MANCHESTER- The Manchester Housing authority has placed a deposit on the first of 10 luplexes it plans to purchase as part of a \$1.2 million

eral housing program. A \$500 downpayment was placed on a home located af 122-124 Maple St. which the MHA expects to evenually purchase for about \$70,000, according to the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development had earlier agreed to fund the program but it was not until Wednesday night that the MHA formally accepted the contract.

The Housing Authority last night voted unanimously o sign a contract with HUD to provide subsidized ising for low-income families. Phelan said he expects to immediately receive the first \$600,000 and the remainder in about six months.

Under the terms of the contract - which has been sought for about two years - the MHA will purchase d renovate older homes and lease them to lowscome families. Phelan said it has not yet been decided if persons renting the rehabilitated units must e Manchester residents.

The MHA earlier this year rejected Section VIII subsidies because in doing so the authority would have been forced to accept residents from outside the town. The issue of federally subsidized low-income housing also sparked the emotional referendum in April 1979 which led the town out of the federal Community velopment Act program.

In this separate program, the MHA expects to make subsidized housing available to 20 low-income families. According to federal requirements tenants will pay no more than 25 percent of their income balance of its operating costs.

toward rent, with HUD paying the authority the The MHA expects to purchase the houses one at a time. Once a home has been renovated and its tenants settled, another house will be purchased, according to Phelan who described the process as leapfroging.

The actual purchase price of the Maple Street duplex will not be known until after state appraisers have inspected the property, Phelan said. The \$500 deposit was designed to protect the duplex for 60 days, but HUD is prepared to extend the period for another 30 days if it is unable to obtain an appraiser by then, Phelan said.

The MHA expects to complete the \$1.2 million program in about a year, Phelan said.

In other business, the authority re-elected Pascal Mastrangelo to chair the panel for another year. Mastrangelo has served as chairman since 1973. Walter Sinon, who has been vice chairman for one vera, was also elected to another term.

The fireproofing method of spraying asbestos onto office buildings which was stopped eight years ago and tons of the loosely bonded material may pose a future health problem, Dr. William Nicholson said Wednesday.

Nicholson, an associate professor of community medicine at the Mt. Sinai School of Medicine in New York, said 25 tons of the material had been used on

"A major source of asbestos problems in the future will come from the procedure of fireproofing buildings in the United States from 1958 to 1972," Nicholson told a egislative task force studying the health hazards of

He said the spraying of office buildings could show up in the future health records of businessmen who were constantly exposed to the fireproofing work.

Nicholson said the tons of loosely bonded asbestos could also become a problem when buildings become old and are torn down or when maintenance work sends the

"It's a major problem that has not yet been addressed by the EPA or any other agency," he said. "The disposal of asbestos that is already in place is going to be an ongoing problems," he said.

HARTFORD (UPI) - A young man charged with stabbing to death a doctor in his busy Hartford office has been eclared competent to stand trial for murder. Superior Court Judge John J. Daly said Thursday psy chiatric tests indicate Arturo Bell, 24, of Hartford, was mentally competent and able to assist in his defense. Bell has pleaded innocent and asked for a trial by jury in the July 3 fatal stabbing of Dr. Isaiah Clark.

Bell, who had gone to Clark for a checkup, was arrested at the scene of the crime and police confiscated a knife believed to be the murder weapon. Police said they have not been able to determine motive for the crime. The suspect faces life imprison ment if convicted. He is being held in lieu of \$100,000 at the Hartford jail.



RICHMOND, Va. (UPI) - Statewide polls, finances and domination of news reports point to victory in Virginia for Ronald Reagan on Nov. 4. But no one is writing off President Carter's chances to win the only Southern state he lost in 1976.

There are several key reasons for this: Carter's, and the Democrats' slim losses in other elections; an unpredictable bloc of ticket-splitters in a district crucial to either Reagan or Carter; and Carter's showing in Virginia polls - behind Reagan, but stronger than most experienced politicians expected.

Virginia Democrats have not elected a single nominee many of those Democratic losses were extremely close month. Carter lost Virginia in 1976 by about 1.3 percent, about 23,000 votes.

