EAST HARTFORD -- East Hartford has been the most active of the four towns adjacent to the Hockanum River in purchasing land that may become part of the Hockanum River Linear Park, Brian Kerr of the state Department of Environmental Protection said today. Kerr, who is a DEP recreation

resource specialist, said the towns of Vernon, Ellington. Manchester and East Hartford having been working recently with the DEP in the study and development of the linear park The DEP has hired Roy Mann Associates to be consultants in the early study of the park which could include, for example, hiking and bicycle trails from Vernon to Hart-

The development of the park will be the subject of a third public hearing Aug. 11 at 6:45 p.m. in the Manchester Municipal Building Hearing Room, 41 Center St. Kerr said Manchester would become the new meeting place for the towns involved in the park because it's centrally located in the study area and should offer a greater convenience for persons from the four Hockanum ver communities.

Kerr said the public hearing would deal with identification of sites for potential park development attended by park planners and state agency representatives who would be available for informal discussion. The park itself will include more than just the land close to the river. Kerr said. He said the 25-mile-long

park would include adjacent wetlands, steep slopes and sufficient land for a continuous corridor to provide space for recreation and nonnotorized transportation Kerr said some of the towns have
