3 Charged In Slaying

HAMDEN (UPI) — Three men were charged with murder Friday in the gangland-style shooting death last year of a former Shelton man who played a hit man in the movie "The Godfather," police said.

The three men — one the son of a former Hamden town clerk — were arrested on warrants issued by a Superior Court judge Thursday after a grand jury called in the death of Norman Bacchiocchi returned murder indictments against them.

Mark Luteri, 39, Robert Racino, 35, and Anthony Puccio, 36, all of Hamden, were arraigned in Meriden and their cases were transferred to New Haven Superior Court. Racino is the son of a former town clerk.

The three were ordered held on \$50,000 bond each at the New Haven Corrections Center.

Bacchiocchi, 35, was found shot to death last year in West Rock Park. A California resident, he was in Connecticut visiting his father who lives in Shelton, police said.

He was reportedly in the state to arrange junket trips to Las Vegas. Police have said Bacchiocchi had known ties to organized crime figures.

The grand jury's proceedings were unusual since such panels usually consider indictments after arrests have been made.

The jury was called in New Haven after Superior Court Judge William L. Hadden Jr. conducted a one-man grand jury investigation into the slaying and issued a report naming the three men.

Some Interest Seen In Coupon Rations

WASHINGTON (UPI) Some congressmen said Friday energy problems have stirred their interest into a "let's do something" fervor that could revive congressional discussion to coupon rationing of gasoline.

They said their visits home during the Independence Day holiday brought them considerable discussion of fuel problems.

Rep. John Dingell, D-Mich., said his energy subcommittee will begin work next week on a possible compromise between a Senate-passed mandatory conservation bill and a proposal by some House members for one "Carless day" a week.

The Senate bill would set fuel conservation targets and let states try to meet them with their own plans. States that failed would be subject to a mandatory federal plan that could cover a wide range of requirements.

The House plan would also have the conservation targets, but the penalty for falling short would be forcing drivers to leave their cars home at least one day a week. It would also require a minimum purchase at gasoline stations.

Those bills could be combined with a standby law to have available in the energy emergency gets worse, Dingell said.

Dingell said some congressmen and staff people are discussing an approach to rationing that would require President Carter only to get congressional approval when a standby plan is proposed. Currently Congress must approve creation of such a plan and then when he wants to put it in effect.

Rep. Toby Moffett, D-Conn., said his constituents are saying, "Let's do something."

He added, "I think it is critical. We have got a president on the political ropes and a country in crisis."

Moffett said Carter's domestic adviser Stuart Eizenstat spoke with Moffett Tuesday and told him Carter does not intend now to draw up a new rationing plan, in view of the earlier congressional rejection.

Dingell told an interviewer, "The home visits led to a recognition of the fact that the public is showing a striking amount of awareness of the problem."

Principal's Union Appeals Demotion

EAST HARTFORD — The school administrators' union has appealed the demotion of former O'Connell School Principal George Scheyd. The appeal is to the superintendents of the school department.

Scheyd, who has been principal at O'Connell for two years, has been transferred to a teaching position in the school system.

The school department also made the following changes: transferred James Fallon, Pitkin School principal, to O'Connell to replace Scheyd; transferred Hockanum School Principal Donal Cohen to Pitkin; appointed former Hockanum vice principal Paula Erickson as principal; and transferred Donald Repoli, O'Connell's vice principal, to become Center School's vice principal.

Also, Pitkin Vice Principal Harvey Lazrusk will be the vice principal at O'Connell.

Union President Toch Girard said this is the first time a principal has been demoted to a teacher's position. School administrators cannot gain tenure.

Sarn Leone, assistant superintendent, said he could not comment on the case because there is a hearing pending on the matter.

Ice Company Court Case First Under Noise Rules

MANCHESTER — The state has received approximately 90 complaints about noise since it developed an ordinance to regulate it. But, the dispute involving the Manchester Ice & Fuel Company is the first to end up in the courtroom.

That's what Joseph Pulaski, director of the noise section of the state Department of Environmental Protection, said.

