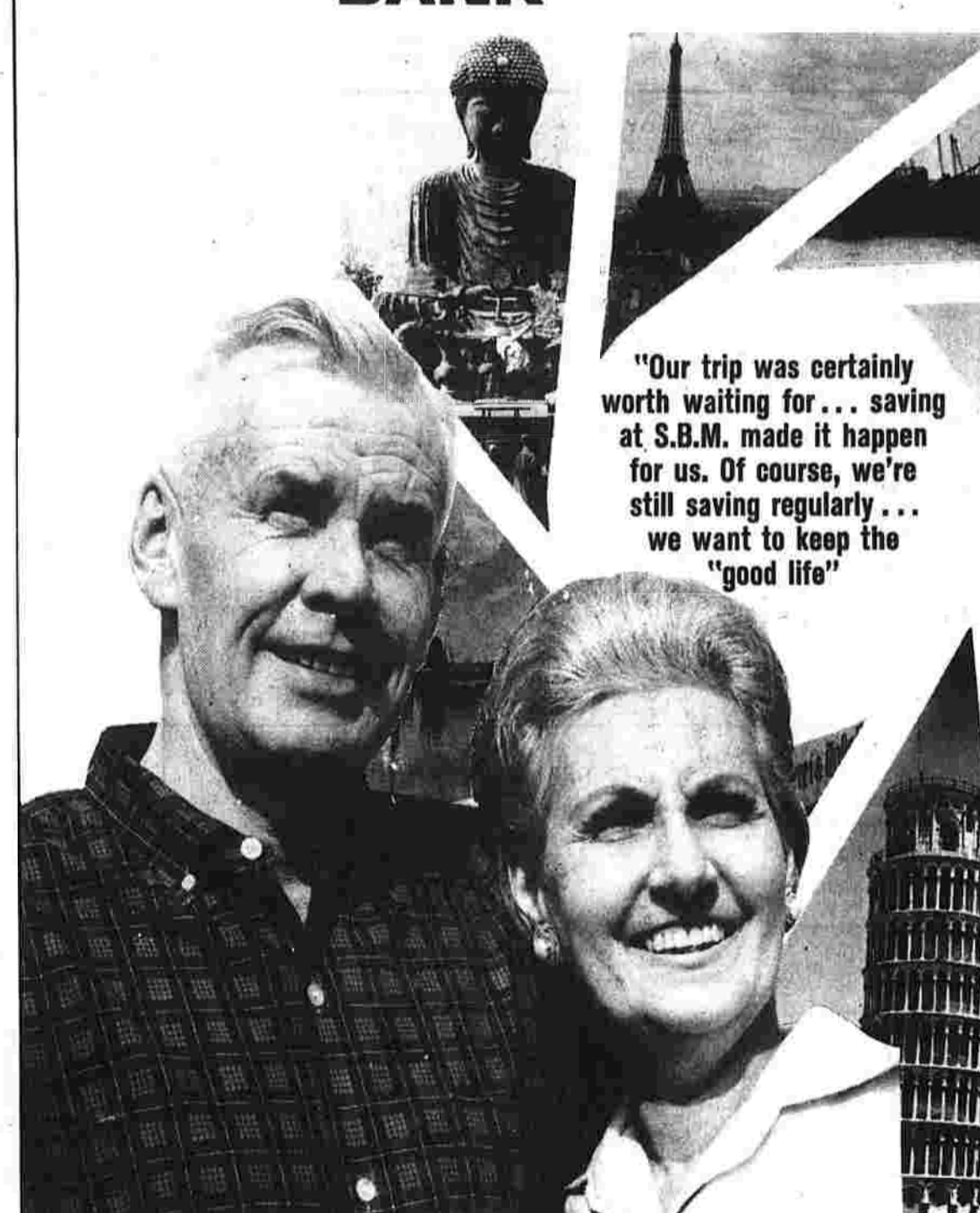
Seafood canners have devoted considerable attention to the problem of struvite formation but still haven't been able to prevent it.

If you happen to find a hard, clear crystalline bit of material in canned seafood, there is a simple test to help consumers distinguish between struvite and glass.

Place the material in warm vinegar for a while. The struvite crystal will dissolve; the glass will not.

Further newsprint shortages forecast

Cheap newspapers have long been a way of life in developed countries, but the events of the past two years have made publishers think seriously about their future.

With the world consuming newsprint at the rate of about 25 million tons a year, a huge burden is being placed on forests in Scandinavia and Canada to supply woodpulp.

Canaan forests still have a great deal of untapped potential, but the cost of recovering timber from remote areas is becoming more and more prohibitive.

The underlying problem is that historic returns on newsprint production have been poor and investment companies have been slow to invest in the industry.

Weather hurts Europe crops

WASHINGTON (UPI) — Drought and record heat waves have threatened food production prospects in Western Europe, the Agriculture Department reports.
 The agency's Foreign Agricultural Service, in a world weather survey based on conditions through Aug. 11, said spring grains, sugarbeets, pastures and other crops were suffering in many parts of Europe.

"Although good rain soon could prevent heavy losses, production potential is being reduced daily," the FAS said.
 The report said also that prospects for world potato production "bear watching" because, although growers in Canada's maritime provinces got good rains recently, potato crops in almost all parts of Europe have been cut by droughts, heat and floods.
 On the optimistic side, the report said Japan got widespread rains in early August after several weeks of very dry weather; north and northeast China and Inner Mongolia got considerable rain; and the critical Indian monsoon rains "continue to perform well."

