





MANCHESTER - A junior high school enrollment study recently released by the school administration indicates a preliminary plan to shift more students over the next 10 years from Bennet to Illing Junior High and possibly close the Main Building at Bennet.

The shift will be necessary because of an expected decline of 717 students by 1989 in the junior high enrollment. according to Wilson E. Deakin, assistant superintendent of schools. The last five years of the 10-year estimate will have a dramatic decrease of 542 additional pupils because of projected declines in elementary enrollments. Deakin added



mine the rights of the school board to maintain quality education. He said the school board's requested increase was fully justified. The reduction recommended by the finance board brings the recommended education budget to \$1,142,897. The original request was \$1,206,579, an increase of \$107,-