Such noise-related disputes normally are resolved out of court by having both parties sit and try to work out their differences.

"This is the way we like to do it," Pulaski said.

The state's noise ordinance was drafted last year. It gives firms in existence two years to meet the decibel levels set as maximum limits by the ordinance, he said.

Businesses that have been in existence since 1960 get an additional consideration. They are given an allowance of 10 decibels above the maximums set in ordinance, Pulaski said.

He said this is done because many of these businesses have existed for years and were there long before the other buildings and homes that now surround them.

New businesses must meet the ordinance limits immediately, Pulaski said.

Manchester Ice & Fuel has been sued by nearby residents — Stanley Gaddzicki of 58 Bissell St. and Thomas Szazinski of 82 Foster St. — who feel the firm's ice-making operation is too noisy.

An agreement between the parties was worked out last fall, but since then the residents have filed another suit because they feel the company has not met the requirements of that first agreement.

Manchester Ice & Fuel has been at its Bissell street location for many years, so it meets the 1960 pre-1960 allowance, Pulaski said. Even so, he said readings his department have taken have shown the company's operation is louder than the 71 decibels it would be permitted when measuring from a neighboring property.

The firm has until next year to come into compliance, though.

Thus, his department expects to continue working with the company, the neighbors and the town government to see what can be done to reach the level in the state ordinance.

If the firm does not reach the ordinance's level, "the bottom line is to issue an order," Pulaski said. This would order the firm to comply.

"It's a step we like to avoid, he said, emphasizing the effort to work things out through negotiation.

Testimony Complete In Lawsuit on Noise

MANCHESTER — Testimony in the court case involving a noise complaint against a Bissell Street business was completed Friday.

The lawsuit was filed by neighbors of the Manchester Ice & Fuel Company who feel the firm's ice-making process is too noisy.

One of those residents, Stanley Gaddzicki of 58 Bissell St., completed his testimony Friday. He also had testified at Thursday afternoon session. The trial started Wednesday in Rockville Superior Court.

Two other neighbors — Stanley's wife, Margaret, and Thomas Szazinski of 82 Foster St. — also spoke Friday. They talked about the problems and the inconveniences caused by the noise.

Szazinski, for instance, said he had to relocate his bedroom so he could sleep at night.

Richard Connors, manager and co-owner of the business, also spoke Friday. He talked about some work the firm has done in the past to meet a previous agreement with the neighbors, and he also talked about the expense of some of the noise-reducing steps.

These would be particularly expensive if they had to be done now and the plant had to be shut down during the busiest season.

EB Workers OK Pact

GROTON (UPI) — Metal Trades Council members Friday voted overwhelmingly to ratify a new three-year contract with the Electric Boat Division of General Dynamics despite opposition from three union locals.

The boat yard workers voted 6,590-88 to accept the contract which provides a 35 percent wage increase along with greater benefits.

The agreement favors the skilled workers, drawing criticism from representatives of the clerks, laborers and teamsters who voted against the contract agreement at the bargaining table Saturday.

The three locals are made up of about 1,500 workers of the 11,000 shipyard employees that belong to the Metal Trades Council.

Council President Thomas Kiddy called the contract the "best ever negotiated" and said he was happily surprised with the 8-1 margin.

But Paul Bruno, president of the clerks' union, said only 270 of the 850 workers in his union would be earning the same top wages as the first class mechanics who comprise nearly half EB's workers.

He said his union, which includes clerical, radiation control and X-ray and symmetry technicians, is virtually barred from moving up to better paying jobs in part because of previous union contracts.

Kiddy said skilled trades workers should receive more money "than the guy who hands out the blueprints."

He said the 10 local unions in the council would receive the same benefits at the same time along with the same cost-of-living increases.

Skylab Due Wednesday

WASHINGTON (UPI) — The time when Skylab will fall next week has been narrowed to a 48-hour period centered on 3 p.m. EDT Wednesday, the space agency reported Friday.

Generalized maps showing areas Skylab will be flying over next Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday indicated that the 77-ton spacehop will be passing over large sections of the United States six times each of those days.