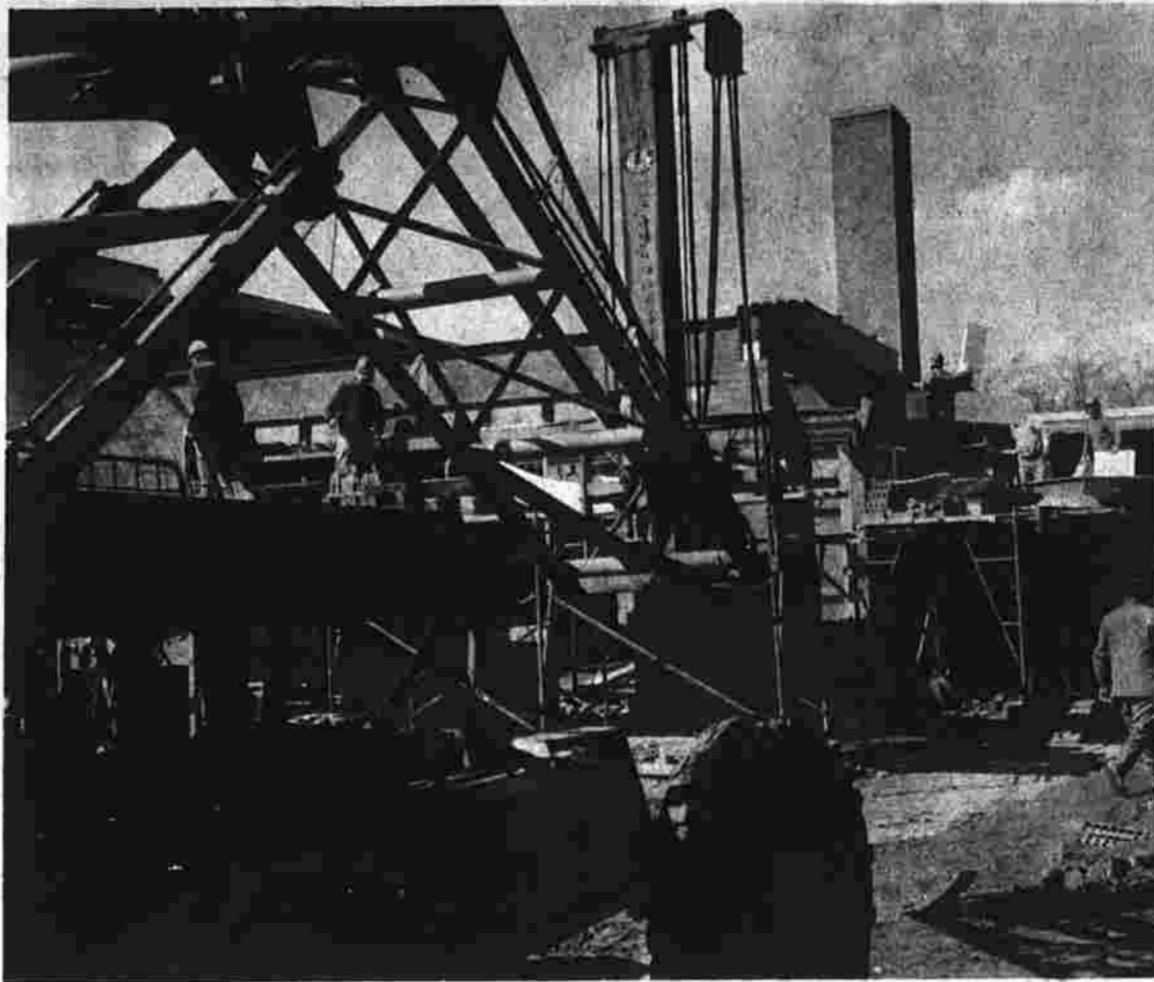
Suspended aide won't talk until he speaks to Grasso

HARTFORD (UPI) — Connecticut Drug Council Director Walter A. Stewart, suspended after state auditors said he misused state and federal funds, says he won't comment until he reports to Gov. Ella T. Grasso.
 Stewart was ordered suspended without pay Saturday by State Mental Health Commissioner Ernest A. Shepherd.
 Shepherd said he hoped to rescind the order "as soon as possible" after an investigation clears Stewart.
 Stewart said he wants to get "a hold of some of the records" and won't comment until he reports to the governor.
 "The governor asked me to respond in writing and I'm going to honor that," he said over the weekend.
 State auditors said Friday their staff had uncovered a number of serious abuses by Stewart, and Mrs. Grasso ordered him to answer the charges.
 Auditors Leo V. Donohue and Henry J. Becker Jr. said Stewart had received \$500 from each of two private schools involved in alcohol and drug abuse which listed him as a director.
 The schools, the New England School of Drug

Ferry freed

PORT KENT, N.Y. (UPI) — A ferry that ran aground on a rock in Lake Champlain has been freed and towed to the New York side of the lake.
 Tug boats Sunday freed the ferry "Valcour," which had run aground on a rock in Lake Champlain, forcing the evacuation of 124 persons and their cars.
 It was en route from Burlington, Vt., ran aground on Ferris Rock Thursday, about 1 1/2 miles from the New York shore.
 A total of 115 passengers and nine crew members were safely evacuated from the vessel Thursday night. The 45 cars were unloaded Saturday by crane and placed on another ferry.
 Divers, using underwater rivet guns and metal plates, patched a hole six feet long and eight inches wide in the craft's port side before it was pulled free. The cause of the accident is under investigation by the U.S. Coast Guard.

