Athletic Recruiting Violations To Be Probed by Army Officials

dent of the United States Military Academy appointed the head of the school's law department Friday to investigate charges of widespread athletic recruiting violations made by Homer Smith, who was dismissed as Army's football coach two weeks ago.

Smith, who first brought his allegations to the Academy's attention on Dec. 13, 1977, revealed the charges publicly Thursday night and accused the Academy of covering up the original investigation made a year ago.

Lieut. Gen. Andrew Goodpaster, the Academy superintendent, named Col. Robert Berry, director of the Academy's department of law, to head a

probe into Smith's allegations and a review of last vear's investigation. "Academy officials believe most of the charges were contained in a report of December 1977," said Lieut. Col. Jere Forbus, an Academy spokesman "The cumulative results of Berry's investigation will be provided to the NCAA."

Smith, who compiled a 21-33-1 record in five years as Army's head football coach, included among his charges that Army illegally tried out prospective hockey and basketball players; exceeded by as many as 50 the maximum number of on-campus visits for football recruits allowed by the NCAA; gave an illegal proportion of prep-school scholarships to athletes; allowed players to use athletic department telephone credit cards for per-

exceeded by three or four the number of off-campus recruiters permitted by the NCAA. A spokesman at the NCAA's headquarters in Shawnee Mission, Kan., said Smith's accusations would be reviewed. "Apparently there were some problems with the

sophistication of our accounting procedures concerning the recruiting program and we took corrective action where it was needed," Forbus said, "But I think we're probably in super shape as far as the NCAA goes. There were partial mistakes made but none that constituted an advantage over another school. I don't think we're in any violation of NCAA Forbus said the officer who headed the original investigation, Col. Edward Hart, has left the

Smith, 47, was fired Dec. 4, two days after Navy beat Army for the fourth time in Smith's five years as coach and also two days after Smith's brother. Dean, was killed in an automobile accident near



The theme of the angel's song was "peace on earth to men of

When they had grown to manhood, both of these great teachers proclaimed, in their words and by their lives, the beauty of love, brotherhood, and peace. Their voices faded into silence long, long ago. But the world remembered them, overlaid their human grandeur with divine honors, loved them for the beauty of their ideals, and falled to flow them in fact.

Sadly, a modern dreamer sings, "Under the woes of sin and strife, the world has suf-fered long. Beneath the angels' song have rolled 2,000years of wrong. And man at war with man hears not the love songs that they bring. Ohl Hush your noise, ye men o strife. and hear the angels sing."

The music of the ideal is lovely and gives lift to the faltering footsteps of life.

Prophets and poets and seers splash the pages of history with splendor. But under the music and over the graves of the prophets, the people march, obedient to the hardfaced taskmasters-custom, tradition, authority, and power. Over and over again, with nonotonous rhythm, when good old customs began to corrupt the world, when tradition became stagnant, when authority grew arrogant, when power turned to cruelty and op-pression, the convulsive forces of revolt shattered the old order in an agony of waste and blood. But the blunt fingers of brute force were never able to weave the delicate cultural fabrics of brotherhood and peacs. Yet always the star of hope and the music of the unattained prophetic ideal lured from the far horizon

Too long have we waited for intelligence and good will to lead us along straight paths to the era of creative comradeship and lasting peace. Today, too many million the world's people sit in sorrow and desolation - haunted by hunger, tormented by fear. This is a time for greatness, for nobility of spirit; time to break the bonds of our selfishness, to abandon the good which is the enemy of the better, to dedicate heart and mind to the age-old human task — the building of a world in which no man will be hungry or friendless, no life wasted or lost.

The strange thing about our Christmas celebration is that, while we are supposed to be celebrating Christmas, we don't celebrate either the day or the place or the year of Jesus' birth. He was not born on the twenty-fifth of December. That was the birthday of Mithra, the invincible sun, who was reborn on that day. He was not born at Bethlehem, but at Nazareth. And he was born, the scholars now think, about 4 B.C. Nobody was very much interested in the birthday of Jesus for about two or three centuries. Bishop His polytus suggested, about the middle of the fourth century, that January 2 was probably the date. March 17 or 18, April 27 or 28, and May 20 have also been suggested. From the very beginning, the Armenian Church was celebrating January 6. And until A.D. 549, the Christian Church in Jerusalem celebrated January 6 as Jesus' birthday. Actually, the Mithraism threatened Christianity.

