The president never seemed to appreciate the Saudi predicament. As the Saudis saw it, hostile forces were closing in on their oil treasure from all sides. To the west, Sovietsupported Cuban troops moved into Ethiopia. To the south, the Cuban mercenaries gained a foothold on the Arabian Peninsula in South Yemen To the north, both Israel and Iraq were viewed in Riyadh as unfriendly

Even within the Saudi borders, the vital oil fields along the Persian Gulf are inhabited largely by Shias, a minority Moslem sect. Saudi security forces have confiscated carloads of communist literature in Shia coun-

The Shias are powerful in both Iran and Iraq. So, the overthrow of the shah by a religious revolution set off warning signals in the Saudi palace It appeared to the Saudies that Carter had abandoned the shah to appease the revolutionaries. The Saudis began to worry that they might get the same treatment in case of an uprising against the monarchy. It seemed prudent to the royal family, therefore, to diversify their friendship and to court Arab militants. This led to a series of misunderstandings, which culminated in the cancellation of Crown Prince Fahd's visit to the United States - a cancellation which the White House tried to pass off as "health reasons" but which Saudi sources said was