Wyman, Durkin trade campaign brickbats

CONCORD, N.H. (UPI) — Democratic Senate candidate John Durkin wants his GOP opponent to "knock it off," but Republican Louis Wyman says Durkin is becoming "unglued."
 The tempers flared during the weekend as Durkin, Wyman and American Party's C. Carmen Chimento face each other once again for the state's junior Senate seat.
 The Sept. 16 runoff election was called after two state recounts and a seven-month Senate review failed to determine a winner.
 Wyman's campaign manager says the already dirty campaign will get filthier in its 23 remaining days.
 During the weekend, Durkin asked Wyman to stop the attack "as a matter of common decency."
 Wyman campaign strategist, George Young, admits the special election is one of the dirtiest he's seen, but says "it

probably impossible to eliminate that kind of thing after all this time."
 A controversy brewed last week about Wyman's radio advertisements that said Durkin found a campaign loophole to avoid reporting all contributions. They charged Durkin failed to cross-reference campaign contributions of \$100 or less with fund raisers. That's not required by federal law.
 "We've intended this from the beginning," said Young. "It's just one of a series of points we're going to make which will show people John Durkin is not real merchandise."
 Young said the Wyman offense will continue until it nears "overkill."
 Sunday, Durkin, 39, said he would not go to court, but demanded for the third time the ads be stopped. They continue.
 "He's making charges and he

can't back them up," said Durkin. "He ought to knock it off."
 Wyman says Durkin has come "unglued."
 "John Durkin can dish it out but he can't take it," said Wyman, in reference to Durkin's radio campaign against the five-term congressman in the November election.
 The ad told voters Wyman accepted contributions from large corporate interests. The radio spot was highlighted with background sounds of a cocktail party and a ringing cash register.
 Durkin insists his ads were not deceptive.
 "The cocktail party was held. We have seen the list of those who attended, a list Wyman provided, and several thousand dollars was raised for Wyman's campaign," he said.

Wine has always had a charm, a romance, an appeal that is hard to achieve in any other way. What could be more romantic than a candle-lit table with the shimmering reflections of beautiful wine in lovely glasses. But for years the lack of "knowledge" about wine has made hostesses hesitate.

Now all that is changed. Americans—young Americans, mostly—have formed their own "wine culture." They are drinking the kind of wine they like, with the kind of food they like, without worrying about being "proper." The only important thing is to have good wine, and good food (not necessarily expensive).

So, if you want to be a perfect hostess, here's sound advice: First, don't let the problem of pronouncing wine names

Purchase wines as you do car

Now that fine French wines have tumbled into competitive prices with domestic wines, your choice will be helped by a little knowledge.

Take the Bordeaux and Burgundy regions, for instance, often confused by the novice wine purchaser. These are regions on either side of France separated by the great Central Massif mountains and 550 rugged kilometers; both of them encompassing many sub-districts with wines of varying characteristics.

Wise buying

It may seem easiest just to ask your wine dealer for a bottle of Bordeaux, or a bottle of Burgundy. But this is almost like saying to an auto dealer, "I'll take a car, please." For a "fine" bottle of wine (no longer very expensive) it's smarter to buy the way you would a car; by knowing what it offers. This takes a little reading and study but by no means must you be an expert. Wine is for drinking and savoring. You don't have to know its chemical composition.

Since Burgundy is comprised of so many areas and tiny vineyards it's easier to start learning about Bordeaux. Bordeaux is the home of the famous Chateau wines which, especially in the 1972 vintages now in the shops, can be had for surprisingly reasonable prices again.

Notable areas

Bordeaux includes several important areas, the Medoc, Graves (pronounced grahv), Sauternes, and just across the Garonne River, St. Emilion, and Pomerol.

The largest area, Medoc, has important divisions of its own, most notably, St. Julien and Margaux. But all of these wines are generically Bordeaux wines.

Each area offers something different. According to the renowned importer Austin, Nichols & Company, the elite Chateau Figeac is a fine example of the elegant St. Emilion personality. Chateau Rausan-Segla, an example of top-drawer Margaux, is full and fruity. And you'll

find the delicious, round-bodied Graves often represented in fine restaurants by the popular Chateau Bouscaut.

Price and quality

An example of how reasonable the prices have become is 1972 Rausan-Segla, selling in New York for under four dollars a bottle, a third the price of a 1970 vintage, and recommended by many wine writers.

Fine Bordeaux wines are strictly quality controlled by the French government (appellation controllee) and strictly classified as to stature (cru classe). A bottle of any Bordeaux wine without these ratings on the label is cheap but chancey.

If you're used to some heavier Burgundies, fine Bordeaux may surprise you at first taste—a little more elegant, more refined. But soon you will enjoy them hugely.

Vintage views

Austin, Nichols cautions that red Chateau wines need between four to eight years or more from the vintage on the bottle to reach their peak, and that it's essential to open the reds for aeration for at least two hours before drinking. Don't let restaurateurs sell you red Chateau wines too young to be worth the prices charged.

Separates give most for least

Fall separates have meaningful relationships in the same color family and closely related prints.

Dressing in component parts gets the most looks and fashion for the money. Fabrics are soft yet sturdy—corduroys, pre-washed or brushed denim, fuzzy fabrics.

Skirt shapes are slimmer but the soft look continues in dirtdis, wraps and half-circles, yoked skirts and button-down looks. A very new skirt from Paris is the slim hip skirt — it buttons up one side over pants or tights.

Pants shape up in jumpsuits, culottes, both slim and full trousers.

