COVENTRY - Residents and school officials have expressed opposition to a proposal to build a garage or town-owned property behind Coventry High School. Town officials said the present facility on Main Street is in a deteriorated condition and not suitable for renovation because the lot is undersized and is located at the base of a steep hill.

Last year townspeople rejected a proposal to buy land on Talcott Hill Road for a new garage. This year the council appointed a Public Works Study Committee, which also recommended the use of Town Planner Gregory Padick and Sanitarian Donald

Holmes chose the Ripley Hill Road site as the "only suitable centrally located" place for a town garage. 
