California Ex-Cons Can Vote After Parole

DEAR ABBY: Someone wrote in asking if a friend who had served time in prison was eligible to vote. You said, "Unless your friend receives a full pardon from the governor of his state, he is ineligible to vote. (And for a federal offense, one needs a pardon from the president of the United States I'

Abby, in California, anyone released from prison is considered as having paid social to vote again is a citizen with the right to vote.

B.D.K. OF CALIFORNIA

DEAR B.D.K.: I referred your letter to my friend Justice Stanley Mosk, who serves as a judge on the Supreme Court of California. His reply: to parole conditions. One in prison, or one on parole, may not vote in California. (Article II, sec. 4 of the California Constitution provides, in relevant part for the disqualification of electors while mentally incompetent or imprisoned or on parole for the conviction of a felony.)
"Thus, for example, a person who had been given a

life sentence and released on parole for life would never be able to vote unless pardoned by the governor. However, one who completes his parole may vote in California. "California is somewhat unique in this respect, and more tolerant of ex-felons than most states. Your