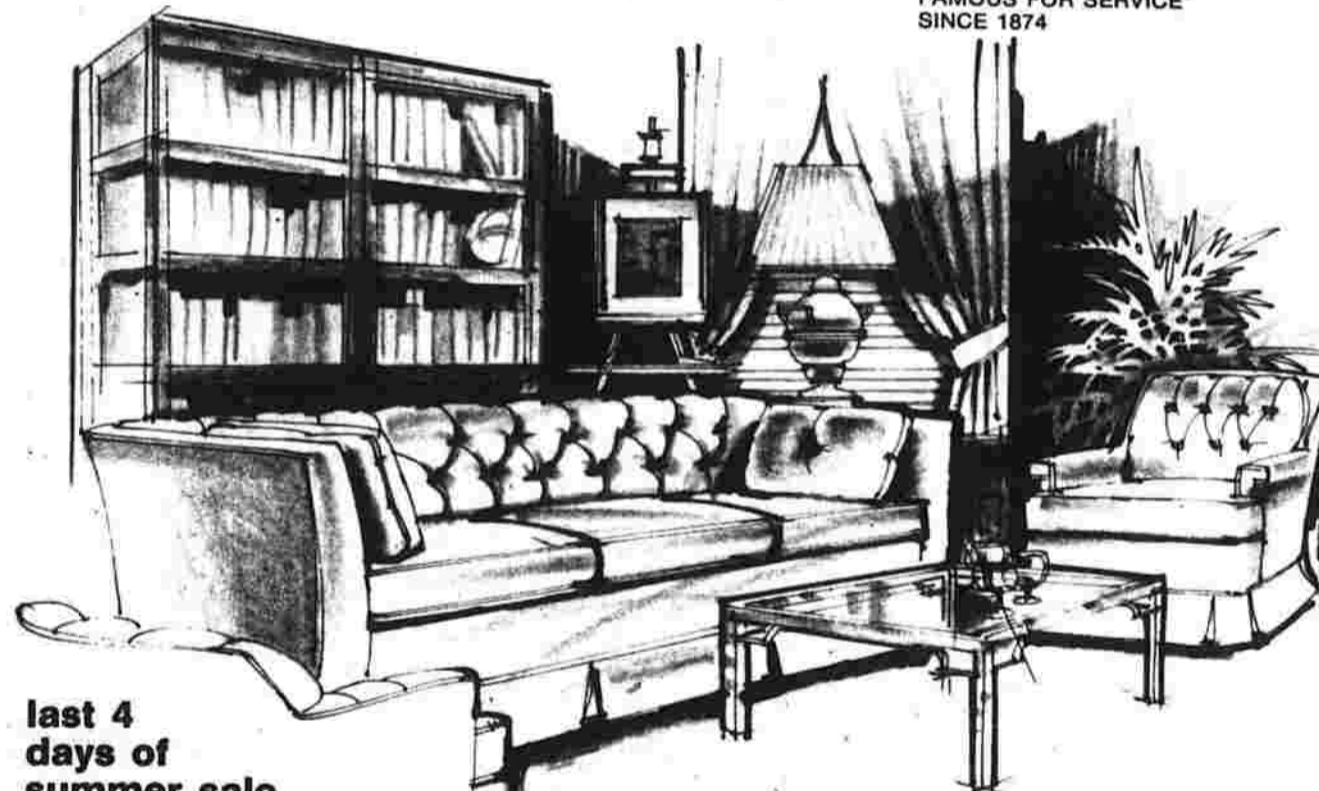

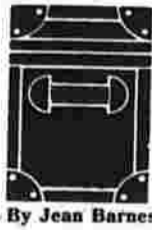

TODAY'S TREASURES

Recaned chairs worth every penny

By Jean Barnes

The cost of having a chair seat caned by a professional might tempt you to try it for yourself. If you are unusually adept with your hands and blessed with a superabundance of patience, your chances for success are good.

But most amateurs who start find caning a tedious task at best and seldom master more than one or two projects.

I had taken an old walnut rocker to our favorite furniture restorer-refinisher for regluing and mentioned that I might like to do the caning myself.

This started a 30-minute con-

versation on the subject with this man who had many years of experience with all kinds of caning. He admitted he now contracts his caning. "It takes a special kind of temperament to do very much of it," he explained.

He added that many persons have been lured to buy a course in caning expecting to find a profitable, part-time business for themselves. They discover later that caning is hard work and requires a degree of professional skill. Caning must be done properly or it will weaken the structure of your chair.

Basically, there are two types of caning — handwoven and the pressed seat. The hand woven consists of weaving strips of cane through holes in the frame, forming a geometrical pattern. The pressed seat is a machine-woven mesh which is pressed to a groover around the frame, glued and fastened with a piece of reed called a spline.

If you are going to replace a seat with handwoven cane it would be helpful to save at least a two-inch square of the old cane. This will help you determine the size of cane required and serve as a pattern for your design, he advised.

Above all, replace a worn out cane seat with a new one, he said. Don't replace it with a solid piece of wood and upholstery. "Put it in original condition, even if you have to save your pennies to have it done. It will be worth it."

Although I have heeded his advice not to attempt caning the rocking chair myself, I still feel tempted to try my hand and may one of these days on a piece of lesser importance to me.

He volunteered a bit of information on the history of caning saying that it was introduced into the Netherlands from the Orient. The earliest use of cane in the United States was in 1690 and that rocking chairs with cane backs and seats were very popular in the mid-nineteenth century.

Cooked, drained mixed vegetables in oil and vinegar dressing make a good portable salad for school lunches. Don't substitute mayonnaise or other dressings containing egg unless the salad will be packed in a vacuum bottle or carried in an insulated box or bag.

