## Pac Rescues Group Stranded on Flight

NEW BRITAIN (UPI) - For a group of state college students who were stranded in Hong Kong without rooms or a return flight, the best travel agent in town was state Central Connecticut State College History Professor Lou Addazio, who organized the trip, said Thursday the 20-member group was stuck in Hong Kong in late July when he chanced to meet Pac and another New Britain area group in a hotel lobby.


