Peace Treaty

Israeli Foreign Minister Moshe Dayan said Friday a peace treaty with Egypt "has been completed" and should be signed by the Dec. 17 deadline without the changes demanded by Egypt.
Dayan, winding up a three-day visit to Switzerland, reiterated Israel's rejection of the changes in the draft peace treaty demanded by Egypt.
He said Israel insisted on the "national right" to establish new Jewish settlements on the West Bank of Jordan and that the treaty with Egypt must take priority over all previous obligations Cairo has to its Arab neighbors.

Cultist Indicted

GEORGETOWN, Guyana (UPI) — Peoples Temple cultist Larry Layton was indicted Friday for the slayings of U.S. Rep. Leo J. Ryan, D-Calif., and four other Americans that triggered the death orgy of the Rev. Jim Jones and more than 900 of his followers.
In San Francisco, a federal grand jury Friday began hearing evidence which could lead to U.S. prosecution of some surviving members of the cult. The secret session will continue in an unusual Saturday session.

UI Rate Hike

HARTFORD (UPI) — The state Public Utilities Control Authority Friday tentatively approved a \$16.2 million rate hike for United Illuminating Co., about one-half of the increase sought by the electric company.
The 31 PUCVA vote to allow the increase climaxed weeks of deliberations that centered over the firm's efforts to sink millions into the controversial Seabrook, N.H., nuclear power plant now under construction.

Gasoline Rules

WASHINGTON (UPI) — A proposal to deregulate the price of gasoline — and let pump prices rise despite anti-inflation goals — is under serious study and may be sent to Congress next month, administration officials said Friday.
The officials said the move to give energy needs priority over inflation control in this one area could lead to retail price increases of 2 to 4 cents a gallon on top of the smaller rise expected when world petroleum exporters raise crude oil prices later this month.

Stock Market

NEW YORK (UPI) — Stocks, shunning the government's report of a better job picture, fell for the second consecutive session Friday as investor concern deepened over repercussions of Iran's civil strife. Trading was slow.
The Dow Jones industrial average, up more than a point at the outset, lost 4.24 points to 811.85. The blue-chip indicator, a 5.81-point loser Thursday, added 0.35 point for the week overall.
The New York Stock Exchange index dropped 0.24 to 54.06 and the price of a share shed 13 cents. The American Stock Exchange index slipped 0.33 to 151.16 and the price of a share eased 3 cents.

Golda Meir Dies; Didn't See Peace

JERUSALEM (UPI) — Golda Meir, the Russian-born, American-educated grandmother who led Israel through its darkest wartime hours, died Friday at the age of 80.
The feisty, chain-smoking former prime minister who was one of the founders of Israel succumbed to a form of blood cancer she had battled secretly for more than 12 years.
Death came at 4:30 p.m. (9:30 a.m. EST) at the Hadassah Hospital in Jerusalem.
In a death scene that was the possible signing of a peace treaty with Egypt — the dream Mrs. Meir once told Egyptian President Anwar Sadat she prayed she would live to see come true.
Hospital officials listed no official cause of death.
Medical sources said Mrs. Meir had first contracted cancer of the blood "about 12 or 13 years ago," which would have been during her term as prime minister, and had undergone treatment in and out of hospitals for the past decade.
The state-run Israel radio announced the former schoolteacher's death at the onset of the Jewish Sabbath and funeral arrangements were to be detailed until after the holy day ended Saturday evening.

The appointment came amid widespread rumor of her recurring illness and her critics charged Israel needed more than an ailing grandmother.
Batting the cancer she kept a secret, Mrs. Meir steered Israel through a two-year war of attrition with Egypt and then, finally, the bloody 1973 conflict in which the Arabs caught the Israelis by surprise.
Throughout it all, she developed a reputation as a ruthless negotiator who turned her gray-haired grandmotherly demeanor to deadly advantage.
The October 1973 war took its toll. She and her defense minister, Moshe Dayan, the one-eyed hero of the 1967 six-day war, faced bitter criticism they had not done enough to meet the threat of an Arab invasion.
Exhausted by the war and criticism, and her illness growing, Golda retired in April 1974, saying this time it was for good.
But, when asked what she would do in the future, she testily replied, "Well, I'm not going into a nunnery."
One of her last major public appearances was at the Knesset for the historic visit by Sadat and his appeal for peace. She met and shook hands with the Egyptian president, who had been her arch-enemy during the 1973 war and said:
"You always called me an old lady. I want to live to see that day of peace."