On each day, one orbit would roughly go southwestward to northeastward over the populous northeastern seaboard while others would criss-cross over the nation's midsection.

Some would cross the Pacific coast in the northern California area but Los Angeles, for example, would not be under Skylab's predicted flight path during those days.

On the other side of the country, Florida would only be overflown on Thursday, July 12, according to the maps, which, NASA officials stressed, could be in error by a half a degree either way.

The orbits Tuesday through Thursday also cross all other continents between 50 degrees south and 50 degrees north latitude. That excludes, for example, northern Canada, Alaska, the British Isles, most of the Soviet Union including Moscow, and such other major cities as Berlin, Brussels and Warsaw.

Skylab makes 16 orbits of the globe daily.

Richard Smith, deputy associate space agency administrator, emphasized that it was too early to predict where Skylab's debris will fall after it streaks like a fireball through the Earth's atmosphere. He announced the revised prediction at a news conference and said Wednesday, July 11, was "the more probable date" for the orbiting laboratory's fall, give or take a day.

"So sometime between the 10th and 12th Skylab will come to an end after being launched in 1973," he said.

Fire Smokes Out Store

MANCHESTER — A smoke-filled store and a water drenched stockroom were the result of a fire Friday evening at King's Department Store at the Parkade.

The fire, of undetermined origin, was confined to a small section of the stockroom. The blaze set off the sprinkler system in the stockroom, but not in the store.

The Town Fire Department was called to the fire at 8:29 p.m., and the last unit was still at the scene at 10:35, a fire department spokesman said.

A store employee said that at first there were a "whole lot of flames. Too much."

The sprinklers and fire hoses soon took care of flames. A white thin smoke dove customers and clerks out of the store.

Several fire trucks responded to the alarm, including the rescue truck and aerial ladder truck. Engine Co. 4 was relocated to Central Fire Headquarters while headquarters apparatus was at the scene.

Any fishing questions, when an expert's views are needed, are directed to Pinto. He usually has all answers at his fingertips. Subject of trophy fish came up recently and Pinto dug into his file and produced a copy of qualifications in Connecticut for fish considered in the trophy class.

- In order to qualify for an award, the following minimum weights are required:
- Brook trout - 2 pounds
- Bainbow trout - 4 pounds
- Brown trout - 5 pounds
- Lake trout - 15 pounds
- Sockeye salmon - 2 1/2 pounds
- Largemouth bass - 6 pounds
- Smallmouth bass - 4 pounds
- Walleye - 5 pounds
- Yellow perch - 2 pounds
- Chain pickerel - 5 pounds
- Pike - 10 pounds
- Calico bass - 2 pounds
- Bluegill - 1 pound
- Bluntnose loach - 1 pound
- Common sunfish - 12 ounces
- White perch - 2 pounds
- Brown bullhead - 2 pounds
- White catfish - 4 pounds
- American shad - 6 pounds

The fish must be registered with the state within 30 days of a catch and in several instances a clear photograph must accompany each entry. The fish must be weighed on scales inspected and certified by the State Department of Consumer Protection.

