

Projected Loss

WASHINGTON (UPI) -California, whose Gov. Edmund G. Brown Jr. is a prime move for constitutional amendment requiring a balanced federal budget, would lose \$3.5 billion dollars in 1980 alone if it were

In fact, all of the states considering calling for such an amendment were warned Sunday hat they would be among the big losers if it happened. Rep. David Obey, D-Wis., head

of a House Budget Committee task force studying the move to limit federal spending, wrote the governor of each of the 50 states to suggest how much federal noney each might lose if the oudget were balanced in 1980.

California's loss would be the biggest. Obey said New York could lose \$3.3 billion, and Florida, Georgia, Illinois, Massachusetts, Michigan, New Jersey, Ohio, Pennsylvania and Texas each could lose more than

Obey arrived at these figures by taking the \$83 billion state and local governments are projected to receive from Washington in 1980 and scaling them back to their 1975 levels.

Dollar Lower

LONDON (UPI) - The dollar opened the week lower on all the European money markets today, but the price of gold jumped about \$250 an ounce.

Gold opened \$4.25 higher in London at \$250.625 and was up \$2.75 in Zurich at \$250,375.

On the currency markets, the dollar opened at \$1.8520 marks in Frankfurt down from 1.8535 and in Zurich it was 1.6675 Swiss francs down from 1.6715 Friday night. In Amsterdam the median dollar rate was 2,0010 guilders, down

The dollar opened at 4.2700 francs in Paris, down from 4.2755 and in Brussels the rate eased to 29.635 Belgian francs from 29.695 at the weekend. In Milan the dollar was quoted at 839.20 lira against 840.55 Friday night.

The U.S. currency hled steady on the Tokyo market in Monday's trading, closing at 200.40 yen compared with 200.45 Friday.

Chinese Advance Meets Opposition

By ALAN DAWSON BANGKOK, Thailand (UPI) -

Vietnam said today its forces killed huge numbers of Chinese invaders in battles on town streets and in

monitored in Bangkok, said that in two days of fighting Vietnamese troops killed 3,500 Chinese soldiers, destroyed 80 tanks and routed 12 Chinese battalions. China's invasion force has stopped

six miles deep in Vietnamese territory, but military analysts said they were unsure if Peking ordered its troops to halt or if the attack was thrown back by Vietnamese defenders.

In a related development, a Vietnamese official in Bangkok indicated his nation would not call for direct Soviet intervention but said Vietnam appreciates Russia's moral support, including a demand the Chinese withdraw "before it's too late."

Intelligence officers said the 3-dayold invasion had left Chinese forces in control of two district capitals and scores of small villages, as the Peking troops pushed six miles into Vietnam on highways and trails across the 450-umile frontier.

The dispatch quoted Teng as saying, "The combat action this time is a limited one and retaliation for provocations (by Vietnam). It will not drag on or expand in any form." Teng rejeterated that China has no

Except for a Chinese claim that Vietnamese warplanes had bombed railway stations, schools and a rubber plantation, there was no further indication of the actual targets of what intelligence sources called "heavy air activity by both sides."

Intelligence sources said overall military activity along the border was relatively light today, but ceiat eleavy fighting was reported. Intelligence sources said the initial Chinese drive was fast and quickly overran territory until it stopped six miles deep into Vietnam.

The intelligence sources said the Chinese push across the rugged frontier chased Vietnamese border and village defenders southward within hours. Diplomatic reports from Vietnam said "thousands" of refugees were fleeing the Chinese.

Palestinian Forces Get Iranian Refuge

TEHRAN, Iran (UPI) — The new Islamic government today officially turned over the abandoned Israeli diplomatic mission to PLO chief of government marshals. No major incidents were reported.

WASHINGTON (UPI) - The United States, which was burned once in Southeast Asia, is adopting a low-profile approach to the new Indochina conflict.

The administration said Sunday the president's top security advisers have drafted a set of cautious principles for guiding U.S. reaction to the Chinese invasion of Vietnam.

Under the guidelines, the United States would avoid any direct involvement in the conflict, but would work behind the scenes to keep the invasion from escalating into a fullscale Sino-Soviet confrontation.

President Carter spent the weekend at Camp David, but conferred with Secretary of State Cyrus Otherwise, he said, the United Vance and national security adviser Zbigniew Brzezinski at Andrews Air Force Base Sunday afternoon about developments in Southeast Asia. Vance, Brzezinski, Vice President Walter Mondale and Deputy Defense Secretary Charles Duncan met at the White House earlier in the day to dis-

A White House official said the session resulted in five principles for a low-key U.S. policy toward Southeast Asia:

-The United States will not become directly involved in a conflict involving Asian communist nations.

-America's immediate interests are not threatened although Washington is concerned about a possible widening of the conflict.

The United States will use all its diplomatic, political and moral influence to encourage China's withdrawal from Vietnam and Vietnam's pullout from Cambodia, and to

prevent widening of the war such as through the intervention of the Soviets.

-America does not believe the security of its allies is immediately threatened, but is consulting with its friends about a possible threat to the stability of the region. -The United States is working

with other nations to seek the withdrawal of the Chinese from Vietnam and the Vietnamese from Cambodia.

Despite concern about a possible Sino-Soviet clash, American officials were said to doubt the Kremlin's armed forces would actually come to the aid of ally Vietnao.

High Court Calls Death Law Cruel

PROVIDENCE, R.I. (UPI) - The Rhode Island Supreme Court today struck down the state's mandatory death penalty law, calling it a violation of the Eighth Amendment's ban

on cruel and unusual punishment. Rhode Island law mandated "death refused. by lethal gas" for inmates or prison escapees convicted or murder while serving sentences for other offenses. It was hurriedly passed by the Legislature in 1973 after a prison guard was stabbed to death.