Most of the early converts to Christianity were pagan, and they had been used to the great winter solstice celebration. The Roman Saturnalia was a gorgeous celebration where everything was relaxed. All the old traditions and rituals and routines were suspended. Schools were all closed. Punishments were lifted or relaxed. Slaves were freed, temporarily; their masters served them at table. There was feating, rejoicing, gembling, giving of gifts. The last day of Saturnalia, Brumalia, was the time for the exchange of gifts. Everybody of the old pagen order exchanged gifts as we do still. And for children, they made toys - usually, clay dolls

, of course, was for the church to Christianize that celebra tion. They did it all over Europe. In one of the ceremonies, the northerners drank themselves into helplesaness. The church tried to stop it, but they could not. So they said, "If you drink the first gobiet to Christ, it will be approved." This is what they did a his solstice calebration. They identified the old ceremonials that belonged to the turning of the year, the end of the darkness, the shortest day of the year, the longest night of the year. All over Europe, there were these celebrations. Elements were accumulated from

The creche-the baby in the cradie-was not related to Jesus either. It was a celebration of the birth of Adonis in the cave. It was a favorite mid-winter calebration one of the emperesses and so was quite important. The coming of the wise men to see the baby in the cradle was common to the celebration of this period of the year in India, and in Buddhism. There is a story about his throwing gold pieces through a doorway where there were three girls who were desperately anxious to get married, but who had no downles. When he became a bishop, e saved his country from famine by a miraculous transfer of grain from ships carrying i off to Egypt. This was Nicholas, St. Nicholas, Santa Claus, the patron saint of Russia He was also the patron saint of sallors, and of thieves, and of children, and of virgins. But the special thing about him was that he was the gift bringer. In France, they altered it a little. The Noel saint brought gifts to good children, but he had a friend who walked with him always and left bundles of switches for bad children. In England at Christmastime, they used to serve a suckling pig with an apple in his mouth. That is from a celebration an old goddess of fertility. It was part of her feast which was to guarantee the harvest of the new year. Santa Claus became the patron saint of almost all of Europe. The important thing, of course, about this caremony, is that it is a ceremony celebrating renewal of life. It is a ceremony which celebrates the new year, the new life of another year, a new hope, light after darkness, life after death. That is the symbolism is

We don't need to have that now. All these ills may be quickly cured. We don't need to wait for a coming millennium to achieve it. So I am going to suggest certain joys of living which we may identify with the Christmas symbol: new life, renewal of hope, renewal of the light of the world. And my first symbol—joy — is the joy of physical fulfillment. Now that is controlled. ment. Now that is pretty old. From the very beginning, man has been trying to find a way of living satisfactorily in this world. It goes back to the primeval ages when man struggled for just a bare existence, in a world he didn't understand and couldn't master, among other forms of life also struggling to find a foothold. This is a very simple request. All that physical fulfillment calls for is food, shelter, clothing, sex satisfaction, safety, security. These are simple, fundamental things, lan't it rather allly that we should have to be worrying about these anywhere now, in this age of the world? They are fundament of course. Unless you have this firm foundation of physical fulfillment, there is no us trying to build any of the higher values of culture. But this age has been called an age of

imitiess abundance. Don't you think it's ridiculous that we should be worried today about the very same things that troubled primitive man a million years ago?

I want Christmas to symbolize the realization of that joy and of the still higher joy of personal development — the development of all of the powers of the individual through education, through knowledge, and through character. A man who has knowledge can never be bored. Life will always be a thrilling experience for him. Some persons find life to be full of interest and excitement because they know the birds or the flowers or the stars or the primarie or the increase. stars or the animals or the insects. Knowledge is exciting. But the great vists, of course, is to be able to sweep your eyes over the long pligrimage of man through time and to follow the panorams of the great cultures of the world as they have developed, until you become a citizen of all the ages and of all the lands. That really is a great joy! Just imagine being able to wander down the centuries and stop off for a day's conversation with Socrates or with dreamy Chuang-tze or, perhaps, with practical, old, hard-headed Confucius or with Gautama Buddha or with the lyrical, laughing Hafiz. (You haven't lived until

you know Hafiz.) This would always give lift to life.