Lighter colors look larger, cooler

First, consider color and what it does to create new dimensions in the overall home design. "Lighter exterior colors often make a home appear larger. Too, they may lower summer cooling costs, since light colors reflect the sun's rays."

"From the standpoint of decorating flexibility, a light exterior, such as a harvest gold vinyl siding, allows you endless possibilities for accent colors. With a darker exterior, you're usually limited to white, beige, or other neutral shades for shutters, doors, and trim. Over a period of time, that can become visually boring."

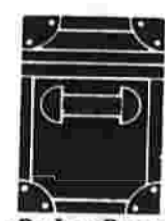

The pressed seat is a machine-woven mesh which is pressed to a groover around the frame, glued and fastened with a piece of reed called a spline.

Although I have heeded his advice not to attempt caning the rocking chair myself, I still feel tempted to try my hand and may one of these days on a piece of lesser importance to me.

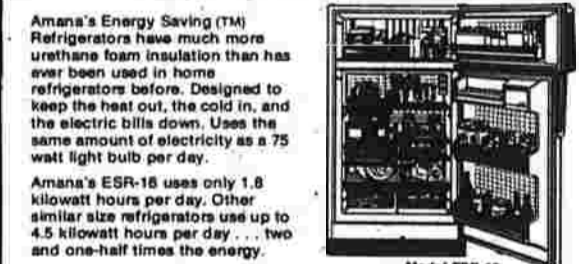

Apartment decor... work within limits

Oh, the limits of apartment living: stark white walls with no architectural interest; small rooms that must accommodate entertaining as well as day-to-day living; windows that offer lots of light and a ringside seat for the neighbors, and never, but never enough closet space. IMPROVING THE VIEW

Looks as if there's a soot and smog conspiracy to make windows everywhere dull, dusty and dingy. But no woman of spirit is going to give her family a dim view of things if she can help it.

Even if you can't get at the outside of the windows, you can make them look a lot brighter by keeping the inside clean. To clean windows inside—and outside, if accessible—a spray cleaner is the easiest to use.

Polish, dry with paper toweling or, for a really high shine with crushed newspaper. With long-handled squeegee it's even possible to clean the outside of windows—by pulling the top down when the bottom's clean—without getting up on a ladder.

When washing windows both inside and out, a good trick is to wash them horizontally indoors and vertically on the outside. To clean out the corners of window frames use a cotton swab dipped in the cleaning solution. And wait for a cloudy day; on a sunny day the glass dries so quickly it often looks streaked.

If you live in a one-story house and the windows aren't too dirty, you can use a hose on the outside (just be sure the windows are tightly shut). After a good hosing, all you'll need to do is polish them dry. A long-handled mop covered with a clean cloth can help extend your reach.

Before you wash windows dust the shades on both sides with either the dusting attachment of your vacuum or a soft cloth. Soil and smudges on washable shades can be removed with a sponge on which you've sprayed a small amount of a foam wall washer that also does a hundred and one other odd jobs. Spray it on the outside sills of windows and watch it foam away embedded grime. Inside sills will stay clean longer if you clean them with a creamy liquid wax that preserves the finish and helps protect against water spotting.

For quick and painless cleaning of window and door screens, get out the versatile wall washer mentioned above. The easiest way is to stand the screen up against the side of the house, spray with the wall washer and then hose. Before putting them back use the wall washer to clean out the window and door grooves.

Venetian blinds will stay cleaner longer if cleaned and protected with a creamy liquid wax. When the time comes to wash Venetian blinds, lay them flat in the bathtub which you've lined with plastic. Spray the blinds with the trusty foam wall washer. Watch the foam loosen all the dirt and grime, then rinse thoroughly. Tapes and blinds will come clean. Dry slats with a clean cloth and hang blinds back on window and leave open for tapes to dry.

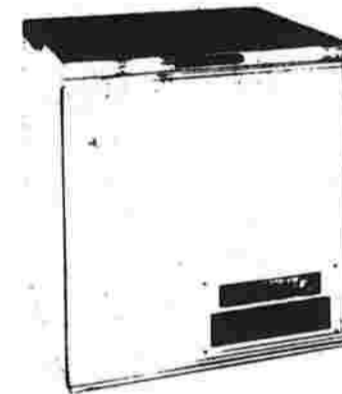

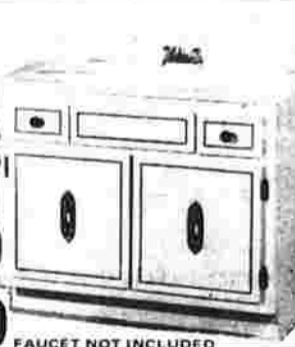

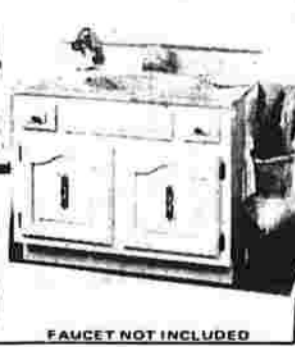

Home handyman get more help in kitchen

The advent of hard times has changed the lifestyles of many American families. Repairs and home improvements once contracted for are increasingly being handled by the homemaker, particularly if no specialized know-how is required.

But even unfamiliar tasks are being tackled by the new self-reliant breed of do-it-yourselfers, as a cost-cutting measure.

And manufacturers, sensing the trend, are extending a helping hand to the growing legions of home handyman.

General Electric, for instance, has just issued a free six-page booklet graphically illustrating,

with step-by-step instructions, the plumbing and electrical work necessary to replace a food waste disposer.