Rate of Jobless Still 5.8 Percent

WASHINGTON (UPI) — The nation's unemployment rate remained at 5.8 percent in November, at least temporarily confounding forecasts that rising interest rates will create increased joblessness.
Friday's monthly report by the Bureau of Labor Statistics showed nationwide unemployment rates were the same in November as in October, when they descended to their lowest point in four months.
In an appearance at a congressional Joint Economic Committee hearing, the bureau's acting commissioner, Janet Norwood, refused to comment on predictions by the AFL-CIO and the U.S. Chamber of Commerce that higher interest rates and administration budget-cutting plans would worsen the employment picture.
"I am not prepared to speculate what might happen," she told Sen. Lloyd Bentsen, D-Texas, who mentioned those forecasts.
Bentsen persevered, asking if there was any trend in current figures that would indicate higher un-

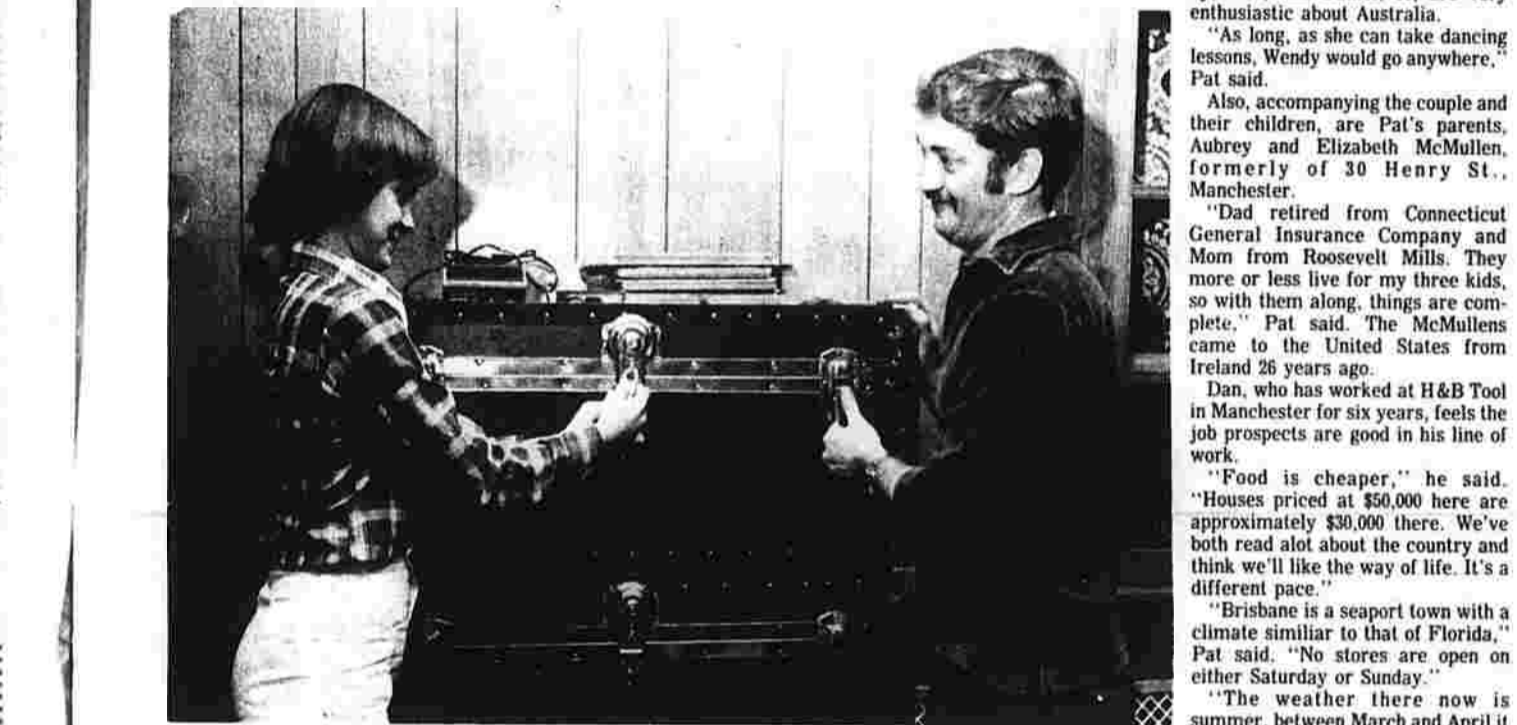

HARTFORD (UPI) — The State Bond Commission decided Friday it will hold a special hearing in January to consider Hartford's request for \$750,000 to design the controversial downtown skywalk. The day before the commission's meeting, Gov. Ella Grasso's budget chief Anthony Milano removed the skywalk proposal from the panel's agenda. He said he was informed by the Department of Transportation that a public hearing had not been held on the matter.

"I think there was erroneous information the state received," said Hartford City Council member Richard Suisman, who attended Friday's meeting. He said no public hearing was necessary on the design phase of the \$8 million pedestrian walkway project.

