It will be a 15-cent com-memorative in shades of brown, intaglio printed, showing youngsters from the four corners of the earth. The "Child" is meant to draw attention to the declaration of the United Nations General Assembly making 1979 "a year of concern for the present condition and future

well-being of the world's children." This production seems to be jumping the gun on ar issue with the same theme that has been announced by the United Nations Postal Administration for release on May 4. It will be a bigger deal than ours with two New York and two Geneva stamps plus a souvenir sheet. The well-known UNICEF will be the lead agency for coordinating the activities of the International Year of the Child (IYC), whose aim is to bring disadvantaged children "into the stream of progress and enable them t take part fully in the development of their societies. New Rabies Vaccine Said Great Advance ATLANTA (UPI) - A new rables vaccine that may be

licensed for general use in this country by late summer is being hailed as a great advance by a researcher at the national Center for Disease Control. Within rabies research, I think it is one of the most significant advances since the Pasteur treatment," said

Dr. William Winkler, chief of the CDC's respiratory and special pathogens branch. He said development of the vaccine, which is made from human cell tissue and produces few, if any, reactions, means that more people who have been exposed to rables will get the vaccine. It also means better protec-

tion for laboratory workers who work with the rabies The vaccine will replace the current product made with duck embroyo, to which many people are allergic. And instead of the 23 painful shots required with the old vaccine, given variously in the abdomen, hip, and lower back, the new vaccine will be administered only five times in the shoulder.


Winkler said about 35,000 people seek treatment to protect them against rabies each year in this country, mostly children bitten by animals suspected of being rabid. The vaccine had been available through the CDC on a limited, experimental basis for treatment of any person bitten by a rabid animal and to research personnel at very high risk to rabies virus. But Winkler said production has stopped until it is

licensed, creating a shortage. The vaccine is now available through the CDC only to persons allergic or non-responsive to the duck embryo vaccine. Studies have shown that the vaccine provides a high degree of protection against rabies and has a low rate of







Board Hears Complaints On Vernon Sewer Bills

Herald Reporter VERNON - It would cost about \$100 in all to install a water meter for each Vernon resident who uses the sewage treatment facility, but this wouldn't solve all of the town's problems as to equitable sewer user charges.

The Water Pollution Control Authority Thursday night discussed complaints from users concerning the bills they just received which were estimated to cover the past six

months The bills were sent out and are payable Feb. 15 because the town needed the money to cover the cost of running the new sewage treatment plant. The users had been forewarned that the charges would go up considerably to pay for operation of the plant but some don't feel that the charges are being figured fairly.

Some residents said they feel it would be fairer to have water meters installed and then they would be charged only for the amount discharged into the sewer system







FILMETER A capsule look at cinema

INVASION OF THE BODY SNATCHERS (PG) - Donald Satherland, Brooke Adams, Leonard Nimoy, Science fiction/hor-rer. A remake — really a sequel — of the classic 1956 film. For once, a re-make (or sequel) is as good as the original. This is a totally scarry, but very logical and intelligent, story, and done with great taste and skill. GRADE: A.

LORD OF THE RINGS (PG) — Animated lantasy. J.R.R. Tolkien's works come to the screen, animated by Raiph Bakshi of "Fritz the Cat" fame. If you are familiar with Tolkien's creations—habbits, black horsemen and the rest—this could be exciting. But if you're not, it's gibberish. The art work is beautiful, but the story is impossible for aliens to follow. And Caution—animated or not, it is so violent that it's not for kids. GRADE; B for Tolkien fans: D for the rest of us.

MOMENT BY MOMENT (R) — Lily Tomlin, John Travolta. Romance. "Hour By Hour" would be a better title, because this seems endless. It is the old cliche of the rich lady and the young, brash kid. It proceeds at a snail's pace and even the snail is bored. Poorly acted (except by Travolta) and directed. GRADE: Cominus.

MOVIE, MOVIE (G) — George C. Scott, Trish VanDevere, Red Buttons. Comedy, musical. Double-bill sainte-cum-spoof of '30s and '40s fight films and musicals that has it all down pat, right down to the last cliche. You can still get the real thing on the late show, but this is worth a few chuckles and a tap dance down memory lane, GRADE: B. (O'Brien)

OLIVER'S STORY (PG) — Ryan O'Neal, Candice Bergen, Ray Milland. Romantic drama. This glibly written sequel to "Love Story" has a warm performance by Candice Bergen. But the plight of two rich young lovers does not tend to conjure. up depth of feeling. A film with not much on its mind. GRADE: C. (Miller)

SUPERMAN (PG) — Christopher Reeve, Gene Hackman, Ned Beatty, Jackie Cooper, Margot Kidder, Valerie Perrine, Marton Brando. Adventure. Big, lavish, expensive — and designed just for fun and frolic. This story of Superman's arrival on Earth and his first anti-crime campaigns starts slowly but closes with a rush.

And it is all done tongue-in-cape, so that the whole family can find something to enjoy in it. It's not art, but it sure is entertainment.

GRADE: B-plus.