"Virginia is a two-party competitive state, leaning Republican," said Dr. Larry Sabato, a University of Virginia professor of government and foreign affairs and "It's not a Utah where Carter's bringing home the

With proper management, hazardous waste dumps could be built close to populous areas and operated safely." Gidley told 200 participants at the Northeas Conference on Hazardous Waste Thursday. 'I believe we could put a hazardous waste site at the JFK Federal Building (in downtown Boston) safely," he

Gidley, of Fairhaven, Mass., said careless individuals can be as responsible as industry for serious hazardous waste problems. One town's serious problems, he said, had been caused not by some large plant but by residents who did not properly dispose of dangerous materials. In his example, he said engineers tracked down a serious water pollution problem in Exeter, N.H., as being caused by chemicals at the town dump. The site was only one-half mile from the municipality's main water supply, the Exeter River, and on an incline 60 feet above water

After the site was modified residents were able to resume using the river to provide the bulk of the city water supply. There are no known permanent medical problems due to the situation, Gibley said. In April 1978, people in the community of 11,000 noticed sickness in their families and the taste and the odor of the water was obvious." Gidley said.

Analysis showed the water contained unacceptable levels of arsenic selenium lead and organic chemicals called phenols. The highest concentrations were found in water and soil samples taken from the area between the dump and the river

Members of 16 families with their own wells became nauseous after drinking tainted water, and developed skin rashes when they bathed in it. 'The people closest to the landfill were affected first,"

Vermont passes on new railroad

MONTPELIER, Vt. (UPI) - The state of Vermont has decided to buy another railroad. The legislative Emergency Board Thursday authorized he Transportation Agency to spend an additional \$90,000 to buy the 14-mile Montpelier and Barre Railroad. The 1980 Legislature earmarked \$650,000 for the purchase, but owner Marjorie Silver of Boston began

The state had threatened to go through condemnation proceedings to take over the railroad, but recent segotiations resulted in an agreed-upon price of \$740,000, which apparently will make that unnecessary. A court hearing is scheduled next week that should, barring a last-minute, unexpected hitch, clear the way for the sale which could come early next month,

Fransportation Secretary Ronald Crisman said. The state then will lease the line to a group of central Vermont shippers who use it. The only objection at the Energency Board meeting came from Sen. Richard Soule, D-Franklin County.

He protested that the Legislature agreed to buy the line largely because they believed it was essential to whether Bombardier Ltd., a Canadian manufacturing firm, would locate in Barre.

But the company now is considering other cities including St. Albans, which Soule represents. "We were totally sold that the purchase of this railroad was necessary to attract a new industry." said Soule,

who is not a member of the board. Gov. Richard Snelling assured Soule the state "worked hard not to steer or prejudice this industry to one area or

The state moved to buy the railroad, considered vital to the region's economy, especially the granite industry, after the owners said they wanted to abandon it because they were losing money.

They filed a petition with the Interstate Commerce Commission seeking permission to abandon, but action on that petition was delayed when the state expressed a interest in the purchase.

Toxic dumpers face charges

PROVIDENCE, R.I. (UPI) - Criminal charges have been filed for the first time against alleged hazardous waste dumpers, and Attorney General Dennis Roberts says the state will not settle for recovering cleanup costs. A Providence County grand jury has accused three men of violating the state's hazardous waste management law by allegedly transporting and storing hazardous chemicals and contaminated wastes.

Wiley Taylor, 43, of Providence, William Davis, 44, of Smithfield, and Albert Kishfy of Providence, no age given, are the first to be prosecuted under the 1978 law. They could each be fined \$25,000 and sentenced to

fiveyear prison terms if convicted. "We will continue to approach all hazardous waste

violations as both criminal and civil matters, and violators will be put on notice the consequences are much more severe than trying to avoid paying cleanup costs," Roberts said Thursday.

Kishfy was charged with moving hazardous materials from Waverly Street in Providence to an unknown location sometime betwee June 1 and July 30.


