and help for three hours." Women may be known for their patience, but not for fixing cars. Ms. Robacker, the station's only mechanic, said some customers never return. "You have a mechanic here? When will he be in?" they

"Well, she'll be in in an hour."

"Oh, she will ... And then they don't come back, she said. The owner of Nebraska's only female-run station, Dick Salem, said the women make mistakes but he is pleased

they are turning a profit. They let people take advantage of them. It's letting the customer be right," Salem said. One woman customer who declined to give her name
