Prime Rate Now 153/4%, A New High

NEW YORK (UPI) - Citibank boosted its prime lending rate on corporate loans by another quarter point to 15 3/4 percent today, a new high that banking analysts said was likely to spread throughout the industry.

The nation's second largest bank noted the formula it uses to set its prime called for a 16 percent rate, but the bank limited its increase to 15 3/4. Banks have come under intensified political criticism as the prevailing prime has rocketed this year from 11 1/2 percent to its highest levels in history.

The increase follows the Federal Reserve report late Thursday that the nation's basic money supply soared \$3 billion in the most recent week, a jump far bigger than expected and one that further confused the outlook for the Fed's monetary policy.

Analysts said the Fed could react by raising its discount rate - the interest it charges on loans to member banks - from its current level of 12 percent to as much as 13 percent. This would be a message that the central bank feels further credittightening is needed in its anti-

William E. Gibson, vice president of Smith Barney, Harris Upham & Co., said the huge increase could be one of "a number of blips. I think the Fed understands that and will not be under intense pressure for further tightening. I would guess we'll see a sizable drop next week."

The situation is complicated further by the Iranian crisis, in which the cutoff of U.S. oil purchases from Iran also could affect the value of the dollar. Reports that Iran had refused to accept further payments in dollars for its oil sales sent the U.S. currency plummeting on foreign exchange markets Friday. However, Iran's oil boss Ali Akbar

Moinfar denied the reports. "So far we have not issued any orders to the effect that we shall not accept the U.S. dollar," Moinfar told UPI in a telephone interview.

For consumers, the prime rate increase eventually will translate into higher interest rates and tougher-toget credit at any price. Higher interest rates also add to inflation and economists have expected the record interest charges to worsen the

Dems To Allow Early Primary

Demoratic leaders today unanimously voted to allow Massachusetts to hold an early presidential primary, a move likely to help Sen. Edward Kennedy's campaign against President Carter.

The voice vote by the Democratic National Committee's Compliance Review Commission averts a potentially bitter fight between state and national Democratic officials.

The action means Massachusetts will be able to hold its primary a week before the 11-week "window period" that party leaders had set aside for the states to select delegates to the Democratic National Convention next summer which will pick the party's presiden-

New Hampshire, Iowa and Minnesota - which like Massachusetts had picked their delegates in 1976 before the window

The early Massachusetts primary is seen by political observers to be a boost for Kennedy's presidential prospects because the Massachusetts Democrat, even Carter backers concede, should easily defeat the president in his home state. The momenturn generated by an early victory is expected to help spur Kennedy's candidacy.

Several commission members said before the vote they were annoyed at the behavior of Massachusetts Party Chairman Chester Atkins, who they said didn't do all he could have to convince the state Legislature - of which he is a member - to push back the primary date. Atkins is a big Kennedy supporter.

LanguageDisdain Said a 'Disgrace'

CONCORD, N.H. (UPI) - The disdain Americans show toward foreign languages is a "national disgrace" that diminishes our prestige abroad and threatens our security at home, a Dartmouth College professor says.

"Unless we right this wrong," said Professor John Rassias, "we face disaster as a nation. There's just no other way to put it."

Rassias, a 52year-old French instructor at Dartmouth, was one of 25 individuals appointed by President Carter a year ago to study the declining role foreign languages play

in American life.

The blue-ribbon panel, aptly entitled the President's Commission on Foreign Languages and International Studies, finished up its work earlier this month and presented its findings

to the White House on Nov. 7. The results, in Rassias' mind, were startling.

"Three out of four Americans can't speak or write a foreign language comfortably," Rassias said. "And only 8 percent of our colleges and universities require languages for ad-

"It's a national disgrace that cuts to the very heart of our national security," he added. "It's hampering

ture overseas. In Russia, Rassias related, diplomats are given a 10 percent raise for every foreign language they learn fluently. And the bonus is good for up to three language

"Over here, we just pat our diplomats on the rump and say 'go, go, go'," he said. "It's inconceivable to me that we send ambassadors overseas who can't speak the

languages.
"We go to an international conference and they can do it in our language but we can't do it in theirs. It puts us at a tremendous linguistic

"It also leaves the impression we're not interested in learning about their culture or their ideas. "I think if we don't change, we will become not only a silent partner in

disadvantage," Rassias continued.

linguistic isolation lies at home, Rassias believes. We found in our report that the crux of the problem was dull, boring,

uninspired, uncommitted teachers, he said "Even when languages are taught, they are taught so poorly that we cut our students off at the pass." A large part of the problem, to Rassias' way of thinking, is that when students are taught foreign

languages they are taught how to talk about things like "their sister's yellow pen" or "a family outing at the bank." "It's garbage. What does that have

to do without anything?" he asked. "Foreigners are portrayed as idiots in unrealistic situations. The student is never taught how

the French mind ticks, or how the Russians feel, or the Chinese think," he said. "Languages should be taught within the frameworks of the

"The two should go hand in hand. There's a one to one correlation between communication and

culture," Rassias added. All of this might lead one to believe that Rassias is a purveyor of doom and gloom, a pessimist who has given up hope. "Au contraire," the rofessor tells us, adding that he firmly believes we can turn ourselves around.

If Rassias had his way, foreign languages would be required in secondary schools and a prerequisite for admission and graduation from



House Favors Tornado Help

HARTFORD (UPI) — A measure granting up to \$520,-000 in tax relief for residents of three towns struck by a killer tornado last month has been sent to the Senate. House members, in their first full day of considering bills during a special session on energy. Thursday passes the measure on a unanimous vote.

They also voted 13-12 in favor of a measure doubling the bond authorization for the Energy Conservation Loan Fund from \$3 million to \$6 million. The tornado measure would allow the towns of Windsor, Windsor Locks, Suffield and East Granby to abate

taxes for damaged property.

Rep. John Pier, D-Windsor, told his colleagues the measure was needed because it would be tough for the people to get a tax bill for "property that isn't there."

The storm, which struck without warning Oct. 3, left three dead, hundreds injured and \$250 million in "We've suffered greatly. My town of Windsor Locks

still has not gotten back on its feet," Rep. Joyce Wojtas, D-Windsor Locks, said. She said it will take months, an maybe years, for the towns to recover from the tornado. The bill provides for the state to reimburse Windsor, Windsor Locks and Suffield for 90 percent of the uncollected taxes, up to a total of \$520,000. The \$3 million increase in the bonding for the energy conservation loan fund was just what Gov. Ella Grasso requested when she called the lawmakers back to the

special session on energy matters. An amendment to increase the authorization to \$10 million was killed. Rep. Irving Stolberg, D-New Haven, said the \$6 million "will clearly do it" until the Legislature returns for the regular session in February. 





But the film is different from other movies of its type, mixing several ingredients that wouldn't ordinarily be compounded with the death theme, such as the rekindling system for Buffy, near the end of her life, or Buffy's request to "die with dignity."

The film is special to the Hartford area because it was filmed here. A majority of scenes were filmed beginning October 1978, at Manchester Memorial Hospital with local hospital personnel acting as extras. Footage was shot in Hartford's Elizabeth Park, and along the streets of Hartford. The first scene draws a great deal of audience response as Dr. Kendell approaches Hartford off 1-34 while listening to WPOP news.
