



DRIVER, THE (R) - Ryan O'Neal, Bruce Dern, friver for bank robbers is the anti-hero of this low-key, the cop who'll do anything to get his man. Everybody is otten in this one, but there are plenty of car chases to keep you busy. GRADE: B.

BUDDY HOLLY STORY, THE (PG) - Gary Busey, Don Stroud, Charlie Martin Smith. Biographical drama. When Buddy Holly died at the age of 22 in a plane crash he was already a rock 'n' roll legend. Now, nearly 20 years later, Gary Busey brings Holly alive again in a touching, funny film that shows the life behind the legend. GRADE: A-

CAPRICORN ONE (PG) - James Brolin, Hal Holbrook Brenda Vaccaro. Action-adventure. Plenty of action here, and something to think about, too. This suggests that the space program fakes a Mars landing — the astronauts are really in a Martian mock-up on Earth — and builds a great chase and survival thriller from that. GRADE: B-plus

CHEAP DETECTIVE, THE (PG) - Peter Falk, Ann-Margret and a cast of dozens. Comedy-Mystery. This is Neil Simon's follow-up to "Murder by Death." It's a spoof of all those old Bogart movies. Most of it works, some of it sn't, but you'll smile most of the way. The plot has more sts than a roomful of disco dancers, but don't worry bout it. Just enjoy the gags and funny situations. Grade:

DAMIEN OMEN II (R) - William Holden, Lee Grant. Thriller. Sequels seldom live up to the original, but this one is even worse than usual. Where the first "Omen" was scary, this one is ludicrous. The boy - the devil's son - is now in military school and everybody who ferrets out his secret dies in a gruesome way. Caution: There are grisly scenes, but the rest of it is more funny than frightening. GRADE: D.

DIFFERENT STORY, A (R) — Perry King, Meg Poster, Romance. Boy meets girl with a twist — they're both homosexuals. Soon they need each other and they "go straight" over a lopsided birthday cake. That's when the film falls flatter than the cake. Overall effect is amateur-ish and superficial, but the film has its comic and touching nts. Caution: Some nudity, strong language.

FOUL PLAY (PG) — Goldie Hawn, Chevy Chase. Comedy-thriller. The plot has more holes than an old Swiss cheese, but who care? It's fun and scary to watch poor Goldie, the innocent, get involved with assassins, and goings-on. It's all very slick, with some laughs and some rieks. GRADE: B-plus.

GREASE (PG) - John Travolta, Olivia Newton-John Musical. Not much plot, but plenty of fun, energy and music. Travolta can't sing, but, who cares? — he's a star. Slow direction stalls some of the musical numbers, but overall this has a very enjoyable quality, and it builds up to a great musical climax. It's all fine summer fluff. GRADE: B-plus.

HEAVEN CAN WAIT (PG) — Warren Beatty, Julic Christie, Dyan Cannon, Charles Grodin. Comedy. A cheerful, gentle fantasy about a Heavenly mistake concerning the death of a pro football player. So he gets another chance — and another body. This time, he's a tycoon, but he still wants to be a quarterback. Even the heavies are lovable in this upbeat film. GRADE: B-plus.

INTERNATIONAL VELVET (PG) — Tatum O'Neal, Christopher Plummer, Nanette Newman, Anthony Hopkins, Drama. Frankly sentimental, this belated sequel to "National Velvet" has Velvet, now 40-ish, adopting her orphaned niece and overseeing her desire to be an Olympic equestrienne. Fine for family viewing, but tending to be a bit over-sweet. GRADE: B.

JAWS 2 (PG) - Roy Scheider, Action-thriller, Here we go again, but this time it misses the mark. The story is poor, the direction is weak, the snork looks fishy. Some moments of excitement but generally pretty dull. Com-

OUR WINNING SEASON (PG) — Scott Jacoby. Comedy-drama. Another "American Graffitti" copy, this film about high school kids growing up in the '60s starts slowly but manages to find itself in the last reel. Mostly, it's about a young track star trying to find himself. The beginning is e-ridden it's embarrassing, but the last part is OK GRADE: C.

PRETTY BABY (R) — Keith Carradine, Susan Saran-don, Brooke Shields. Drama. Set in New Orleans' famous Storyville brothel area, this is a beautifully photographed F.I.S.T. (PG) — Sylvester Stallone, Rod Steiger.

Drama. Basically, this is the story of the rise and fall of a Hoffa-like labor leader. The early part — dealing with his start and the problems in organizing the men — is more fascinating than the second half. It's far too long, but contains some very strong scenes. GRADE: A.

Steiger. Storyvine brother area, this is a beautifully photographed look at a family of prostitutes. The subject matter may be objectionable, but director Louis Malle has handled it tastefully, or as tastefully as possible. Good performances all around. GRADE: B-plus.





