





Pyramid house rises in a wooded retreat

CRAWFORDVILLE, Fla. (UPI) make a real estate agent smile - six spacious rooms overlooking a private lagoon, sundeck, hot tub, greenhouse, library, waterfall.

But the style might produce some pause. The structure is neither colonial nor antebellum, Florida modern nor Cape Cod, but rather something that might be described as neo-Mayan. Ted Tollett lives in a pyramid.

While others are throwing their money into iffy pyramid investment schemes, the 34-year-old state worker and his partner, R. Mark Greenfield, have invested \$60,000 in the real thing. Their pyramid sits deep in the utside Tallahassee and more than a

mile from the nearest paved road. Although snakes, deer and other wildlife abound, these are no ordinary woods. The pyramid serves as a cairn-like monument in an intellectual sanctuary Down the path from the pyramid is another home, two goats gazing in

front of it. The community's trash collector holds a Ph.D. Within a few hundred yards live a handful of nuclear physicists whose particle research at Tallahassee's two universities is considered among the most significant research in the world.





First the bad news: In 1979, 8,893 Americans died, and nearly 34,000 civilians, plus 100,000 firemen, were seriously injured in 2,845,500 fires. And now for the "good news": We've improved. In 1978, 10,500 Americans periahed in over 3,500,000 fires.

> 1. Smoking
> 2. Electrical wiring
> 3. Heating and cooking equipment
> 4. Children playing with matches
> 5. Open flames and sparks
> 6. Flammable liquids
> 7. Suspected araon
> 8. Chimney and flues Lightning Spontaneous ignition

total fire loss last year totaled \$5,750,000,000 Now for some tips that could save your life: Be sure your cigarette is out. Matches, too. Never eave matches and lighters within the reach of Don't run cords under rugs or over radiators where

they may get damaged. Replace a cord if it is frayed. Never leave small children or invalids alone in the ouse. Not even for a few minutes. Have your wiring and electrical installations do tore oily rags and paints in a cool place in tightly

Never amoke in bed. Have a fire drill in your home to be sure everyo

knows what to do in case of fire. Designate a specific meeting place outside so you will all know who's utside of the house.

Remember: Fire extinguishers put out 97 percent of

all fires on which they were used, and most large fires start as small fires. So, invest in a compact, easy-to-use fire extinguisher. Keep it handy in your kitchen, or be prudent and buy one for your cottage, car, boat and the back bedroom. Some excellent amoke-, heat- and fire-detection systems are available to homeowners. Shop around nd buy the one that suits your needs. Now, in case of fire: If you suspect fire, slert the rest of the hous

neighbor's house. If you live in an apartment building, use the stairway. Don't take a chance on the elevator. If it fails, you're trapped.
