





VERNON - Because a state law enacted last July allows towns to establish their own tax relief programs, the Vernon Sewer Authority will allow senior citizens. eligible for tax relief, to defer payment of sewer assessments, indefinitely

Those eligible for tax relief have to be 65 or older and must have lived in Connecticut for at least five years. For single senior citizens the annual income can't exceed \$3. 00 and for a couple, \$6,000. The payment can be postponed indefinitely or until the

owner's death or the house is sold. The payment of the annual assessment alone or the assessment and the interest can be postponed. If interest ayments are postponed it would be compounded annual-Those eligible for the tax relief must apply for the

program by the end of this month in order to postpone assessment charges which are due now The proposal won't allow delaying payment of the charge to hook into the sewer lines as that charge is separate from the assessment charge. The Sewer Authority is hopeful that this move will

allow the elderly homeowners to keep their homes and if they do eventually sell them, money would be available. pay off the accumulated interest charges.
