Wizened Potatoes Deserve Some Attention

By RUSS MacKENDRICK The collecting of wizened potatoes is not as idespread as that of buttons, or beads or beer cans. However, an extraordinary example recently found behind a stack of books under my cellar stairs deserves attention.

At first glance it seemed to be a dead mouse, but it turned out to be a tiny indomitable spud that had put out a total of 88 in ches of sprout before desiccation set in. It seemed only fair to give the abandoned tuber a chance for a happier ending, so it was kept warm and moist in a flower pot for a few weeks; but it had really given up the ghost. With philately-so often in this column, it was natural to look for potatoes on stamps. A skim through some numbers of "Topical Time" showed nothing. The next try was to check Scott's Catalogue for the countries that are the most potato-minded. These are Russia, Poland and West Germany with production of 95, 48 and 20 million tons in a recent year. (The United States had only 14 million tons for the

same period.) None of these nations showed the potato any respect. Russia had a family member, the nightshade, and some edibles such as wild servies and mushrooms. In 1961 they had stamps with apple-picking and grainharvesting, but no potatodigging. They show orchids and pretty flowers, but nowhere