There is great happiness just in knowledge. But when you ge that — when education gives you emancipation, when you acquire poles and self-control and readiness to face a problem and a scientific attitude which keeps you free from slavery to intolerance or discrimination, or any of these hateful things, and obtain kindness and generosity and lovableness — then you become a real enjoyer of living. When you meet your friends and companions with kindliness, and understanding, and generosity, and honesty, and frankness, then you know what a joy of living really is. Then you become a lovable, winsome person. And those of you who are that kind of person know how marvelous it is, when you enter a room, to have all eyes light up with happiness at your coming. This joy, I think, I can list as part of the hope of the Christmas time.

I want more. I want the joy of comradeship, too. The warm intimate friendliness of people is really one of the deepest experiences of joy we can know. The old prophets were perfectly right when they identified the good with love and sympathy and generoelty and justice and loyalty and friendly self-sacrifice for others. Think of the times when by and justice and loyalty and friendly self-sacrifice for others. Think of the times when lives were inyou have experienced the keenest joy. Were they not always when lives were intertwined, when persons were so united with each other that there was that warm glow
— the clingling hands of little children; the devoted love of a mother; the eyes full of
starlight of lovers; the devoted consecration of men to a cause; the loyalty of research
workers striving together to push out the circle of light against chaos and the dark by finding new truths; the readiness, if necessary, to die together for the common good? No
one needs to wait for this joy of comradeship. We can have it always in the primary group. We can make the group right around us, closest to us, a place of happiness and joy just by these characteristics — qualities of friendliness and love. Add, then, to the

Christmas symbol, the joy of comradeship.

But I want more, I want the joy of creative work. Of course, we cannot all be greated to the course. scientists. All of us are not going to have our names inscribed on great monuments o chiseled in gold plate to last for centuries. But all of us have a share in helping the marci forward of humanity. And every one of us is going to leave his mark through all the future ages in the texture of the social structure. So, I add creative work. Of course, the quest for truth of the scientist is the high point, and the search of the artist for beauty is another high point. But the whole quest of knowledge through the sges has been an epic in which man is a hero. Think of what we have done. We not only have mastered nature, not only have laid the reins of control over earth and air and see, not only are w measuring and tracing and cataloging the stars, not only are we making motion pictures of the intricacles of the inner workings of the cell, but we are pushing out against pain and maladjustment and suffering and all kinds of disease, it is a wonderful thing to have a share in this creative activity. So, let's have that.

Now, what have I put down? The joy of physical living, the joy of character, personal dayslopment, the joy of constitutions of constitutions.

development, the joy of comradeship, the joy of creative work. Can't we say that without being extravagant? Without building grandiose, glorious, unrealizable dreams? Mind you, I'm sure that that great dream is going to be realized — as soon as we get these old fogles out of the way. They are still hobbled by their traditional habits and attitudes. I know that that good world is coming, if we don't blow ourselves up before then.

But now we have these. Moreover, Christmas is the time of festival for children

And they are always fresh, always new. Each new generation comes, fresh, unspoiled, eager for a life experience. If only we could surround them with a cultural environment which would develop in them the love of beauty and comradeship and creative work, the world could be lifted swiftly to higher heights — heights better than we have ever dreamed may be. These little ones are so eager, so keen, so enxious for experience, and so amazingly intelligent, it seems a tragedy that this childleh sagerness and keeness, this outreaching, should be quickly dulied and dimmed by the educational and social conditioning into which they have come. social conditioning into which they have come.



strain on two normal young people who have a strong physical attraction for each other. Explain that this attraction is usually equated with love -- but don't put it down and


tion is usually equated with love—but don't put it down and say it's only puppy love.




