



Game shows are lun. Says Trebek. The pay is good. The work is relatively easy and it is not usually affected by layoffs.—unless your show is cancelled. Also, it gives you a lot of spare time to devote to other things. I'm hoping to get into production and maybe some acting. Producing appeals to me more, because that's where the big money and power is. Films, television shows, it doesn't matter. If you want control, you become a director or producer.

With this attitude. Alex Trebek intends to pursue his wish to start his own production company and make films in Canada. He feels that the Canadian film industry is on the upswing and he has several story ideas in mind.

What if things take too long to come together? I'm not too worried' he says. It's a question of getting the initial break, like anything else. Once you get that break, you coast along. It develops momentum on its own. If it doesn't happen, something else will be happening. As someone once said. The secret to happiness isn't getting what you want, it's wanting what you get."


