After all, "Edward the King," which premieres on Jan. 17 , is a life-long ac-
count of the monarch for count of the monarch for The 13-part series has been syndicated nationally. Be sure to check your local listings for broadcast time and station.
"Edward the King" is based on the widely-acclaimed biography by Sir
Philip Magnus. A full year in the making, this British inport won seven awards when it aired on the BBC in England.
The lush costumes and gorgeous sets are no shock. The series was made with otal cooperation from the British government - including access to the royal palaces and residents, mits to actors and cameras.
Buckingham Palace at Windsor, Osborne House Sandringham and historic sites such as St. George's hapel, Windsor, and St. Paul's Cathedral are the backdrops for Timothy West, who plays King Edwho and Annette Crosbie, who plays his mother, Both West and

Victoria's death made Edward king, but he reigned for less than a decade before his death put an end to a richly
colorful life.
Through the 13 hour-long episodes pass internation-ally-known figures who played vital roles in world history, including Disraeli stone, Palmerston, Kaiser tone, Palmerston, Kaiser
Wilhelm II, Winston Churchill, and such immortal theatrical stars as Marie Lloyd and Lillie angtry.
Timothy West faces the challenge of portraying Edward from the age of 22 to almost 70. Obviously,

Torecasts indicate 24.24 per. cent of all U.S. households will adopt CB radio by 1983 . That's an almost 38 percent increase over current usage estimated at 17.6 percent.
So, the bureau feels success of the new personal radio service is assured.
