



MANCHESTER - A dozen Mill Street-area residents talked about problems ranging from watering eyes to gagging at a hearing Monday night for the Rogers Corp., which is requesting the installation of an incinerator at

The problems in the area, however, are not all caused by Rogers, and the addition of the incinerator actually will reduce the company's emissions into the air. representatives of the firm and the state Department of Environmental Protection said.

In fact, Rober Lee, manager of environmental engineering for Rogers, which has a plant on Mill Street. objected to the term incinerator. He said an incinerator is viewed as an uncontrolled burning device that emits noxious odors.

The firm's proposed equipment, which Lee called a thermal oxidizer, would be closely controlled. It also would cut down the emissions of hydrocarbons that are created by a production process started last August at the Mill Street plant, he said.

The installation of the oxidizer would allow for a threefold increase in production but would reduce the total hydrocarbon emission to less than 250 pounds per day. about one-third of the present emmissions, he said. Alfred Conklin, a senior air pollution control engineer for DEP, recommended installation of the equipment.

Residents of the area expressed concern about present conditions in the neighborhood. Fred Venzia of 5 N. Elm St. said he has experienced

odor problems at his home for more than a year. Lee pointed out that the new process, however, started late ast summer. Venezia wondered what would happen if the new process did not work. Concklin said the incinerator would

have to meet emission-control standards or the process would be closed down Venezia and Michael Dworkin, a Ludlow Road resident

and head of the Manchester Environmental Coalition. both said DEP should consider the entire air-quality picture in the area.
