An internal memo gently reminds GSA's procurement officers of what they might reasonably have been expected to know all along. "We believe," Babione wrote, "that price should have been given some consideration."

With an attitude like that, Babione clearly has his work cut out for him riding herd on the cavalier spendthrifts of GSA.
