





pocket stone while skiing. The sort of stone used for sharpening knives (which can be purchased from a hardware store) will do nicely. Or you can y one at a ski shop. Use the stone like a file and rub it gently up and your edges. Besides removing burrs. the pocket stone can be used to help keep a good 90-degree angle on your ski edges for better control or
