





WASHINGTON (UPI) - Noting that the risk of cervical cancer increases with the number of sexual partners, a government advisory committee recommended Friday that all non-virginal women receive Pap smear tests every one to three years. The National Institutes of Health panel said the simple screening procedure should be started soon after a

Dr. Maureen Henderson, of the University of Washington and the head of the committee, said if the

women died of the disease in 1979. The Pap smear, developed by Dr. George Papanicolaou 52 years ago, detects abnormal cells in the cervix. It allows doctors to find the earliest stages of cervical cancer at a time when the disease is considered almost 100 percent curable, often with only treatment in the doc- trophies to the top doubles players in the antor's office.

The cause of cancer of the cervix is not known but Dr. Henderson said numerous studies have linked it somehow to sexual intercourse. She said scientists think some type of infectious agent may have a role and, "the greater the 40-year-old exposure the greater the likelihood" of developing the disease. She said the disease is virtually never found in virgins.