Lawyers in state nix TV ad

HARTFORD (UPI) Television advertising for almost everybody else may be okay, but for lawyers it would be unseemly, bar associations agreed

Attorney Fitzgerald, vice president of the Hartford County Bar Association, said he was opposed" to the American Bar Association endorsement Wednesday of the controversial concept. "My own view is that such advertising would offer no conceivable advantage to the public or profession," Fitzgerald

"I submit that it is ludicrous, that it is undignified, unnecessary, and there is no need for lawyers to pander their wares on television. I am certainly opposed to it," he

"The theory is that the public needs the assistance to find a lawyer. Well, I don't think we have to reduce it to that level. You can always look in the telephone book." Attorney Richard Bell, Haven County Bar Association, agreed with

Fitzgerald's comments. "The risk of abuse and demeaning the profession far outweigh any possible advantage to the public or to the profession and do nothing to assure the quality of legal services," he

"Personally, I'm very reluctant to see the legal profession scrabble in huckstering. The prospects of misleading the public outweigh any possible benefit," he said. Bell said recent rules formulated by the Connecticut bar and state judicial department now preclude any immediate attempt to permit television advertising by lawyers in Connecticut, although newspaper advertising is The New Haven attorney

said the rules were drafted last year after the U.S. Supreme Court ruled lawyers could advertise fees and routine legal services in newspapers.
Until then, Bell noted, the ABA had opposed almost all forms of legal

"Frankly, it would have probably stayed the same because there was very little internal pressure pushing for legal adver-tising. The pressure came from without, not from within," he said. Because the ABA en-





Captains and the Killers?

Taylor Caldwell has writ-"Testimony of Two Men" and "Captains and the Kings," but some of her

most interesting writings have not been published. Despite the immense pop-ularity of her sprawling historical romances, some of Caldwell's work, according to Crawdaddy Magazine, ap-parently interested only the FBI. She is said to have accused lawyer William M. Kunstler of plotting to kill Dr. Martin Luther King Jr., and, inferentially, Robert F.

Kennedy, as well. In an article in the September issue of Crawdaddy, Kunstler says he has been an ongoing target of what he describes as Caldwell's obsessive anti-Communist pho-bia. Kunstler claims correspondence and telephone calls in FBI files substantiate the view that Caldwell is "unreliable and possibly

CB clubs work to make it better

It was the first CB funeral
ever held. More than 100
CBers, many of them members of the Signal Seekers of Polk County, Fla., were present to bury their chap-lain, Gordon Van Noske.

It was a touching occasion as the pallbearers wearing their and blue white and blue.

as the pallbearers wearing their red, white, and blue uniforms buried "Flash Gordon" in reverence. He, too, as he had requested his family, wore the prescribed attire of his club.

Marlin Fagan, president
of the Signal Seekers, presided at a private club
prayer for Van Noske the
following Sunday and dedicated the mini-jamboree,
which the club had been
planning for months, to his
memory. CBers from
throughout Polk County
came to participate in the

throughout Polk County came to participate in the event and to honor their fellow CBer's passing.

"We organized the club in mid-December, 1977," explained Fagan, whose handle is "Yellow Jacket."

"Our first meeting was in January, 1978. We've got 54 members. It was started by seven CBers who were tired of the abuses that we found on citizens band radio. People who harrass CBers talkple who harrass CBers talk-ing, who yak on top of conversations and who dead key are doing CB an injus-tice. We decided to do some-thing about it."

At their first meeting they agreed that their efforts would be directed toward this objective. They set initiation fees at \$10 per member (which included the wives) and monthly fees at \$2. With their initial organization there was enough money to buy three signal tracers for finding the offenders. Working together, the club has nailed five so far. Two of these have been reported to the FCC for refusing to coop-

rate reasonably.
Signal Seekers like "The Wild Man" (Leonard Wilts), "Crusader" (Reese Griffin), "Elevatob Man" (William Davis) and "Alligator" (Louie Mitchell) all wanted some structure for what some structure for what they term a "decent CB

family that could enjoy each other in good fellowship." Their meetings are prima-rily about projects they can undertake. Their uniforms

undertake. Their uniforms indicate their pride in their organization. In a county of Florida with about 200,000 population there are more than 30 CB clubs. Their total membership is estimated at 8000 clubs. Their total member-ship is estimated at 8,000 active CBers. At a mini-jamboree in Lakeland, the county seat, between over 4,000 CBers came to enjoy the bingo games, various family competitions and strive for the prixes. A joint effort of all the Polk County clubs is in the planning stage to see if their combined efforts at raising money for Jerry Lewis' annual muscu-lar dystrophy can do better than a Tampa television sta-

"Right now the biggest "Right now the biggest problem on CB is the nonstop talkers," Fagan said.
"Recently, as an example, a woman was heading south on Interstate 75 and there had been a death in her family. She was from Ohio, so a member of her family called a friend in Winter Haven to see if she could be called a friend in Winter Haven to see if she could be headed off before she got to Miami. He put it on Channel 12 (our channel) and I picked the message up. I wanted to relay it to Tampa or Orlando, but I couldn't get a break because of this. That's wrone."
