Fall River Strike **Ended by Teachers** 

FALL RIVER, Mass. (UPf) — Teachers today approved a new three-year contract to end their 18-day-old Their approval of the new pact came on a near un-animous voice vote just before \$.30 a.m. The 850 teachers began returning to their classrooms immediately after the vote, which came on an agreement reached Tuesday night between representatives of the

School Committee and the Fall River Educators Associa-Union president Joseph M. Quinn praised the contract as as "the best non-economical contract in the state." The pact calls for a 4 percent salary increase in the first year of the contract, with a \$200 cash bonus. cond two years of the agreement.

The teachers had been on strike since the school year began Sept. 11. Their walkout has closed schools to virtually all the city's 14,000 students. The contract dispute had centered on salary, class size, the number of hours in the school day and the length of

In this case do not brown chops.

#### Chili Pork Steaks

4 pork blade steaks, cut 1/2 to 3/4 1 package (8 ounces) corn bread

2 tablespoons chili powder 1-1/2 teaspoons garlic salt 1/4 teaspoon pepper 2/3 cup chili sauci

Crush stuffing mix to make crumbs and mix with chili powder, garlic salt and pepper. Spread chili sauce on both sides of pork steaks; dredge in crumb mixture. Place steaks on rack in glass-ceramic open roaster and bake in moderate oven (350°F.) for 1 to 1-1/4 hours, until done. 6 servings.



DEAR POLLY — Recently I bought an oiled leather handbag that has a terrible odor. Is there any way of geting rid of this hideous aroma? - RHONDA DEAR RHONDA - It may take a few tries because leather can have a lingering odor. You might put some

charcoal in a box with the bag and close it up for a few weeks. I would crumple up some newspaper and add that, too. Do protect the bag so it does not touch the charcoal or newsprint. An open bar of scented soap could also be placed in a drawer or box with the bag. Baking soda is also a good deodorizer. I am sure if any of the readers have had success deodorizing leather, they will share their remedy with you. - POLLY



CORK, Ireland (UPI) - The 300year-old Charles Fort, which was little more than a picturesque ruin on Ireland's southern coast, has been restored and opened to the public, the Irish Tourist Board reports. A massive star-shaped structure with outer defenses more than 40 feet

high, the fort was built in 1677 by Sir William Robinson on the site of a medieval castle. The parapets afford a magnificient view of the harbor of the resort and fishing center of Kinsale, where William Penn's father was once governor.



Every window should be a perfect fit. None should be put up that needs painting. Since you will probably wash the windows efore you put them up, you have an opportunity to give each one careful in-

Obviously, cracked or broken glass should be replaced. Cracked or broken putty should be replaced as well. Scrape out the old and prime the surface with inseed oil before applying

new putty. Frames become loose with age. Sometimes open corner joints can be closed by tapping with a wooden block and hammer. Joints can be reinforced with angle irons, metal straps or other braces that will bridge the adjoining pieces of wood. Use wood screws to fasten these. Corrugated fasteners or other wood fasteners also may be used to reinforce a weak corner. They may need retouching. Remember that they should be painted not only on the surface, but on the edges as well. Failure to seal all surfaces will cause the wood to absorb moisture and swell. On inner edges you will

have to paint sparingly. Thick coats will make installation difficult. Windows should fit snugly but not so snugly that If a window sticks, note sand or plane the edge. Remember to seal the edges when you finish.

If the windows fit too loosely, they're not good at all since air is entering around them. In this case install felt or sponge weather stripping or other insulation material on the inside edges so that it seals

the opening.
Aluminum storm windows need little maintenance but should be checked just the same. Clean them with steel wool to remove oxidation. If the window is of the type that slides out of the way and is self-storing remember to lubricate and clean the guide tracks occasionally With aluminum win dows, a rubber molding generally cushions and holds the glass in the frame. ### Holding down drug prices

Librium is an anti-anxiety drug for which the patent expired two years ago. It is made by Roche Laboratories, part of a huge, multinational pharmaceutical company. Its chemical — generic — name is chlordiazepoxide hcl.

Librium costs your pharmacist 5.3 cents for a five-milligram capsule. Normal medical prescription for Librium is four daily, or 21.2 cents.

These other companies make the same drug and market

Three other companies make the same drug and market it under the generic name. Their prices for four capsules of the same dosage run from 4.3 cents to 10.6 cents — a fifth to Yet Librium has more than 95 percent of the U.S. market, says Tom Fulda of the Health Care Financing

Fulda has spent the past year working on a booklet with which HCFA, an arm of the Health, Education and Welfare Department, hopes to hold down drug prices and so reduce the soaring costs of medical treatment. Drugs represent 10 percent of all U.S. medical costs. In 1976 their prices averaged 50 percent higher than in 1974, the U.S. Consumer Price Index shows.

The HCFA booklet, now in draft form and circulating among 500 health preferable.

among 500 health professionals, is entitled "Guide to Dru Prices." HCFA plans to send it to the nation's 350,00 physicians, to pharmacists and to consumers who ask for it by the end of the year. It's free. It is, in effect, the first free catalogue of comparative price information on prescription drugs and some non-prescription drugs.

rescription drugs.

It divides 196 of the most frequently prescribed drugs, plus pain-killers like aspirin, into 16 therapeutic categories In each category, the guide lists the generic and trade names of each drug, their manufacturers, average pertablet price to pharmacists based on a mid-1977 survey of 1,000 pharmacists, and total cost of normally recommended daily dosage. HCFA plans to update the guide every six months. every six months Fulda says half the drugs on the U.S. market are "patent monopolies" — the patents protect manufacturers from

ompetition.

The guide is "only a reference," Fulda says. He stresses that HEW does not intend to "abrogate, interfere or otherwise infringe" on medical judgments.

In addition to price comparisons, Fulda thinks the guide rill enable doctors to make more economic price decisions will enable doctors to make more economic price decisions in picking from among different drugs that perform similarly. Example: Eli Lilly's patented anti-infective, Keflex, costs 30.5 cents for a 250-milligram capsule. But another anti-infective, ampicillin, is often used the same way. Ten kinds of ampicillin are listed in the guide, ranging in price from six to 18.7 cents per capsule.

HEW Secretary Joseph A. Califano says only 12 percent of prescriptions now specify a drug's generic name. "If one of five physicians uses this guide to cut the cost of prescriptions by 10 percent," he says, "that would save consumers \$120 million a year in prescription drug costs."
