Reaction from lawmakers was swift. The Legislature must come up with a final school funding plan by May 1. Senate President Pro Tem Joseph Fauliso, D-Hartford said, "There's no way you can get that through th Legislature. No responsible legislator wants to give up what his town is already getting."

The board's action would mean a reduction of that portion of the minimum grant earmarked for 27 communities in a complicated formula approved last month by the advisory panel.

In the spring of 1977, the state Supreme Court declared Connecticut's system of financing education un-constitutional, because it relied too much on local property taxes. The high court decided children in affluent communities were most likely getting better educational opportunities than students from property poor towns. This year, the advisory panel recommended the state double its current aid over the next five years. But, the special task force decided the only way the formula could

get through the Legislature was to guarantee that each town would not lose money it is now getting. This meant even the state's wealthiest communities would receive at least \$250 per pupil. But, the state board Wednesday decided to remove the minimum state grant from the formula over the next five years.

Affected most by the cut would be wealthy communities in Fairfield County, such as Greenwich, New Canaan, Westport, Ridgefield, Darien, and New Fairfield. Under the board's recommendation, the state's most affluent communities would lose \$10 million over five years.

The cutback would affect Darien the most, reducing its \$250 per pupil grant to zero at the beginning of the fifth year of the program.

The board also voted to recomend current funding for special education programs instead of the panel's recommended phase-in of \$50 million in equal installments over a 10-year period.

To soften the harshness and add a glow to the home a fire dancing in the fireplace helps break the chill.

Falling temperatures are making an evening spent in front of a crackling fire increasingly appealing. To make sure that glow from your fireplace will last all winter it is necessary to buy your cord or so of wood and store it properly. Try and keep your wood dry. Seasoned firewood (dry), will ignite easier and burn cleanly.

A cord of wood is 128 cubic feet measuring in a stack 4 ft. x 4 ft. x 8 ft. If you have not purchased your firewood yet, here are some firewood ratings from the U.S. Forest Service.

Excellent: Apple, ash, beech, birch, dogwood, hard maple, hickory, locust, mesquite, oaks, Pacific madrone, pecan.

Good: Alder, cherry, soft maple, walnut Good, but smoky: Douglas fir, Southern yellow pine.

Fair, but good for kindling: Aspen, basswood, cottonwood, yellow poplar, Eastern redcedar, Western redcedar, white cedar, Eastern white pine, ponderosa pine, sugar pine, Western white pine, true firs, spruce.

Fair: Elm, gum, sycamore, cypress, redwood, lauch, tamarack.

The Forest Service suggests combining easily ignited softwoods and long-lasting hardwoods in the fireplace. Then, once the fire is started, add your larger logs to keep the fire burning longer.