It also has simplified design of three of its five models to make them easier and faster to install.

Another aid from GE for the home fixer-upper is a replacement dishwasher installation kit. It has a suggested retail price of \$14.95, but provides all the parts, materials and special tools needed to replace a broken-down dishwasher with a GE model, normally a \$40-\$60 job.

Both booklet and kit are available at most GE appliance dealers.

More and more glass in furniture

The furniture industry today is in a state of flux, so every type of furniture actually can be considered "in style."

Heavy float glass, such as that produced by Libbey-Owens-Ford Company, is an excellent choice of furniture material since it blends beautifully with any style.

Glass-top tables and mirrors immediately come to mind when thinking of glass in furniture. However, many manufacturers have introduced some interesting and different glass applications for their most recent lines.

Furniture being designed today can be categorized into one of five basic style categories: early American, traditional, Oriental, Mediterranean and contemporary. Early American furniture maintains the charm and simplicity of the United States' historic past.

In the new lines, crown glass has reappeared. Dating back to colonial times, crown glass then was made by blowing a globe of glass, heating it and spinning it until it was flattened into a slightly-bowed disc. Today's crown glass is cast in a special mold. It is being shown in special reproductions, such as a colonial breakfront.

The focal point of every pioneer kitchen was a large, heavy wood table. This style is back today, but

as a heavy-glass table resting on a rough wood base.

Mirrors make their mark in the early American revival as well. An antique secretary reproduction features smoked-glass mirrors in the window areas. Round Regency period mirrors—characterized by convex glass and a spread eagle perched on top of the gold frame—and being shown as accessories in many early American room settings.

The traditional style has its roots in Europe—France, England and Italy—and is characterized by each country's most-well-loved designs.

In one line, a traditionally-styled desk is topped with smoked glass. A graceful dining table consists of an oval piece of glass, with rounded edges, resting on a simulated tortoise-shell base.

"Curio tables," wood boxes with clear glass covers, are a traditional offering for end and coffee tables. Knick-knacks and other small mementos can be put into the tables for display without dust.

Although it's been around for centuries, Oriental is the big news in furniture design today. The nation's new relations with China undoubtedly are a major reason for increased interest.

This style includes glass-top

tables with chrome bases fashioned to resemble bamboo. Wood applied with bamboo moldings frame long, narrow mirrors. Chinese Chippendale, a mid-18th century style combining Chinese decorations with English proportions, currently is very popular as a mirror style.

Mediterranean furniture has a heritage of ornamentation, wrought-iron grillework, carving and ornate hardware.

Glass has been used effectively as a table top on a wrought-iron base and as mirrors with matching sconces. One manufacturer has put a tiny mirror on the base of each sconce which accompanies an attractively-framed mirror.

A contemporary look is furniture characterized by clean lines, functionalism and an elimination of inessential detail. Often, considered very innovative or "avant garde," this style blends extremely well with the other four furniture styles.

For example, chrome-and-glass tables and shelves, which once were put only in modernly-furnished rooms, can be seen today in many traditionally-furnished rooms, and they look beautiful.

New contemporary glass applications include tiny mirror squares attached to decorative mirror frames and cube tables, as well as glass wall plaques and tables which are painted brilliant colors.

Plastics for furniture are a booming business today. Fine Decorator furniture, which once was owned only by the wealthy, can be purchased by everyone.

Knits now get special maintenance

While the popularity of knit fabrics has added a new "look" to today's fashions, they've also added new problems to the care and cleaning of consumers' wardrobes. Many knits are machine washable, but require special care in drying to avoid shrinking or damage to the fiber.

However, there's some good news for the knitters: special cycles are being added to automatic dryers to provide the low-temperature drying necessary to protect knit and monoacrylic garments against shrinkage and fiber damage.

General Electric, for example, is extending this feature throughout most of its home laundry line. Formerly, special knit cycles were available only in higher-priced models.

Although knit clothing just came into prominence in the mid 1960's, it now accounts for 60% of the fabric produced for women's wear and 55% of retail piece goods sales.