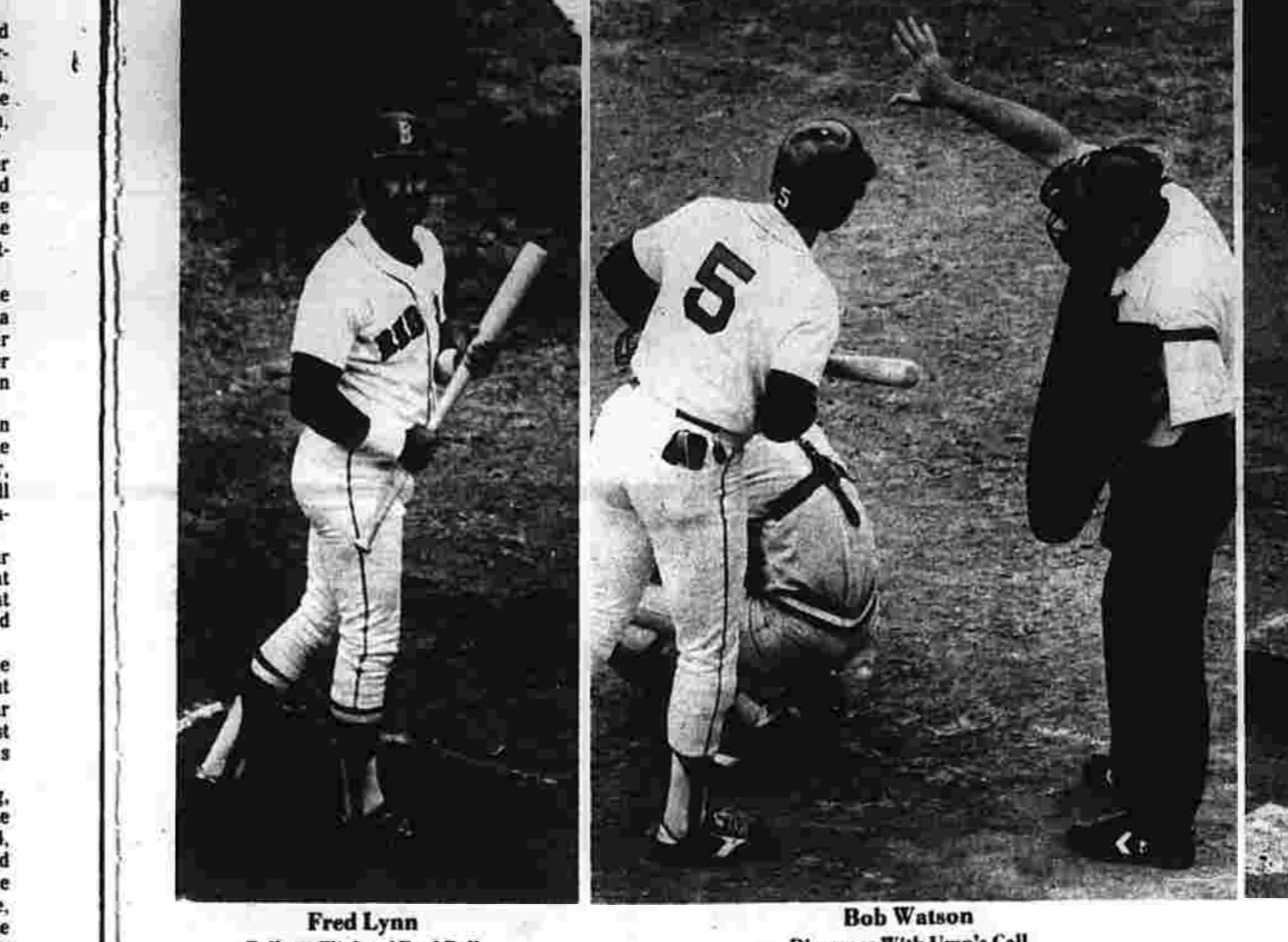

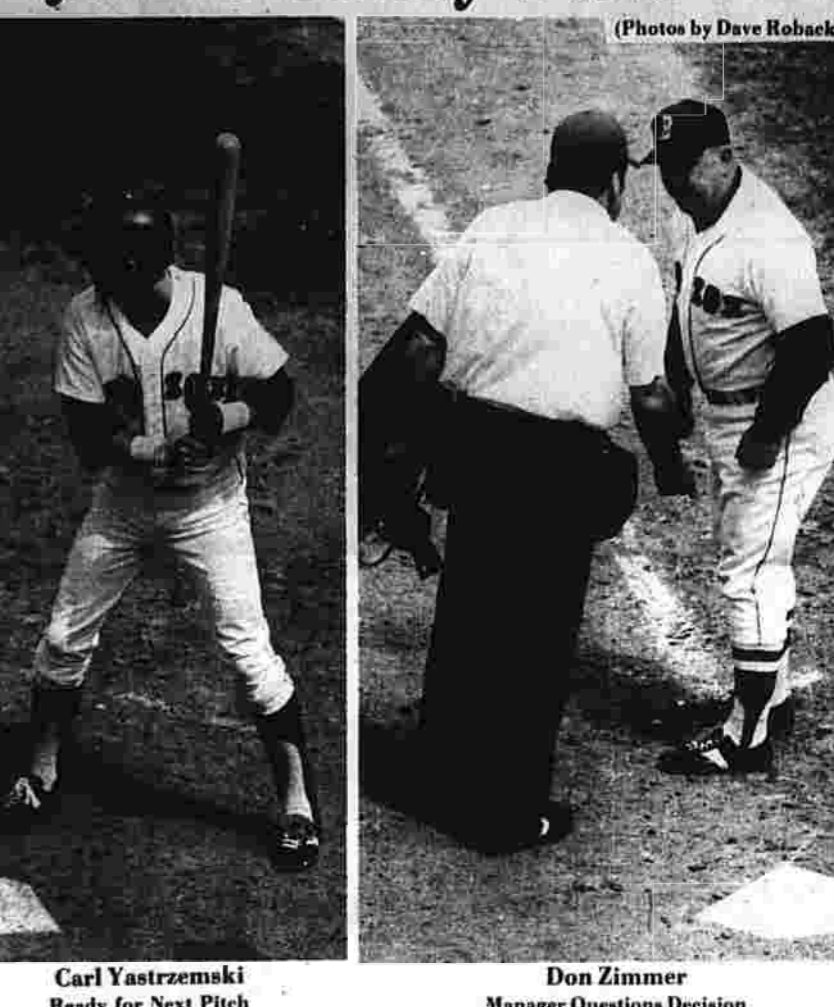

Discourage Gays, Church Suggests

BOSTON (UPI) — Cardinal Humberto Medeiros this week issued a directive to all priests in the Roman Catholic Archdiocese of Boston to discourage Catholics from joining homosexual groups and to urge them, instead, to abstain from sex. The cardinal's 16-page letter instructed priests to dissuade parishioners from joining homosexual support groups because they might be persuaded "to embrace a homosexual culture and even a homosexual way of life." Rev. Paul Shanley, who was reassigned to a suburban parish last January from his work with Boston area homosexuals, called the cardinal's recommendation that homosexuals abstain from sex "pastorally speaking, virtually useless advice."

