

Aide at ROTC sues Fendell

Herald Reporter MANCHESTER- On the eve of his departure for Israel, Norman Fendell, resigning director of the Regional Occupational Training Center, has been served papers in a civil suit alleging he defamed the reputation of one of the school system's employees.

Christopher Dougan, a woodworking aide at the center for the handicapped, has made the charge. While Dougan had no comment on the incident Friday night, one of his co-attorneys confirmed the papers were served on Fendell Friday morning. Attorney Robert Brill, who is representing Dougan,

said, "Fendell has been served with a defamation suit. We are requesting compensatory and punitive damages." Besides suing Fendell, the suit also names the

the suit alleges negligence on the board's behalf.
"We've alleged they were negligent in hiring and
placing Fendell in a position of authority where he could jure my client," Brill said. Those injuries, Brill said, stem from charges Fendell made against Dougan Brill said the most resented

charge Fendell made was that while Dougan was a woodworking aide at the ROTC he appropriated school property for his own use. 'It's a nice way of saying they're accusing him of stealing," Brill said. Brill said the other charges by Fendell that motivated the complaint are: that Dougan