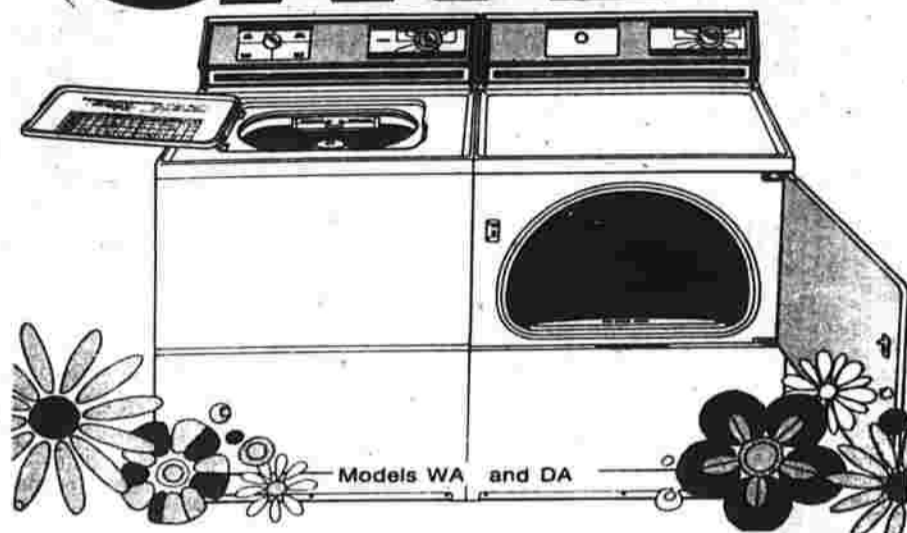

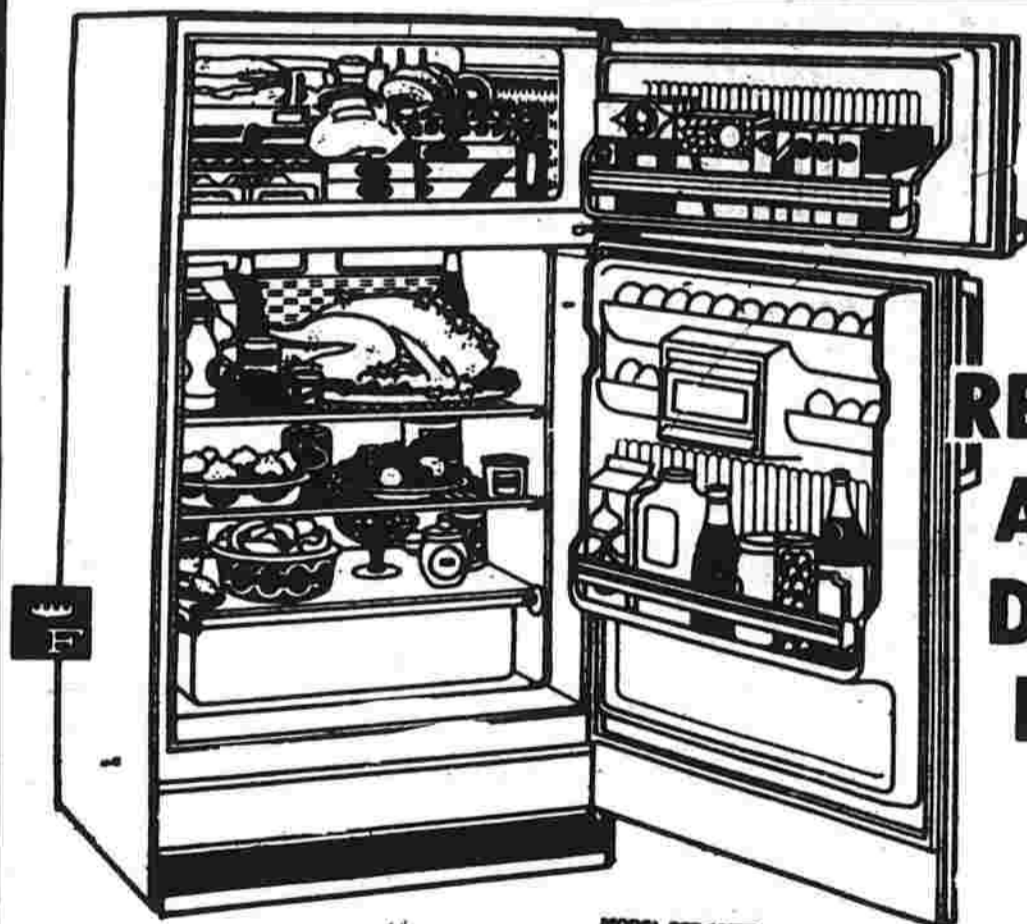

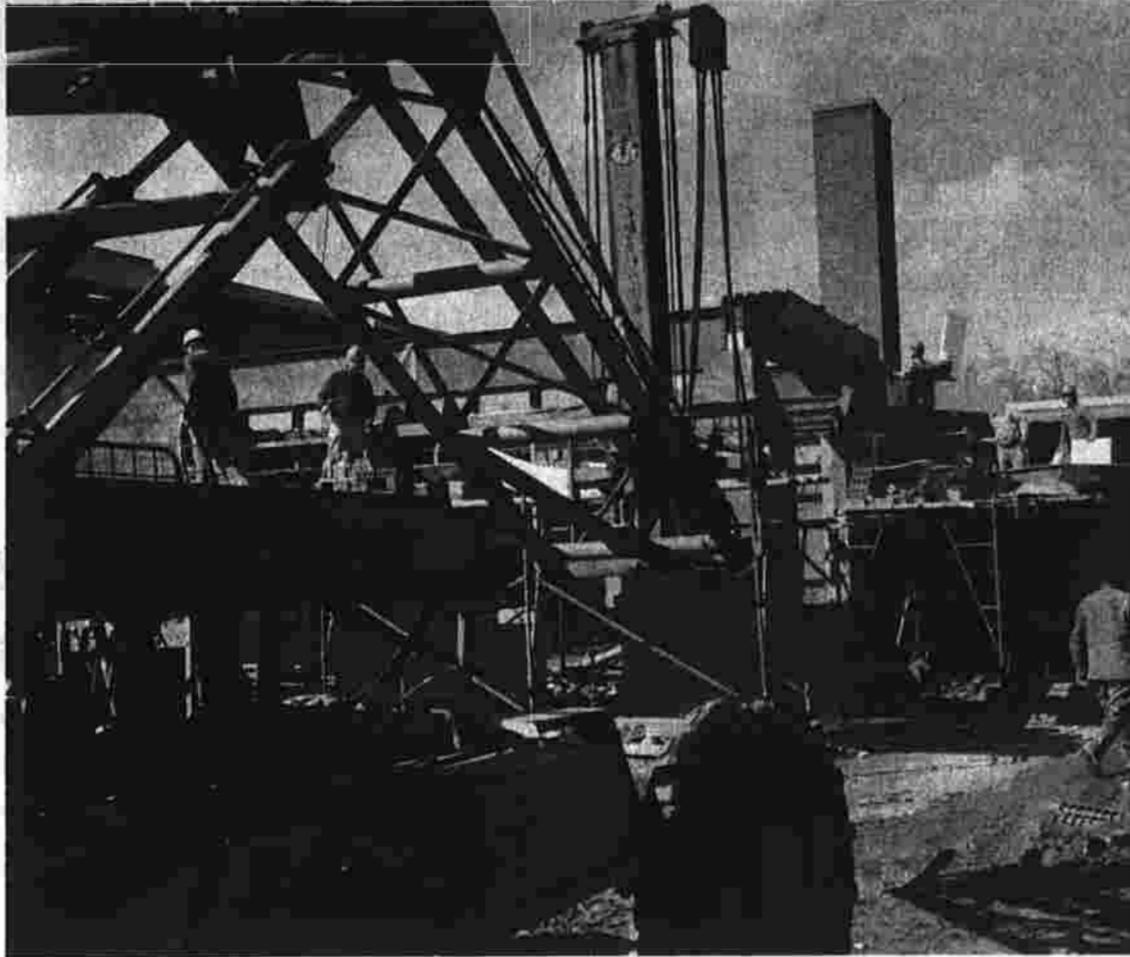
Weather hurts Europe crops

WASHINGTON (UPI) — Drought and record heat waves have threatened food production prospects in Western Europe, the Agriculture Department reports. The agency's Foreign Agricultural Service, in a world weather survey based on conditions through Aug. 11, said spring grains, sugarbeets, pastures and other crops were suffering in many parts of Europe.

"Although good rain soon could prevent heavy losses, production potential is being reduced daily," the FAS said. The report said also that prospects for world potato production "bear watching" because, although growers in Canada's maritime provinces got good rains recently, potato crops in almost all parts of Europe have been cut by droughts, heat and floods. On the optimistic side, the report said Japan got widespread rains in early August after several weeks of very dry weather; north and northeast China and Inner Mongolia got considerable rain; and the critical Indian monsoon rains "continue to perform well."

Suspended aide won't talk until he speaks to Grasso

HARTFORD (UPI) — Connecticut Drug Council Director Walter A. Stewart, suspended after state auditors said he misused state and federal funds, says he won't comment until he reports to Gov. Ella T. Grasso. Stewart was ordered suspended without pay Saturday by State Mental Health Commissioner Ernest A. Shepherd. Shepherd said he hoped to rescind the order "as soon as possible" after an investigation clears Stewart. Stewart said he wants to get "a hold of some of the records" and won't comment until he reports to the governor. "The governor asked me to respond in writing and I'm going to honor that," he said over the weekend. State auditors said Friday their staff had uncovered a number of serious abuses by Stewart, and Mrs. Grasso ordered him to answer the charges. Auditors Leo V. Donohue and Henry J. Becker Jr. said Stewart had received \$500 from each of two private schools involved in alcohol and drug abuse which listed him as a director. The schools, the New England School of Drug

Wyman, Durkin trade campaign brickbats