"After dealing with tens of thousands of homosexuals across the country, I know of only one who is a healthy, happy, celibate lay homosexual," he said. "To counsel them to do something which virtually nobody else has succeeded doing is less than helpful." Although he said homosexuals "must be treated with understanding" Cardinal Medeiros emphasized that no special outreach program would be authorized by the archdiocese to reach gay men and women.

Instead, the cardinal urged priests to lead troubled homosexuals "by leading them to personal prayer, to the prudent practice of penance and self-denial and to the avoidance of the occasion of sin." Frank H. Ring, president of Dignity, a chapter of a national group of homosexual Catholics, responded to the cardinal's letter.

"We welcome your appeal to your priests to extend to us the healing love and mercy of the God Shepherd, Ring wrote. "However, we are saddened that tolerance for those who find their sexual attraction toward members of the same sex."

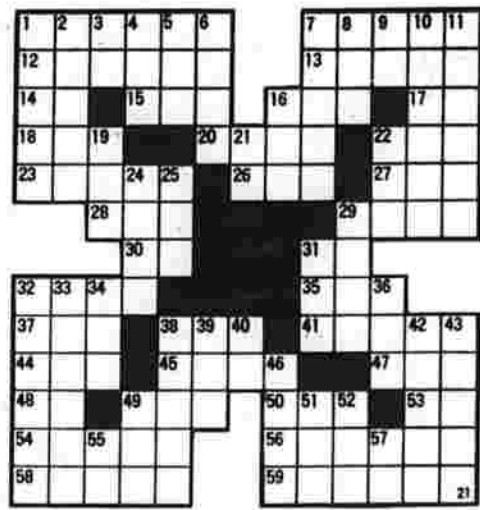
