PBC Holds Up Pool Bill

EAST HARTFORD - The Public Building Commission voted unanimously not to pay a \$109,578 bill for the Hockanum pool project because a PBC member said the procedure used for signing the invoice was incorrect. The PBC met Thursday night.

PBC member George Precourt noticed that a \$15,000 balance, which was part of the \$109.578 bill, had been signed by Michael Valuk, the administrative assistant to the mayor Precourt said the order should not have been signed until the equipment was delivered to the site and installed. On the invoice order, it says the equipment was delivered to Anderson Fairoaks, the general contractor for the project, in Hartford not the pool site.

Precourt said once the PBC votes to pay a bill, any equipment which gets lost or stolen becomes the responsibility of the PBC. "It's happened to us before,"

Precourt said. "We receive a bill and we pay it, then equipment gets lost or stolen and it's our responsibility." Precourt said the commission's purpose is to serve the taxpayers and he said the PBC would be doing a disservice to the town's taxpayers if it had to pay twice for equipment which