CONCORD, N.H. (UPI) — Democratic Senate candidate John Durkin wants his GOP opponent to "knock it off," but Republican Louis Wyman says Durkin is becoming "unglued." The tempers clashed during the weekend as Durkin, Wyman and American Party's C. Carmen Chimento face each other once again for the state's junior Senate seat. The Sept. 16 runoff election was called after two state recounts and a seven-month Senate review failed to determine a winner. Wyman's campaign manager says the already dirty campaign will get filthier in its 23 remaining days. During the weekend, Durkin asked Wyman to stop the attack "as a matter of common decency." Wyman campaign strategist, George Young, admits the special election is one of the dirtiest he's seen, but says "it's

probably impossible to eliminate that kind of thing after all this time." A controversy brewed last week about Wyman's radio advertisements that said Durkin found a campaign loophole to avoid reporting all contributions. They charged Durkin failed to cross reference campaign contributions of \$100 or less with fund raisers. That's not required by federal law. "We've intended this from the beginning," said Young. "It's just one of a series of points we're going to make which will show people John Durkin is not real merchandise." Young said the Wyman offensive will continue until it nears "overkill." Sunday, Durkin, 39, said he would not go to court, but demanded for the third time the ads be stopped. They continue. "He's making charges and he

can't back them up," said Durkin. "He ought to knock it off." Wyman says Durkin has come "unglued." "John Durkin can dish it out but he can't take it," said Wyman, in reference to Durkin's radio campaign against the five-term congressman in the November election. The ad told voters Wyman accepted contributions from large corporate interests. The radio spot was highlighted with background sounds of a cocktail party and a ringing cash register. Durkin insists his ads were not deceptive. "The cocktail party was held. We have seen the list of those who attended, a list Wyman provided, and several thousand dollars was raised for Wyman's campaign," he said.

Rocky Neck expanded

Ferry freed
PORT KENT, N.Y. (UPI) — A ferry that ran aground on a rock in Lake Champlain has been freed and towed to the New York side of the lake. Tug boats Sunday freed the ferry "Valour," which had run aground on a rock in Lake Champlain, forcing the evacuation of 124 persons and their cars. A total of 123 passengers and nine crew members were safely evacuated from the vessel Thursday night. The 65 cars were unloaded Saturday by crane and placed on another ferry. Divers, using underwater steel gags and metal plates, pushed a hole six feet long and eight inches wide in the craft's hull side before it was pulled free. The cause of the accident is under investigation by the U.S. Coast Guard.
