Jarvis Comes to State With Tax Reform Ideas

By GREG PEARSON

Herald Reporter HARTFORD - Howard Jarvis, making his first state appearance since the passage of Proposition 13 in California, said a similar taxreduction effort will be organized in Connecticut and across the country. Jarvis. often affectionately referring to his California accomplishment as "13," spoke Thursday afternoon at a municipal finance forum held at the Hartford Hilton and sponsored by Connecticut Bank & Trust Co.

He has been touring the country since the passage last June of Proposition 13, which sets a limit on property taxes in California. Sounding like a full-blooded patriot as well as a tax reformer. Jarvis spoke about the necessity for such American rights as owning property and reducing taxes.

He said in pre-Proposition 13 California there were 7,500 propefrty foreclosures per month because of failure to pay taxes. He classified the foreclosures as "grand felony theft." "The people of California knew exactly what they were doing," he

Jarvis often used colorful language to describe what he considers the inefficiency in government. He talked about "putting a blow torch to the butt" of Congress and how California Gov. "If you want to limit government spending, the best thing to do is not to give them the money in the first place," he said.
