Americans are paying more in state and local taxes than a year ago, buying fewer homes and - to make matters worse - are being told they must let prices rise faster than their wages to curb inflation.

In Washington, the Bureau of the Census reported Tuesday Americans paid a total of \$211.2 billion in state and local taxes during 1979 for a 6.5 percent increase over the previous

taxes paid on property, general sales and gross receipts, motor fuel, tobacco, alcoholic beverages, individual income, and corporation net income and motor vehicle and operators

Charles Schultze, chairman of the president's Council of Economic Advisers, told the National Press Club, when people obtain wage increases to pay for higher energy prices they simply cause more inflation for "It necessarily means." said





Bus shelter decision delayed

By MARTIN KEARNS Herald Reporter

HARTFORD - The Transportation Committee of the Capitol Region Council of Governments put aside for another month a vote on the construction of bus shelters

throughout the region.

The committee considered a proposal that would place specially designed shelters for elderly and handicapped persons along major ous routes in the region. The committee tabled the issue until its next meeting to allow staff to assemble more specific cost breakdowns. One shelter is planned for Manchester at the intersection of Woodbridge and Main streets. The projected cost is \$10,000. Another shelter would be constructed in East Hartford at the intersection of Connecticut Boulevard and Main Street at a cost of \$15,000.

Committee members asked for more detailed information, noting that the average cost for a standard bus shelter is between \$7,-

000 and \$8,000.

John Duncan, CRCOG transportation planner, said the shelters would be enclosed, circular-shaped structures for about 15 people. The increased costs, he said, were necessary to make the shelters accessible to handicapped persons, especially those in heelchairs. In many cases the roadsides at the bus stops would be reconstructed to allow buses to pull out of the traffic flow and pick-up

handicapped and elderly persons. Funding for the proposed construction would be made possible by interstate trade-in monies. The regional planning agency has already set aside \$200 million for completion of transportation plans approved through its Trans Plan study These and other monies, including a \$50

million appropriation for completion of a highway connector through Hartford's Bushnell Park, have resulted from local decisions not to build certain highway private nursing homes.

Directors mull powers sewer

MANCHESTER-Although there is a consensus among the directors not to give the town the power of eminent domain for sewer easements, the board is still considering permit changes, Mayor Stephen Penny said last

Responding to a question about the developer's permit eminent power change at a board meeting, Penny said the changes presently being considered "were not of concern to the general public." The eminent power provision, proposed by Jay Giles, was opposed by many persons who attended the public

# Banana Split Pie

1 package (4-serving size) chocolate flavor instant pudding and pie filling

2 cups cold milk 1 container (4 oz.) frozen whipped topping, thawed 1 baked 9-inch pie shell, cooled

1 banana, sliced 1 package (4-serving size) vanilla flavor instant pudding and pie filling

2 squares semi-sweet chocolate, melted

Prepare chocolate flavor pie filling mix with 1 cup of the milk as directed on package. Fold in 1 cup of the whipped topping. Pour into pie shell and top with banana slices. Just before serving, drizzle with melted chocolate. Garnish with additional whipped topping and cherries with stems, if desired.

2 cups (1 pt.) sour cream

1 baked 9-inch pie shell, cooled 1 cup thawed frozen whipped topping 1 cup graham cracker crumbs 1/2 cup toasted almonds, chopped

Pour into pie shell. Spread whipped topping over filling; then sprinkle with crumbs and almonds. Prepare chocolate flavor pie filling mix with remaining sour cream and milk. Spoon over crumb layer. Chill at least 4 hours. Garnish with whipped topping and multi-colored sprinkles, if desired.
