





Panel Backs **Extra Taxes** On Big Cars

HARTFORD (UPI) - A legislative committee Friday voted to tax Connecticut residents who drive gas guzzling cars, while rewarding iomeowners and businesses who install solar energy systems. The Energy and Public Utilities ommittee acted favorably on most of the 20 bills contained in its energy package, which is designed to convince Connecticut citizens they are too dependent on foreign oil.

"I think the total package we have gotten out today is going to have a substantial impact on demand for energy in Connecticut in the near future." House chairman David Lavine, D-Derby, predicted. Lavine said the one bill that might have trouble is the proposed tax on