Suisman and his fellow council member William DiBella said the design award is needed so the city can produce a plan that the public can respond to at a later date. "It's an important project to the city," Suisman said. "I'm not surprised there are a lot of questions."

Friday's meeting was also attended by members of the Hartford Area Rally Together, who recently wrote Mrs. Grasso, Bond Commission members and legislators to express their opposition to the project.

The group feels public transportation for the elderly and the handicapped is more important than a skywalk for downtown. "We think that any project involving expenditures of this size and having such an adverse effect upon neighborhoods of Hartford must be given the most careful consideration," the letter said.

The group told the commission they were concerned that once the city got the design money, the public would be able to stop further work on the project. Sen. Lawrence DeNardis, R-Hartford and a Bond Commission member, was concerned that the proposed skywalk does not technically qualify for state transportation funds because it is not a road.

At the urging of Mrs. Grasso, the Bond Commission finally decided the best thing to do was to call a Jan. 5 hearing to deal with the sticky issue. "We'll be having a public hearing is what it boils down to," Milano said after the meeting. "I think the public was best served by removing that item (the skywalk) from the agenda."

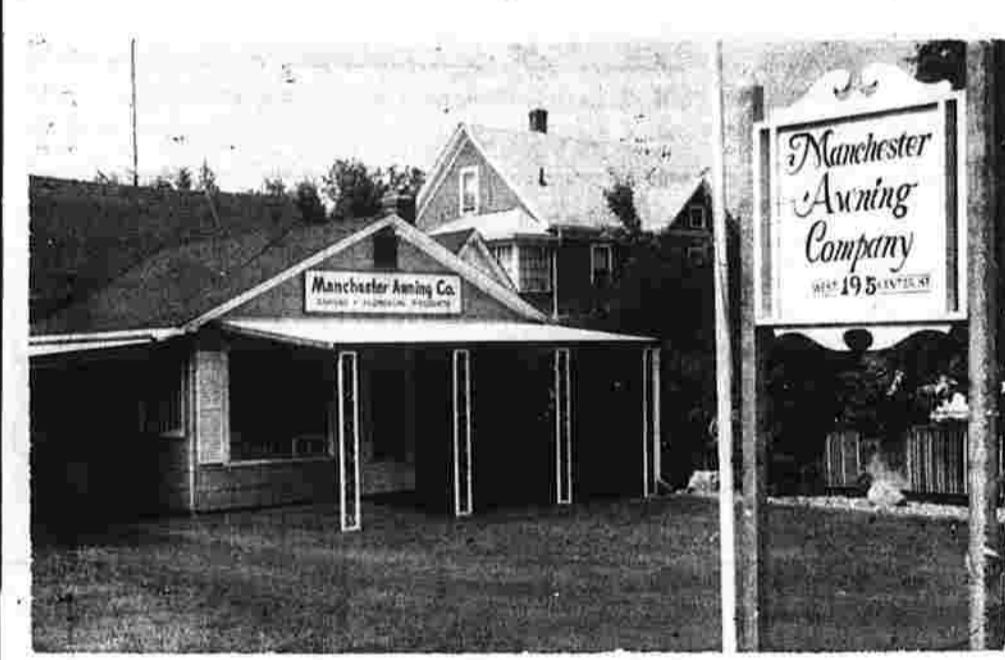
