

Letter Grades Return

MANCHESTER — Children in the upper grades of Manchester's elementary schools are now receiving letter grades on their work. It is the first time in several years the elementary schools are using letter grades instead of the previous system of checks and other marks to indicate progress.

Douglas Townsend, principal at Bentley School and chairman of the report card committee of administrators, parents and teachers, explained the new system to the Manchester Board of Education Monday night.

Townsend said one of the main concerns of the committee was to have consistency in the reporting system schoolwide. He presented the board with a detailed guide to the new report cards.

The cards evaluate the student in several ways. They not only use the traditional A, B, C, D letter grades to indicate outstanding, above average, average or unsatisfactory work, but indicate the degree of effort by the student with 1, 2 or 3, indicating very good, good or insufficient.

The subject areas which will be graded with letters are reading, language arts, mathematics, spelling, social studies and science. The other areas, handwriting, art, music and physical education progress will be noted by only a check of "I" (needs improvement).

The new report cards, to be used for the first time in November, will be presented at parent-teacher conferences as they have been in the past. Conferences will still be held twice a year for each child.

The only objection raised to the new report cards was from school board member Verna Hulbard who said she disagreed with using only two marks for the non-academic subjects. She said it did not allow a mark for a child who may do outstanding work in one of those areas.

At the first in a series of coffee hours between Manchester High School parents and the administration, the parents were told by Jacob Ludes, principal, that it is important to have community involvement to prepare for the school's accreditation.

school's staff explained the purpose of the school's accreditation and handed out questionnaires. The school was given a 10-year accreditation in 1969. In October 1979, representatives of the New England Association of Schools and Colleges will evaluate the school's philosophy to determine what accreditation it deserves—2-year, 5-year or 10-year.

Vice Principal Eleanor Gowen said the school will be evaluated on what it's striving to accomplish and how it's meeting the needs of the students. Such things as curriculum, administration, facilities, financial support, school attendance and

record keeping will come under the association's scrutiny. Speaking about the community involvement, Ludes said schools have become more accountable to communities because of increasing economic restraints. "If we do a good thorough job in self-evaluation, we won't have any problems," he said.

The questionnaire lists 13 objectives which the parents are to grade from 1 to 5 as to degree of acceptance and degree of implementation. Some of the objectives listed are as follows: To develop within each student a sense of self-worth and purposefulness; to develop skills to enable students to locate sources of pertinent information and to apply principles needed to accomplish their career and life goals; to aid the student in a wise choice of vocation and/or further education; to equip those students who wish to enter the world of work with basic skills, practical experience and proper work attitudes which will help them to get and keep a job, and to develop an awareness of, and help eliminate, prejudicial attitudes, both in self and society, in the areas of sex, race, religion and economic status.

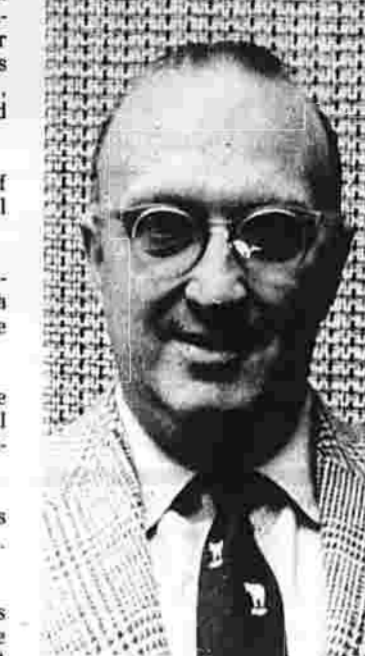

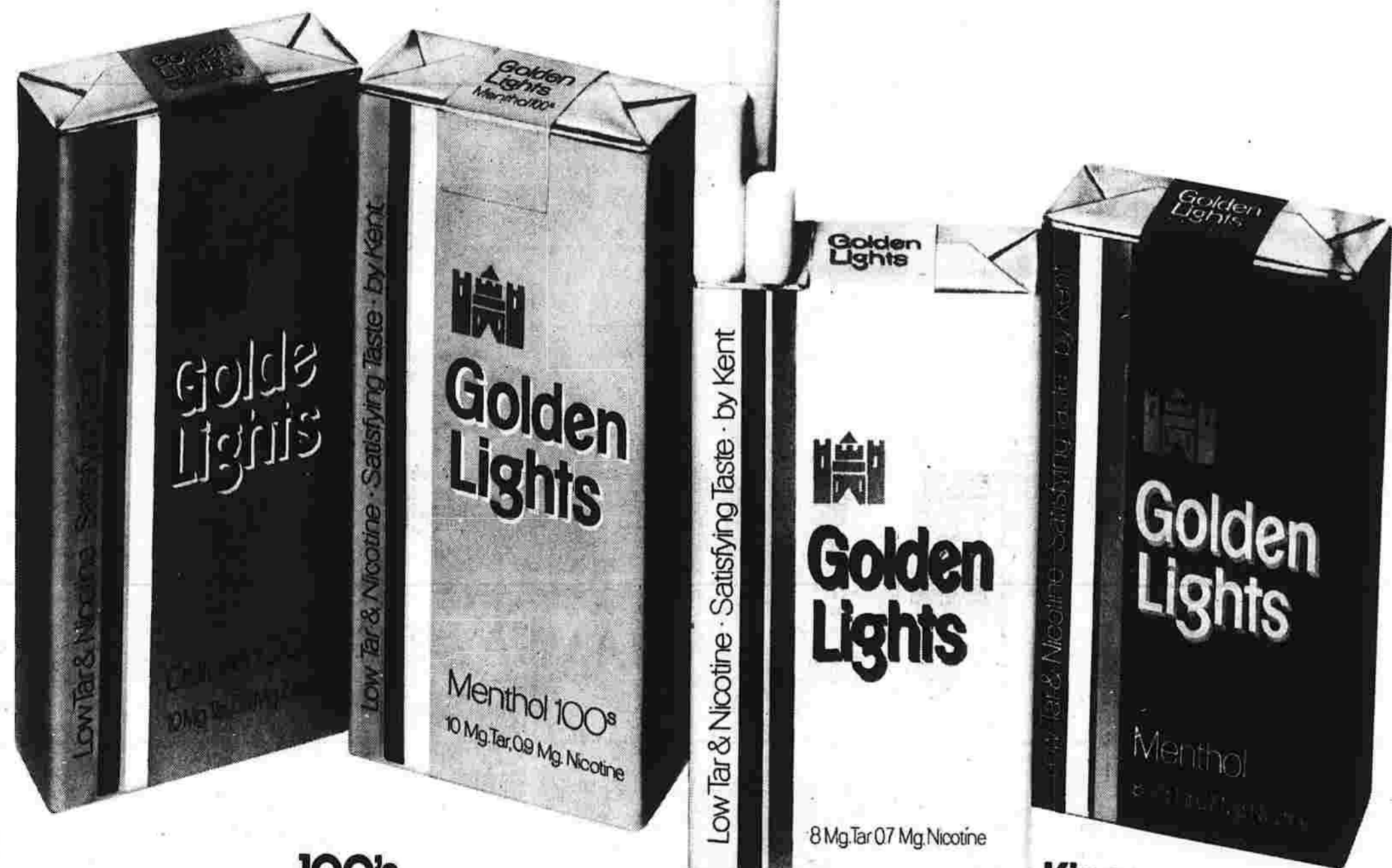
